

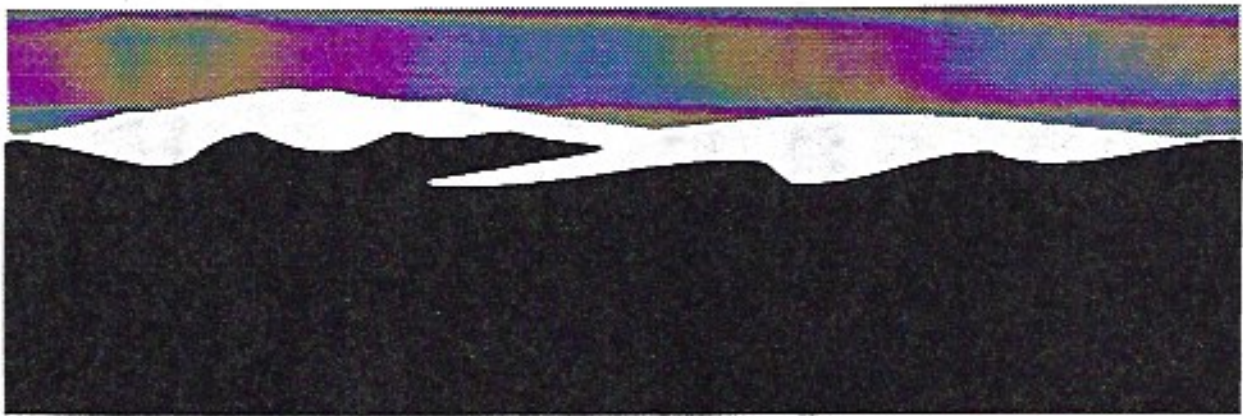
THIS IS YOUR TOURIST GUIDE

-Welcome to Aurora, Colorado! The Gateway to the Rockies. Our suggested itinerary for Saturday is to pick out a few things that may be of personal interest to you and go and see them. If you haven't been to the mountains before I would like to suggest these trips.

A trip to the summit of Mt. Evans will allow you the thrill of travelling to the top of the world. The world's highest highway will take you to the summit of Mt. Evans over 14,000 feet above sea level. Take I-70 west to Idaho Springs and watch for the exit for Mt. Evans

Another interesting trip is the Trail Ridge Road through scenic Rocky Mountain National Park. Trail Ridge Road is the highest continuous road in the United States at the 12,000 foot level. Take I-70 to I-270 to US 36 through Boulder follow US 36 to Rocky Mountain National Park. There is a fee to enter the Park.

Another mountain that is accessible by car is Pike's Peak. The highest accessible summit is 14,110 feet. To get to Pike's Peak take I-225 to I-25 south to Colorado Springs. Take the US 24 West exit and follow it to the Cascade exit. This will lead you to the beginning of the Pike's Peak Highway.

Brochures of various activities are located in the front entry to the hotel. The convention has been structured with large blocks of "Tour Time" notably all day Saturday and Sunday afternoon. This will afford everyone the time to see as much of Colorado as practical during you stay.

The restaurants listed are all moderately priced, but not in the category of fast food.

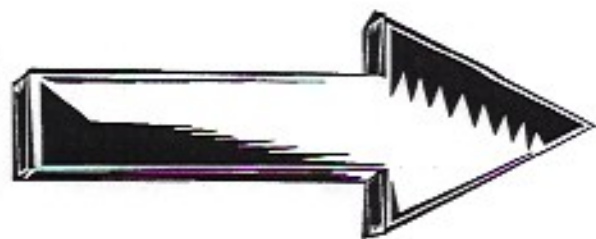

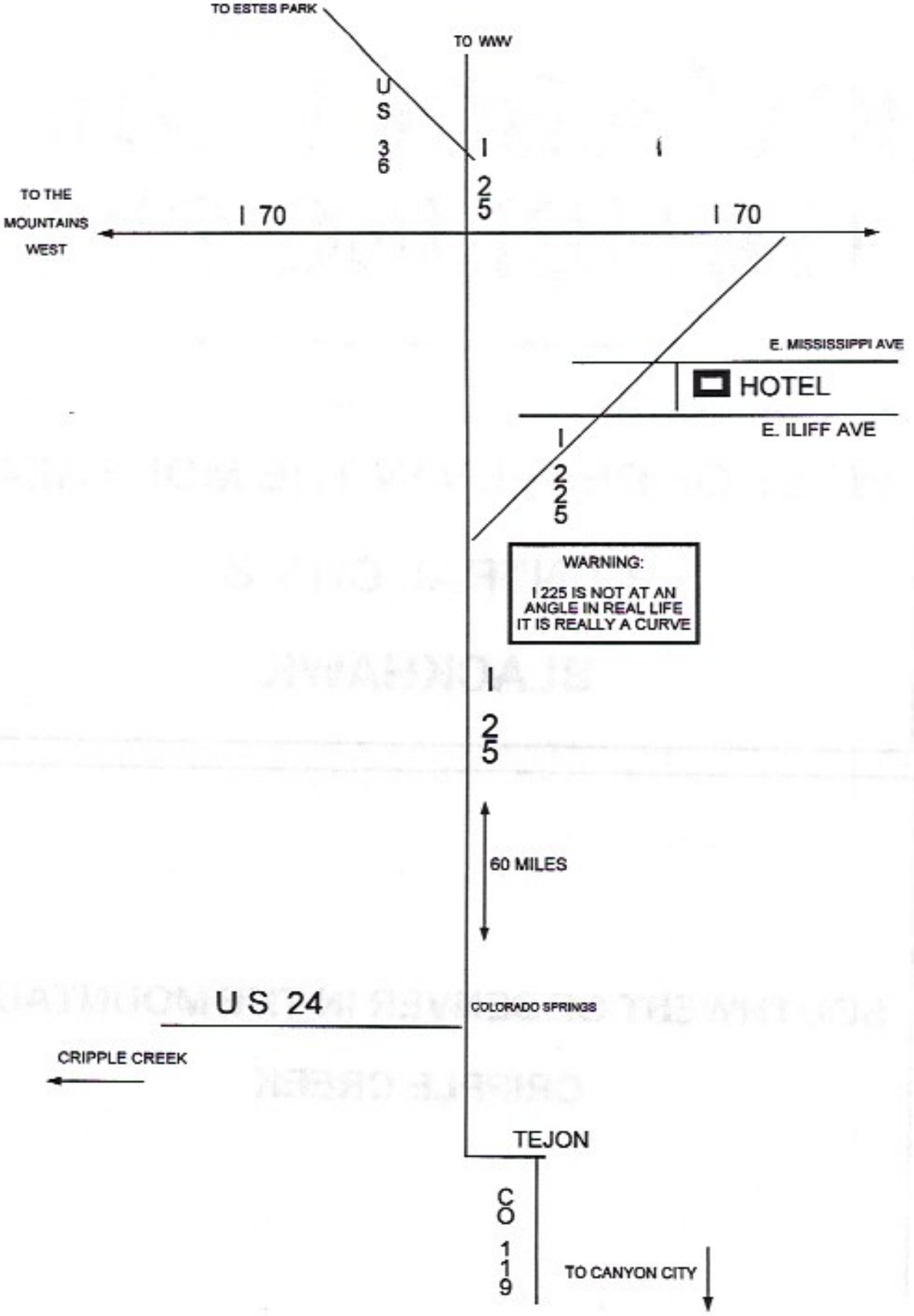

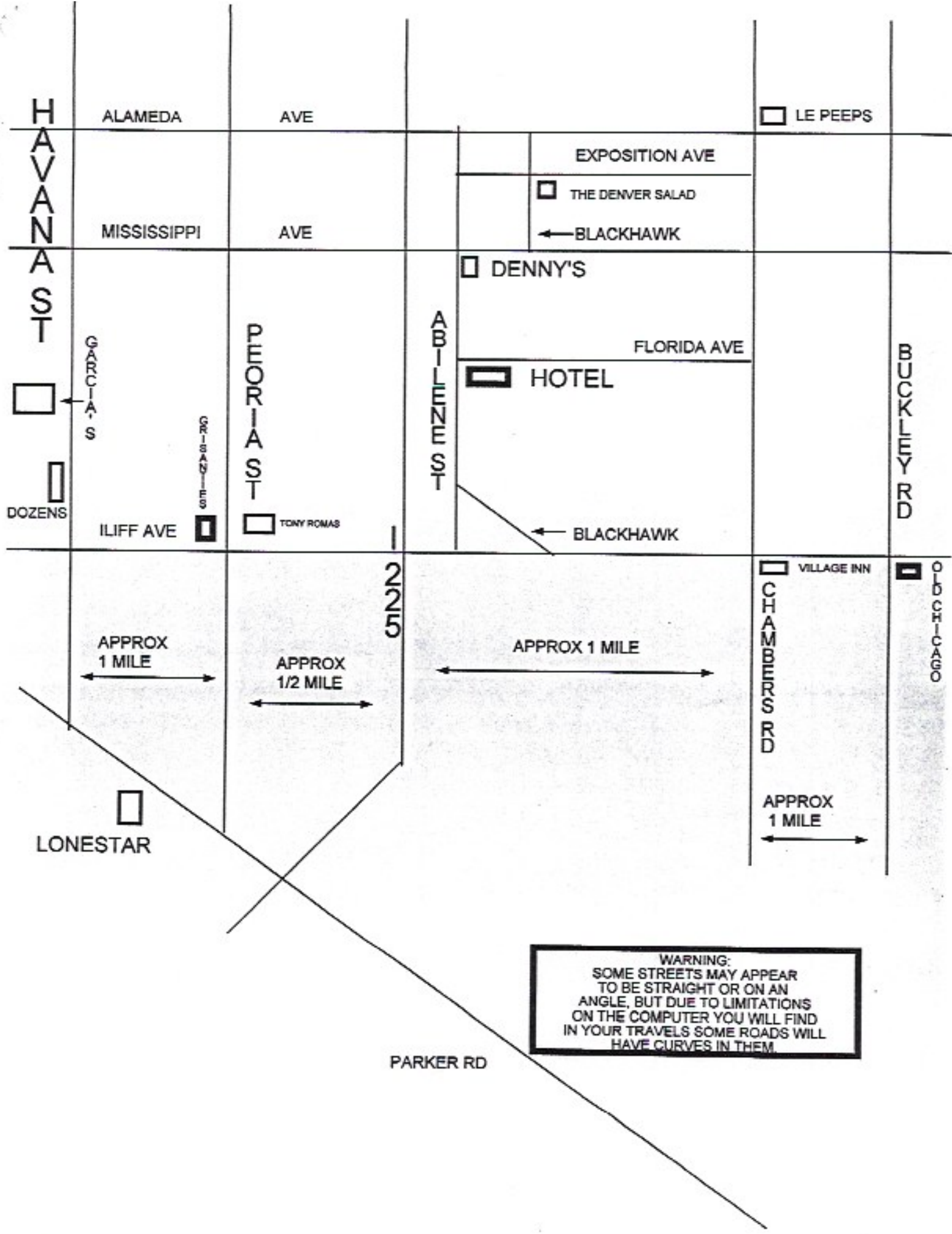
