Nearby restaurants and services: The Bob Evans restaurant is adjacent to the hotel (345-1843). Main Street in Batavia (NY 5, just a few minutes south of the hotel) has an Arby's (343-2075), a McDonald's (343-3503), a Tim Horton's (open 24 hours), a Wendy's (343-5858), a Pizza Hut (343-9039), a Subway (344-4475) and a Taco Bell (343-4377).

For sit-down eating, there's Tully's Family Restaurant (522 E. Main, 343-9030), TF Brown's (214 E. Main, 343-1547), Ponderosa (12 Ellicott Ave., 343-3550), Denny's (open 24 hours, 364 W. Main St.), Italian food and pizza at Pontillo's (500 E. Main St., 343-3303), great steaks and Italian at Alex's Place, (8322 Park Rd., 344-2999) or the amazing roast beef at the Red Osier Landmark Restaurant (head east on NY 5 to Stafford, 343-6972).

The Tops supermarket on West Main Street is open 24 hours.

About Batavia and Genesee County: As development moved west into the frontier country around the turn of the 19th century, Batavia was the hub of the land rush.

In 1802, Joseph Ellicott established the Holland Land Office in present-day Batavia. The same year, Batavia was established as the county seat of newly formed Genesee County, which then encompassed most of western New York.

The construction of the Erie Canal north of Batavia in the 1820s shifted the region's growth to Rochester (an important canal port and milltown located where the canal crossed the Genesee River) and Buffalo (where the canal emptied into Lake Erie.)

With the coming of railroads to the area in the 1830s (and, much later, the New York Thruway in the 1950s), Batavia again became a transportation hub for western New York.

Batavia was incorporated as a city in 1915, and today is home to more than 16,000 people.

Area Attractions: For sheer scenic beauty, few spots in the world match *Niagara Falls*, just 40 minutes from Batavia via the Thruway, I-290 and I-190. The best viewing of the falls is from the Canadian side; both sides now offer casino gambling as well.

Less well known, but just as beautiful, is Letchworth State Park, just 30 minutes from Batavia via NY 63. Formed by millennia of erosion from the Genesee River, Letchworth boasts spectacular deep gorges and waterfalls. For summer fun, it's hard to beat Six Flags Darien Lake, just 20 minutes from Batavia off Thruway exit 48A and NY 77, or MarineLand in Niagara Falls, Ontario, whose jingles have been seared into the consciousness of TV viewers in the region for years. ("Now you know what to do/when a whale touches you/Friendship Cove/MarineLand!")

If it's history you're into, you're just minutes from the third-largest living history museum in America. *Genesee Country Village & Museum*, 20 minutes away via NY 5 and NY 36, is home to dozens of restored 18th-and 19th-century buildings gathered from across the region in a historic village setting, as well as a nature center and a museum of wildlife and sporting art. (It's also Mrs. Fybush's former employer!)

Here in Batavia, the *Holland Land Office Museum* is open Thursday, Friday and Saturday 10 AM – 4 PM, for a look at the history of Batavia and the Genesee County region. It's at 131 W. Main Street; turn left out of the hotel on NY 98, then left again on Main Street

Both Rochester and Buffalo boast many other museums for almost any interest.

Buffalo's Albright-Knox Art Gallery is hosting an exhibit of new figurative sculpture. Rochester's George Eastman House/International Museum of Photography combines a visit to the mansion of Kodak's founder with one of the nation's finest collections of photographic art. The Susan B. Anthony House in Rochester celebrates the life of the famed suffragist, who lived here until her death in 1906. Rochester's Strong Museumsffers hours of family fun and learning.

Off the beaten path, Buffalo is a mecca for architecture and design buffs, home to Frank Lloyd Wright's *Darwin Martin House*, several early Louis Sullivan skyscrapers and, in nearby East Aurora, Elbert Hubbard's *Roycroft* campus, the epicenter of the Arts and Crafts movement of the 1890s.

And if you're headed south as you leave us on Sunday or Monday, you might want to stop in Corning, where the *Corning Museum of Glass* boasts the world's largest collection of glass art and the chance to see glassblowers at work making Steuben art glass.

Railroad buff? Don't miss the *Arcade and Attica Historic Railroad,* just half an hour away, running its vintage equipment at 12:30 and 3:00 on Saturday and Sunday – and the *New York State Transportation Museum* in Rush, just off Thruway exit 46!

Baseball? We've got minor league action for everyone here! The *Batavia Muckdogs* (NY-Penn

League, short-season A) are the Phillies' farm team. They play Jerry Starr's hometown Mahoning Valley Scrappers on Thursday, Friday and Saturday night at 7:05. Dwyer Field is just minutes away – and after the game, look for Yankees players here at the Days Inn, the Muckdogs' official host hotel!

A higher caliber of minor league is available in Rochester and Buffalo. The *Rochester Red Wings* are in their second season as the Twins' top farm team (after 32 years with the Orioles) – and on Sunday, we'll see them take on the *Buffalo Bisons*, the Indians' top farm team, at Rochester's beautiful Frontier Field.

This is a great week to be shopping in our area, too, at Buffalo's *Walden Galleria* (I-90 west to exit 52), Rochester's *Eastview Mall* (I-90 east to exit 45, then west on I-490), or the huge *Finger Lakes Outlet Mall* (I-90 east to exit 42, then south on NY 14 and east on NY 318), thanks to a sales tax-free week. All clothing purchases under \$110 haye no state sales tax right now!

And if it's one of the nation's biggest state fairs you're after, you're in luck. The *New York State Fair* runs through Monday at the fairgrounds near Syracuse, about two hours away. (I-90 east to exit 39, then I-690 east to the fairgrounds.)

Or, you could just head out on pretty much any road from Batavia and sample the small towns and lovely rural scenery of the western New York countryside. Head east on NY 5/US 20 and you'll be in the Finger Lakes in about half an hour, where you can enjoy wonderful small towns like Canandaigua, Ithaca and Seneca Falls (birthplace of the women's rights movement.)

Those of us who live here in Western New York think our region is one of the undiscovered treasures of America. We're looking forward to sharing it with you this weekend – and we hope you come back soon to see more!

THURSDAY TOURS

To CHWO Transmitter from the Days Inn: Take I-90 (Thruway) WEST towards Buffalo. Stay right as you approach the exit 50 tollbooths, and just after the tollbooths keep right to get on I-290. Take 290 to I-190 North (towards Niagara Falls and Canada).

Border traffic has been more congested than usual, so it's important to TUNE INTO CJRN 710 AM OR THE TIS STATIONS AT 1200/1610 FOR BORDER TRAFFIC INFORMATION ONCE YOU REACH EXIT 50.

If traffic entering Canada has no delays or minor delays at the Queenston-Lewiston Bridge, follow these directions: Take I-190 North all the way to the end, going over the two Grand Island Bridges (50 cent toll] and arriving at the Queenston-Lewiston Bridge. You'll pass through the Canadian border inspection and then pay a toll. (\$3.50 US at last check.) Once you're across the border, follow the signs to the QEW (Queen Elizabeth Way) towards Toronto.

If CJRN is warning of lengthy delays at Queenston-Lewiston, but lesser delays at the Rainbow Bridge, follow these alternate directions: Take I-190 over the Grand Island bridges, but exit IMMEDIATELY after the second Grand Island bridge. Follow the signs to the Robert Moses Parkway heading into downtown Niagara Falls, N.Y., and then follow the signs to the "Bridge to Canada". Go over the Rainbow Bridge into Canada and follow Highway 420 to the QEW.

You'll get to see some pretty nifty towers as you get in the vicinity of exit 68 – the eight towers on the left side of the road are CFMJ 640, beaming 50 kW straight across the lake at Toronto. Look beyond them up to the top of the Niagara Escarpment and you can also

make out the nine towers of CJCL, "Fan 590." A few km down the road, as you pass the Casablanca Boulevard exit, you'll get a great view of the eight towers of CFTR 680. (We'll return to them later, time permitting.)

Follow the QEW over the Hamilton Skyway and around the west end of Lake Ontario to Exit 118, Trafalgar Road (Regional Road 3). Turn LEFT on Trafalgar Road and follow it north approximately 10 miles past Highway 407, past the light at Derry Road (Regional Road 7), under some big power lines and past a trucking depot. Take the next right at Auburn Road, across from the Tim Horton's and Esso gas station. Auburn Road bends to the left and takes you to the CBC transmitter facility, on the left.

To CHWO Studios from the transmitter site: Go back out Auburn Road and left on Trafalgar. Follow Trafalgar back down across the QEW and continue south on Trafalgar into the center of Oakville. (It becomes a narrow city street and twists and turns a bit; go slow!) Turn LEFT on Church Street and park in the garage immediately on the right or on the street on the next block (you'll need to have some Canadian change handy for the meters.) CHWO is at 284 Church Street West, right at the corner of Trafalgar; the entrance is on Church Street.

To Licks Restaurant from CHWO Studios: Return to Trafalgar Road (you may have to circle the block to Lakeshore Road, the next street south of Church, since Church is one way eastbound) heading north (the way you came in to Oakville). Go approximately one mile, across Cornwall Road and under the railroad tracks. Licks is just ahead on your left, before the QEW ramps.

To CHUM Transmitter from CHWO Studios: Return south on Trafalgar Road to Lakeshore Road (next street after Church). Turn left (east) on Lakeshore Road and keep going for several miles. You'll cross Winston Churchill Boulevard and see the six towers of CHUM on your right. Turn right into the CHUM parking lot.

To Batavia from CHUM Transmitter: Turn right on Lakeshore Boulevard, which bends to the left and becomes Southdown Road. Take the next left (Royal Windsor Drive) and then turn left for a quick exterior look at CFRB 1010. Continue on Royal Windsor Drive to the QEW (towards Hamilton and Niagara).

Depending on your driver's preference, some of you may now wish to see what downtown Toronto looks like instead of returning to Batavia for dinner. Be sure to let one of your convention hosts know that you're heading into the city – and then turn right out of CFRB, left on Southdown Road and follow the QEW towards Toronto, where it becomes the Gardiner Expressway and heads into downtown.

Several tour participants have also asked about doing a quick bit of shopping at a Canadian supermarket; the most convenient is in Burlington, at exit 101, Brant Street, where you'll find a Sobey's supermarket next door to an Indigo book/music store [Canada's answer to Barnes & Noble, I guess.] Turn right on Brant Street and the shopping center is ahead on your left. You can return to the Niagara-bound QEW by turning right out of the shopping center on Brant Road, then right again on Fairview Street to the QEW.

Continuing with our directions, then: follow the QEW over the Hamilton Skyway and get off at exit 78, Fifty Road. Turn left over the highway, then right on North Service Road and a quick right on Baseline Road, then straight ahead to admire the eight huge towers of CFTR 680. Return to the QEW via Casablanca Boulevard (there's a Tim Horton's donuts and a Harvey's restaurant there for anyone needing a pit stop) and follow it back to the border. [Check CJRN 710 for traffic conditions – we can either take Highway 405, which is under reconstruction, to the Queenston-Lewiston Bridge to I-190 South or Highway 420 to the Rainbow Bridge to the Robert Moses

Parkway to 190 South. The Highway 420/Rainbow Bridge approach would also be preferable for those who, time permitting, want to take a quick gander at the Falls.]

Take 190 over the Grand Island bridges to I-290 (the exit comes up immediately after the second bridge and toll plaza), then follow 290 to I-90 East to exit 98.

To Alex's Place restaurant from the Days Inn: Go out the Days Inn exit and turn right on Rt. 98. Turn left on Park Road (towards the Ramada and Holiday Inn), then stay to the right at the Holiday Inn. Alex's is just ahead on the right.

FRIDAY TOURS

To WNED Transmitter Site from the Days Inn: Take I-90 (Thruway) WEST towards Buffalo. After paying the toll at Exit 50, stay LEFT to continue on I-90 around Buffalo. You'll go through another set of tolls after Exit 54 and get off the highway at Exit 57, NY 75/Hamburg. Turn LEFT after the tollbooths and follow Route 75 to its end at Route 5. Turn LEFT on 5, then LEFT again on Cloverbank Road about half a mile down. WNED's five towers are just ahead on your right.

To WWKB/WGR Site and WNED Studios from WNED Transmitter Site: Return to Route 5 and turn RIGHT. Follow Route 5 along the Lake Erie shore past Route 75 to Big Tree Road. Turn RIGHT on Big Tree Road and the site is just ahead on your right. After viewing the site, turn LEFT and return to Route 5, turning RIGHT and following Route 5 East as it becomes the Skyway.

As the Skyway ends in downtown Buffalo (crossing I-190), turn LEFT on Church Street and an immediate LEFT again on Lower Terrace. WNED is right there on your right, next to the Adam's Mark Hotel – a big tan and red building. Turn right on Charles Street to enter their parking lot.

To Ted's Hot Dogs from WNED Studios: Turn right out of WNED onto Lower Terrace, then LEFT on West Seneca Street and a quick LEFT on Franklin Street. Take the next RIGHT onto Church Street and follow it six blocks to Elm Street. Turn LEFT on Flm and go seven blocks to NY 33 East. Take 33 past the Thruway and the Buffalo Airport to NY 78/Transit Road. Turn LEFT on Transit, cross under the Thruway, and Ted's will be ahead on your LEFT. After lunch, turn right and return to the Thruway, or take 33 east back to Batavia for a leisurely country drive.

To WBTA from the Days Inn: Turn LEFT out of the hotel on NY 98 (Oak Street). Follow Oak about a mile to NY 5, Main Street, and turn LEFT. WBTA is at 113 Main Street, on the left at the corner of Center Street

To Jim Renfrew's house from the Days Inn: Turn RIGHT on NY 98 from the hotel. Go over the Thruway, then turn RIGHT on W. Saile Drive. Go past the airport and turn LEFT on Bank Street Road. Jim's house is #6988, the last house on the left before Bank Street Road ends at NY 262.

SATURDAY TOURS

To WLGZ Transmitter from the Days Inn: Take I-90 (NY Thruway) EAST one exit to exit 47, I-490. After the toll booths, exit at NY 19 North and go approximately 8 miles north, through the village of Brockport and over the Erie Canal. (If time permits, you may want to turn left when you get to NY 31 and take a quick glimpse at little WASB 1590, just a half-mile or so off NY 19.) Turn RIGHT on NY 104/Ridge Road and continue for about two miles to the six-tower 990 site, on your left down Clark Ridge Drive.

To WHAM Transmitter from WLGZ: Turn LEFT on NY 104/Ridge Road, then RIGHT in about a mile on NY 259/Union Street. Follow Union Street over the canal and through Spencerport to NY 531 east. Take NY 531 to I-490 east to I-390 south. Exit at NY 383/Scottsville Road (careful – this exit comes up quickly right after the airport!) and turn RIGHT on Scottsville Road. Take Scottsville Road south past NY 252/Jefferson Road. About a mile down, turn LEFT on Brook Road; the WHAM site will be about half a mile down Brook Road on your right.

To Schaller's Restaurant from WHAM: Turn LEFT on Brook Road, LEFT again on Scottsville Road, and RIGHT on Jefferson Road (NY 252). You'll pass the Rochester Institute of Technology. Turn LEFT (at the U-Haul) on Brighton-Henrietta Town Line Road, then LEFT on West Henrietta Road/NY 15. Schaller's is just ahead on the LEFT.

To WROC Transmitter from Schaller's: Turn RIGHT on West Henrietta Road, then LEFT on Brighton-Henrietta Town Line Road. You'll go about two miles, past NY 15A and Monroe Community College. Turn LEFT on South Clinton Avenue. WROC is on the right just past Woodsmeadow Lane.

To WXXI Transmitter from WROC: Turn LEFT on South Clinton Avenue, then LEFT on Brighton-Henrietta Town Line Road and LEFT again on South Winton Road. (You'll pass the four towers of WHTK 1280 on your left). Turn RIGHT on French Road and go around the curves. WXXI is at 560 French Road, the yellowish-orangish-peeling-paintish house on your left.

To WHIC from WXXI: Turn RIGHT on French Road, then RIGHT again on South Winton Road. Go under I-590, then turn RIGHT at the next light. WHIC is in the building on your left, 1840 South Winton Road. (To return to Batavia from here, just turn left, then right on to 390 South to the Thruway.)

To Pinnacle Hill (time permitting) from WHIC: Turn RIGHT on South Winton Road, LEFT at the next light on Westfall Road, then take the next RIGHT on Bonnie Brae Avenue. Go through the light at Elmwood Avenue and observe the antennas atop Scott's house at #92. Now turn around and return to Elmwood, turn RIGHT and continue to Hemingway Drive. Turn RIGHT on Hemingway, go across Highland Avenue into the Hillside Children's Center, and bear left up the hill to the transmitter site.

To Batavia from Pinnacle Hill: Head back down the hill. Turn RIGHT on Highland Avenue, LEFT on South Clinton Avenue and RIGHT on Elmwood Avenue. Follow Elmwood through the University of Rochester and over the Genesee River, then bear left on to Scottsville Road (NY 383) to I-390 North. Take 390 to I-490 West to the Thruway to Exit 98.

SUNDAY TOURS

To Tom Wahl's Restaurant from the Days Inn: Turn LEFT out of the hotel to NY 98 (Oak Street), then LEFT on NY 5 (Main Street) in downtown Batavia. Follow NY 5 approximately 25 miles through LeRoy (the birthplace of Jell-O), Caledonia and Avon

(home of the only Cool Whip factory in the U.S.) Tom Wahl's is on your right just after you pass through downtown Avon.

To the Antique Wireless Association museum from Tom Wahl's: Turn RIGHT out of the restaurant on NY 5. (When you get to NY 15, time permitting, you may want to turn right and go south a couple of miles to a left on South Lima Road and Bob Savage's WYSL 1040; this would add about 15 minutes' driving time.) Follow NY 5/US 20 about 15 miles through Lima to the village of Bloomfield. The museum is right on the village green at 2 South Avenue.

To Frontier Field/WXXI studiosfrom the Antique Wireless Association museum: Take NY 5/US 20 east to NY 444. Follow NY 444 north (right turn) into the village of

Victor. Turn LEFT on NY 96 and follow NY 96 to I-490 west. Take I-490 to exit 14, Broad St./Plymouth Avenue. Go straight off the exit to get to Broad Street. Turn RIGHT on Broad, then LEFT three blocks ahead (at the *Democrat and Chronicle* building) on Exchange. Exchange becomes State Street; go under the Inner Loop ("Welcome to High Falls" sign) and into the parking garage a block ahead on your right. The weekend entrance to WXXI is on Mill Street, behind the parking garage.

To Batavia from Frontier Field: Exit the garage via the Mill Street exit. Turn RIGHT, then RIGHT again at the end of Mill Street. Follow the Inner Loop on-ramps to I-490 west to I-90 west (Thruway) to exit 48.
