

Welcome to a city and region rich in history, tradition, growth, contributions, and changes into the 21st century. A continuing renaissance starting with a new David L. Lawrence Convention Center under construction downtown, the Pirates' "jewel of the North Shore" PNC Park, the UPMC(University of Pittsburgh Medical Center) Sports Medicine Complex on the South Side, and our latest addition, the 65,000 gold seated stadium, "Heinz Field", home to the Steelers, Pittsburgh Panthers, and concerts! Plus, in January 2002, the Petersen Events Center opens on the University of Pittsburgh campus.

Since the NRC's last visit in 1990, several structures have been replaced while others were added. Most notably those replaced were three beginning with the Greater Pitt Airport in October 1992, the closing and removal of Pitt Stadium in November 1999, and the implosion of Three Rivers Stadium on February 11, 2001! Those added include the Pittsburgh International Airport and three new tourist attractions. They are the John Heinz Regional History Center in the Strip District and two on the North Side, the Andy Warhol Museum and the Carnegie Science Center with the USS Requin submarine docked alongside! Continuing the learning and wonder in our area is the Carnegie Museum of Art & History and the Phipps Conservatory in Oakland, the Pittsburgh Zoo & Aquarium in Highland Park, and Pittsburgh, still a most livable city!

Webster's defines "odyssey" as any long series of wanderings or voyages marked by many changes of fortune or notable experiences. Thus our "radio odyssey" in Pittsburgh begins with "the pioneer broadcast station of the world" KDKA who celebrated 80 years of service on November 2, 2000! Soon three more local stations will celebrate 80 years; KQV and WJAS in the fall of 2001 and WEAE, first as WCAE, in May 2002! Named for the British minister William Pitt in 1758 as Pittsborough, Pittsburgh became incorporated as a city in 1816. Now, 16 area AM and 19 FM stations identify with the city's name. 

That KDKA has a small studio on the third level called the Adecco Deck in left field under the scoreboard at PNC Park which is used to broadcast pre and post game shows before every Pirate home game!

That there are longwires inside both the Ft. Pitt and Squirrel Hill Tunnels for which you can continue to hear AM/FM local signals, though as of this writing, the wire is down inside the Ft. Pitt Tunnel. Also, the Liberty Tubes(route 19) has a longwire that picks up AM signals only!

KDKA's new owner is Infinity which also owns B94, Star 100.7, and Y108, but "you can be sure it's Westinghouse" was KD's longtime parent company. Of those 4 stations, KDKA still remains downtown having moved to One Gateway Center in May, 1956! That's before JRM was born!

WAMO had to change its city of license to Millvale since they wanted to go nighttime. They added 2 more towers in addition to the 2 already at the longtime transmitter site. Their power is now 1000 day/850 night with a "checkmark" array.

WKHB 620 now is licensed to Irwin which is closer to Pittsburgh as they built a single 400 foot tower off route 30. They are 5500 day/50 night non-directional, not bad! However, I can still hear in the null WRJZ or WTMJ! Their sister station, the former WBCW, now WKTW has been granted a move to 770 kilohertz 250 D1!

Speaking of tower shifts, WJAS will have to move their 2 tower array on city land on the outbound side of the Squirrel Hill Tunnels(I-376) because the city wants to develop the property. Best move is near the Allegheny River Blvd. near the city's Shuman Center. This is northeast of downtown as told to me by CE Phil Lenz. Phil also did the tests of 1320 and 1360 last year for us!

WPGR-1510 is the old WRUA and WXVX where NRCer and roommate Chris Cuomo, aka Chad Stevens....

volunteered his talents in 1994 and sounded like a pro! Hey, somebody hire this guy, he's good! Anyway, WPGR is now 5000 D3 with 2 new towers in Penn Hills, about 12 miles east of downtown.

That 1550 here locally is now WURP, "Urban Radio for Pittsburgh" with the Tom Joyner Show in the morning, good luck WURP! That's the old WCXJ, WLOA, WFFM, etc. Their studios are now in Forest Hills at 21 Yost Blvd. Forest Hills is also the borough that the National Museum of Broadcasting hopes to have the KDKA Museum one day, now wouldn't that be great!!

Speaking of the NMB and their relationship with the Pittsburgh Antique Radio Society(PARS), you won't find 5 nicer people than President Bonnie Novak of PARS, NMB Chairman Rick Harris, NMB Board Members Alice Sapienza Donnelly and Lee Schafer, plus PARS Treasurer Seth Ward, and anyone I didn't think of!

That by the way, the 30 year voice of Pittsburgh Panther football and basketball Bill Hillgrove and Steeler announcer also, is a NMB Board Member, also!

That the 2001 Pittsburgh Convention is the same exact dates as the 1990 Convention, August 31-September 3! Hey, I just planned it that way!


Speaking of sports announcers, we've got some of the best! They are Lanny Frattare has been with the Pirates for 26 years, colorman and a "yoi!" to Myron "mirin" Cope for being with the Steeler games 31 years, first with WTAE and now WDVE. Then there's Mike Lange "why I'll be cowkicked" and "look ou Loretta" has been broadcasting Penguin games over various stations for over 23 years! And then there was Bob Prince "we had 'em all the way!" and "you can kiss it goodbye!" on KDKA. By the way, KD has held the Pirate games since 1955 taking them over from WWSW.

It was somewhat sad, but in a blink of an eye, WWSW quickly changed AM 970 calls a year ago during NRC Lima 2000 to go with "The Burg" WBGG and Fox Sports to compete with ESPN 1250 WEAE. 970 had the WWSW calls since 1932 when before this they were WMBJ-1500, but that history is a little hazy.

You can still meet a Pittsburgh KDKA broadcast legend, Slim Bryant, who's only 92, or in his words, "a lumber yard(84 Lumber) plus 8!" Slim has lived in Pittsburgh for 60 years as of August 10. He played and wrote country music "Slim Bryant & The Wildcats" touring all over the country in the 1930s and 40s on WSB, WGN, before settling here only by accident. Seems the band was passing through on their way to a gig, but because this was World War II, gasoline was being rationed. So they were stuck because, "It Ain't A Gas, Gas, Gas", no gas! So, they stayed, got a chance to play on KDKA in their Grant Building studios downtown from 1941-1959! Slim still teaches guitar in the basement of a book store he used to own in Dormont, just a stone throw away from the city! And he still drives day and night! Hey, Slim how 'bout a song?!

Well okay back to KDKA, seems they did not have a first, but that went to KQV, who's about to celebrate 80 years this fall, who had the first studio in the city of Pittsburgh. KDKA was still out in Wilkinsburg, but who got the marker?! Well, congrats to both of you, KDKA and 80 years on November 2, 2000!

That nice people who work(ed) there is longtime personality John Cigna and Jack Bogut who' now at WJAS playing the "original hits" just like you fellows are! Okay, that's enough, let's go hear some tunes 'n stuff!

Radio pioneer Frank Conrad's former home workshop will soon be in the national spotlight. The National Geographic Channel will be in town this week to film a feature on the birth of radio.

They'll be shooting at significant Pittsburgh-area sites of the early broadcasting industry, including Conrad's former home in Wilkinsburg and the now-demolished garage where he conducted his experiments and early broadcasts. The garage has been salvaged by the National Museum of Broadcasting/Conrad Project, which wants to make it the centerpiece of a broadcasting history museum. The documentary producers will also interview Alice Sapienza-Donnelly, who has spearheaded the drive to save Conrad's garage.

The program is scheduled to air on the daily "National Geographic Today" on Nov. 2 — which is the anniversary of KDKA's first historymaking broadcast.


