IRCA Convention: The 2018 IRCA convention will be held at the Best Western Plus Charles Inn in St. Charles, MO on September 7 & 8. The hotel is located at 1425 S. Fifth Street in St. Charles NW of I-70 exit 229B, or the first exit west of the Missouri River, eight miles west of the Lambert St. Louis International Airport. The room rate is \$104.99 a night for either a standard king or two queens. The phone number to call the hotel directly to make reservations for that weekend is (636) 946-6936 or toll-free at 1-888-274-0988. When calling to make the reservation, you must mention the code IRCA to get the rate. There is a block of 30 rooms reserved at that rate for each night for your choice of a single or double bed, your choice. Reservations must be made by August 7, 2018. One note, if all the rooms for this block sell out, then the meeting room at the hotel will be complementary.

Registration fee is only \$25 per person with free breakfast. There will be a tentative radio tour of KCLC FM 89.1 at Lindenwood College in St. Charles as well as another possible radio tour and a possible radio tower visit. - 1460 UnID --** 3/15 2059 – Mixing with WMBA, talk and Spanish, male “This is oldies 5 hundred 5-zero.” Wondering if this is “True Oldies” in Radford, VA? (**KK-VA**)

LOGGINGS

- 540 WKFN TN Clarksville** – 3/29 2327 – Tuned in to ESPN mentions, various ads including one for veterinary clinic with 931 area code, “...540 WKFN...” ID at 2330, sports news. Fair at times to very poor with usual WLIE. (**PS-ON**)
- 580 WHP PA Harrisburg** – 3/17 0706 – Alone on frequency with “Harrisburg’s news, traffic and weather WHP” into local news, including a bill in the state legislature to kill DST in Pennsylvania. (**MKB-ON**)
- 600 WMT IA Cedar Rapids** – 3/17 0700 – Over CJCL-590 slop with “News Radio 600 WMT Cedar Rapids, an iHeart Radio station” (not for much longer they ain’t) into Fox News. (**MKB-ON**)
- WSOM OH Salem** – 3/17 0735 – Over the usual CJCL-590 slop with “...on AM 600 WSOM” into “Candida” by Tony Orlando. (**MKB-ON**)
- 620 WKHB PA Irwin** – 3/8 1624 – Way atop frequency with no sign of WZON, WVMT, or WHEN, usually heard here at sunset. Program was Dr. Tom Lawrence, Voice of Natural Health Clinical Nutrition Center, call 724-719-7237, lost at 1830 with power drop to 50 watts, leaving an unidentified oldies station, probably WZON. A visit to the good doctor’s web page confirms that he does indeed broadcast on KHB Radio AM 620 and 94 FM. (**TF-NH**)
- 690 WADS CT Ansonia** – 3/8 1758 – Spanish music way over CKGM, second time that I have heard this station up here, first was a few weeks ago. (**TF-NH**)
- 830 WEEU PA Reading** – 3/12 1900 – Signal clobbering WCRN with ABC News, Promo for high school hoops tomorrow night on WEEU, with Berks Catholic playing something Valley, “Three Day weather forecast on Berks County 830 AM,” followed by Mark Levin. (**TF-NH**)
- 920 CKNX ON Wingham** – 3/18 0608 – Nice ID and promo for radio advertising. In very well briefly. (**JW-PA**) *This is a huge pest for me and I suspect they don’t power down their day rig after sunset. I wish CKNX would move to FM like so many other smaller-market Canadian stations. Mike.*
- 950 WKDN PA Philadelphia** – 3/19 0502 – Weak, but little competition on the frequency at this time. Although I could be getting a back lobe of normal propagation, doesn’t sound like 21,000 watts. Permit to go to 650 watts at times. (**JW-PA**)



- 1160 WCVX KY Florence – 3/16 0505 – Quick ID at this time, then into religious talk with male announcer. (JW-PA)
- WPIE NY Trumansburg – 3/22 1900 – Over usual WYLL-Chicago with Westwood One NCAA basketball coverage, “ESPN Finger Lakes, WPIE Trumansburg-Ithaca-Lansing” ToH ID. (MKB-ON)
- WCCS PA Homer City – 3/30 0711 – Over usual WYLL-Chicago with local weather, “WCCS AM 1160, FM 101.1” ID into “Indiana in the Morning” show (i.e. Indiana County in PA, not the state). (MKB-ON)
- 1190 WOWO IN Fort Wayne – 3/8 1820 – Sean Hannity in WLIB null. WOWO was once regularly heard all over the eastern USA until former daytimer WLIB received a permit for 30,000 watts at night, and WOWO dropped its night power from 50,000 watts non-directional to 9800 watts at night. The same company owned both stations. (TF-NH)
- 1230 WGUY ME Veazie – 3/8 1805 – Atop frequency for about eight minutes with rock oldies and “Maine’s best oldies, WGUY” into more oldies on its 640 watt night signal, this guy is almost a regular here even though five stations on 1230 are closer to Campton than is WGUY. (TF-NH)
- 1300 WLXG KY Lexington – 3/18 0300 – Strong fading in and out with ID “Sportsradio 1300 WLXG Lexington” into ESPN SportsCenter then faded. New! (JRM-PA)

- 1380 WABH NY Bath – 3/11 1914 – Country music mixing with WSYB, ID for WABH and more C&W songs. (TF-NH)
- 1410 WNER NY Watertown – 3/27 0750 – Good in briefly with “Winner 1410” station promo, into Fox Sports then faded. My third new catch on 1410! (JRM-PA)
- WLSH PA Lansford – 3/11 1918 – Atop frequency with music, ID for “AM 1410 WLSH,” promo for “Your News.com,” local weather, into more music. Faded into mix with WPOP and an unidentified station airing CBS Sports, either WELM or WENU. (TF-NH)
- +++ 3/20 1900 – Good with “This is 1410 WLSH Lansford, Lehighton, Hazelton” ToH ID into ABC News and promo mentioning “An American Original!” Then oldies music and faded out. A sporadic visitor to 1410 here. (JRM-PA)
- WRTZ VA Roanoke – 3/20 1928 – Fair, thinking I was still hearing WLSH, “True Oldies WRTZ” promo popped up, into The Oldies Channel,” then gone. (JRM-PA)
- 1420 WCOJ PA Coatesville – 3/11 1923 – Discussion on EWTN on how to pray, EWTN feed soon vanished into the mush. (TF-NH)
- 1450 WRNN SC Myrtle Beach – 3/15 2038 – Mixing with UNID Fox Sports, oldies, religious talk and C&W songs, male “G 105 5” FM slogan. (KK-VA)
- 1460 WMBA PA Ambridge – 3/15 2046 – Presumed in mix with talk, oldies and Spanish. Normally local WKDV wipes out everything on 1460 kHz for me. Luckily, at 2015 ET WKDV audio goes off. Perhaps, problem when switching to night power? Carrier still on, but weaker at times. I’m actually hearing other stations on 1460 kHz! Hearing a hockey game play-by-play, “...break in the action. You’re listening to the Penguins radio network.” Per NHL website, only WMBA is shown on 1460 kHz for Pittsburgh Penguins network. Nice surprise and new station for me. (KK-VA)
- WGMF PA Tunkhannock – 3/8 1812 – Oldies “Greatest hits of the 60’s, 70’s and 80’s, Gem 104” slogan, into more music. Atop frequency, no usual WOPG. WGMF was once a 250 watt daytime middle of the road music station on 1500 in Watkins Glen, NY, call stood for “Watkins Glen-Montour Falls.” Tunkhannock is a town of 2000 people in the coal mining area of Pennsylvania. First time heard here. (TF-NH)
- 1470 WNYN NY Ithaca – 3/25 0552 – ID’ed at this time with “the songs you grew up with” slogan, mention of Ithaca NY, then into “Say a Little Prayer” by Dionne Warwick. (JW-PA)



- WTOE NC **Spruce Pine** – 3/15 1932 – In multi-station mix with “Good time oldies WTOE 14-70...” station promo. **(KK-VA)**
- WQXL SC **Columbia** – 3/15 1920 – In multi-station mix with male “‘The Point’ now at 1 hundred point 7 FM and 14-70 AM” slogan. **(KK-VA)**
- WLMC SC **Georgetown** – 3/15 1859 – In multi-station mix (WWBG, WTZE, WBTX, WQXL, WTOE, WNYY and UNID sports talk) with “Georgetown’s hometown radio station WLMC” ToH ID. **(KK-VA)**

- 1490 WXTG VA **Hampton** – 3/15 1930 – Mixing with WWNB and numerous UNIDs (talk, religious singing, gospel music, what sounds like Greek music and jazz), “We searched this crazy worldwide of music and hand picked the best. 102 point 1 ‘The Tide’” station promo. **(KK-VA)**
- 1500 WDPC GA **Dallas** – 3/22 2001 – Mixing with WFED (dominant local), WLQV and Spanish singing, female “Here’s what’s going on at WDPC...” Nice surprise and new station for me. **(KK-VA)**
- 1510 WFAI NJ **Salem** – 3/22 2008 – In multi-station mix with “Here to inspire you...all day, every day...Faith 15-10” station promo. **(KK-VA)**
- WPGR PA **Monroeville** – 3/22 1900 – In multi-station mix (WRNJ, WLAC, WFAI, UNID talkers) with “It’s 7 o’clock here at ‘We Are One Body’ radio WAOB. My name is Mike...” ToH ID by program host. **(KK-VA)**
- 1520 WARR NC **Warrenton** – 3/22 1829 – In WCHE, WWKB, UNID oldies and bluegrass station mix with ID as “WARR 15-20 AM Warrenton North Carolina.” **(KK-VA)**

- 640 **MEXICO** *XEJUA* Cd. Juárez, Chih. MAR 29 1203 - National anthem in progress, followed by ID at 1205, largely unreadable. Poor signal today in KFI null. [Wilkins-CO]
- 640 **MEXICO** *XENQ* Tulancingo, Hgo. MAR 23 1201 - Full ID by male announcer including 90.1 FM, "Radio Hidalgo" slogan used, then into Mexican anthem and rancharo music. First Hidalgo logging. [Vance-TX]
- 650 **MEXICO** *XEEJ* Puerto Vallarta, Jal. MAR 24 1144 - Noticed with banda music but fading in and out. Caught a decent break at 1155 with slogan "La Patrona, noventa tres punto cinco FM y seiscientos cincuenta AM" and then back into bandas. Time check by woman at 1156. Full ID with call letters, address, and Facebook info at 1159 UTC. [Vance-TX]
- 660 **MEXICO** *XEEY* Aguascalientes, Ags. MAR 31 1143 - Banda music. ID between each song, "La Caliente... ciento dos punto nueve..." Full AM and FM ID on the hour followed by Mexican anthem, then more banda. Part of the Radiofonico ZER network. [Vance-TX]

- 670 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, unknown location MAR 10 0102 - *R.Reloj* ID and ticks, wobbling; dominant. [Connelly-MA]
- 700 **COLOMBIA** *HJCX, W Radio*, Cali MAR 22 0401 - English language music including "Back For Good" by Take That, Spanish talk in between songs. Poor at times to very poor under WLW. Parallel to Tune In stream. [Snider-ON]
- 710 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple sites MAR 31 0900 - Good, over WOR; canned ID with dramatic organ music, "Rebelde la Habana, emisora de la revolución," and Rebelde lullaby music parallel 670 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 710 **MEXICO** *XEDP La Ranchera de Cuauhtémoc*, Cd. Cuauhtémoc, Chih. MAR 23 1217 - Preacher in Low German with American accent: this really stands out on the MW band vs all the Vietnamese and Spanish, and of course it's XEDP which emits this guy every morning. I see that WRTH 2018 does not mention this distinctive aspect. XEDP has no problem overhopping 10 kW KGNC Amarillo whose day and night patterns favor west/southwest to south to east/southeast; KGNC, KCMO and KNUS mutually protect each other. Once skywave is out, KGNC does make it to here marginally on groundwave at 380 km, better/closer than KCMO. [Hauser-OK]
- 750 **VENEZUELA** *YVKS, RCR*, Caracas MAR 11 0200 - RCR sports coverage promo with horse-whinny sound effect; good. [Connelly-MA]
- 789.96 **MEXICO** *XENT La Paz, BCS* MAR 30 1221 - World news mentioning "Noticiero Grupo Fórmula," loops southwest or west/southwest, making rumble het from the low side with other 790's such as Arkansas which is gradually gaining. Must be XENT, though there is one other Fórmula, 250 watts in Guadalajara. IRCA Log 2015 had XENT as 10/0.75 kW; WRTH 2018 as 5/0.75. Only one Mexican, XEBI Ags is in the MWOffset list, and it was exactly 790.000 in 2009. Stalwart 650 XETNT Los Mochis was also in from across the Gulf. [Hauser-OK] APR 2 1227 - Non-local ads, probably from Radio Fórmula feed, which I think I heard mentioned. Tough copy and no ID but XENT has been on this off-frequency for years. [Wilkins-CO]
- 810 **BAHAMAS** *ZNS3 Freeport* MAR 20 1008 - Religious talk by man. First time received for some time. Good signal. [Beu-TX]
- 810 **COLOMBIA** *HJCY Caracol Radio*, Bogotá MAR 11 0200 - Ultima Hora CARACOL mention; over WGY (Bahamas not noted). [Connelly-MA]
- 840 **HAITI** *Radio-Télé 4VEH*, Cap Haitien-Petite Anse MAR 10 2300 - Restful instrumental music, Dashing through the Snow 5-note interval signal, man with 4VEH ID and "il est six heures" time check; fair. [Connelly-MA]
- 860 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, Jovellanos//Bolondrón MAR 11 0200 - Dominant over CJBC, unID English (St. Kitts-Nevis?). [Connelly-MA]
- 890 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Chambas MAR 11 0200 - Huge with "Get Up and Boogie" (Silver Convention) '70s disco parallel 640, 690, 900, et al. [Connelly-MA]
- 940.255 unID MAR 11 0000 - Het growl. [Connelly-MA] Might your unID on 940 be HJGB *R.Calima*? The mwlist.org frequency offset list shows it was on 940.25 on 11-29-2017. [Dennis Gibson, ABDX]
- 950 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, Arroyo Arenas//Camagüey-Isábel Hortensia//Santiago de Cuba-Frente MAR 11 0200 - Mixed with WKDN. [Connelly-MA]
- 970 **MEXICO** *XEJ* Cd. Juárez, Chih. MAR 24 1133 - Noted in passing with call letter ID and power (couldn't make it out); the slogan sounded like "Radio México Noticias 970." Poor signal. [Wilkins-CO]
- 980 **MEXICO** *XEFQ* Cananea, Son. MAR 18 0620 - Appeared with full ID including FM 103.1 into nortenos. [Vance-TX]
- 990 **MEXICO** *XET* Monterrey, NL MAR 23 1209 - Talk by female announcer, call letter ID by her during the talk at 1227 UTC. [Vance-TX]
- 1000 **COLOMBIA** *HJAQ, RCN*, Cartagena MAR 11 0200 - RCN La Radio ID; through WINS IBOC hash. [Connelly-MA]
- 1000 **MEXICO** *XEFV* Cd. Juárez, Chih. MAR 26 1202 - National anthem in progress; man with ID at 1204: "XEFV La Rancherita Mil AM con mil wats de potencia" and also mentioning address en Avenida Malecon, Edificio Megaradio; I think news followed after a CDT time check. - 1220 **CUBA** *R.Caribe*, La Fé MAR 18 2327 - Thanks D.Crawford alert, back on 1220 kHz a couple days prior, after the transmitter blew up a few months ago and the audio was relocated to one of the Reblede audio feeds on 530 kHz. Spanish vocals, ID at 0003. MAR 19 1059 - Station theme, ID. Maybe my imagination, but the signal appears to be way weaker than pre-explosion transmitter days. [Krueger-FL]
- 1250 **MEXICO** XEDK *Radiatorama*, Guadalajara, Jal. APR 5 1159 - Grupo Radiorama announcements, news theme into *Radiatorama* newscast "Noticiero en Punto" as found on XEDK website. New, Jalisco #22, Mexico #295, station #1418. [Hall-CA]
- 1260 **MEXICO** XEOG *La Mera Mera/La Primera*, Ojinaga, Chih. APR 5 1200 - Slightly uptempo high choral version of Mexican anthem way under KTRC, then faded out for a few minutes before returning with *La Primera* slogan as heard at the Border Inn. Not much KSUR on this antenna. New, Chih. #41, Mexico #297, station #1422. [Hall-CA]
- 1270 **MEXICO** XEGL *La Verdad Radio*, Navojoa, Son. APR 5 1200 - Audible through local XEAZ open carrier with ad for local supermarket, lots of "La Verdad Radio" slogans and mention of station website diariolaverdad.com.mx. Relog. [Hall-CA]
- 1300 **MEXICO** XEP Cd. Juárez, Chih. MAR 30 1203 - XE anthem; ID at 1203:40 with call letters, power (40 kW), slogan ("Fiesta Mexicana"), address, and mention of RadioRama; into music at 1204. Fair, topping others. [Wilkins-CO]

TRANS-PACIFIC DX

- 774 **JAPAN** JOUB, NHK2, Akita APR 5 1200 - This was the only recognizable TP catch this morning. (I was trying for Mexican stations, so the wire was terminated; next time I'll try reversing the direction of the wire and see how it does for TP's.) [Hall-CA]
- 846 **KIRIBATI** *R.Kiribati*, London, Christmas Island MAR 21 0624 - JBA carrier from presumed *R.Kiribati*. MAR 23 0555 - JBA carrier from presumed *R.Kiribati*, not Europe. 846 is not a significant European frequency; per WRTH, in fact nothing more than 1 kW in Ireland, Italy (though there are medium-powers in South Africa, Saudi Arabia, UAE, Iran). At 1202, 846 is stronger than other TP carriers, so back to DX-398 to try to DF it: seems west/southwest rather than west, and Kiribati supposedly goes off around 1000 UTC. But the only DU's are three eastern Aussies at 2.5/5/10 kW, and an NZ'er at 2 kW; fluke? 846 soon fades down. MAR 25 0617 - JBA carrier from presumed *R.Kiribati* (at 0618, WWV reports K index of 4, G1 storms expected). Confident that this split is not European, but I start a 9 kHz bandscan at 0619, hearing only the 531 JBA carrier before falling asleep. [Hauser-OK] MAR 25 0450-0457 - Almost audible, but nothing could get past awful 850 KOA slop that I could be sure was audio. I was often able to hold sync lock on the Perseus and the carrier was strong enough to provide some audio as I've observed some from low band DU's with even less signal. I suggest trying around their sunset as I've observed a peak then and some weakening later. Last I read they sign off at 0907 or so, so no chance to log them at my sunrise. So the chase for a new country continues for me. [Kazaross-IL]

Transpacific carrier search: MAR 23 1159 - Started as usual on 774, to find it on the DX-398 from west/southwest, probably 3LO Melbourne rather than NHK Japan. Then switch to R75 with east-west long wire, from 1202 UTC: 594, 612, 774, 828, 846 (stronger, *R.Kiribati*), 882, 1035, 1116, 1503 kHz. MAR 28 1148 - 774 kHz on the R-75, so I then do a bandscan on the DX-398 at 1156-1204: 594, 567, 693, 666, 747, 828, 846, 1098 kHz and nothing higher. MAR 30 1200 - 774 first checked as always, can't get definite DF so probably both Australia and Japan. Onward at 1206-1215: 567, 594, 603, 702, 747 (stronger and hoped to pull some audio), 792, 828, 846, 882, 1098, 1548 kHz. [Hauser-OK]

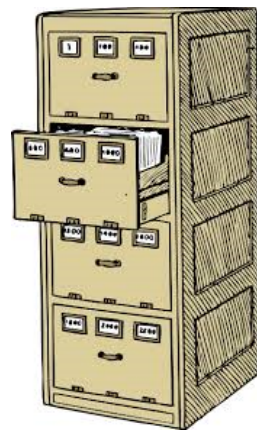

75 Years Ago – From the March 24, 1943 issue of *DX News*: The editor reminded members to BUY WAR BONDS & STAMPS (WWII in progress). WFTL-Fort Lauderdale, FL operating on both 710 & 1400 with the one call! Up until March, all but one of the scheduled DX Tests went as planned, then 3 failed to appear but still a great %. Bill Gabriel of OH extolled the value of “Radio Annual 1939” which gives extensive radio station data. Kermit Geary-PA got a letter from XECF saying they would broadcast a special program from a Los Mochis nightclub and dedicate it to the NRC & Kermit! Hilding Gustafson (great DXer of yore) reported veries from 41 Aussies & Zedders and 7 Japanese stations. He DXes with an 11-tube Grunow which replaced his 8-tube “old Crosly” in Rockford, ILLINOIS!



50 Years Ago – From the April 6, 1968 issue of *DX News*: Chuck Rader checked in from Hamburg, NY & Dick Truax from Columbus, OH. Latter logged KSSS-730 CO & WFUN-790 FL. Two new Miami area DXers mused- Walter Rogers & David Citron, who theorized that stations with a “C” in their call letters, don’t verify! Walt Breville-MO did a 3000-mile auto loop and visited with several members including Hank Ward (ex-TV editor for the club) and listened to ex-member Scooter Seagraves (KWAK) on a Tulsa station. Sheldon Miller-FL said Radio Americas-1157 on Swan Island (Carib) was about to go silent permanently. He also hears Radio Cartago-Costa Rica on his car radio on about 530. Among Richard Wood’s latest HI snares were: Cambodia-1434, Thailand-1146 & 1546, plus Burma-955.

25 Years Ago – From the April 6, 1993 issue of *DX News*: John Bowker’s ‘Now & Then’ column traced Indianapolis’ AM heritage: 1930: 1 station (WFBM-1230); 1948: 5, and 1992:8. VOA-1180 Marathon, FL Keys made it all the way to Minneapolis’ Michael Scott Paul with his Drake R8 and loop. WVCH-740 PA received eleven reports from its DX Test, furthest from IL’s Richard Palmer. Some even could still hear it as it powered down to 5 watts! Trivia- Delaware has the highest low frequency AM station- WSSR-900. All other states have at least one station lower than 900 on the dial.

10 Years Ago – From the March 31, 2008 issue of *DX News*: Kraig Krist wrote from VA where he DXes with a NRD-545 & a long wire. He detailed 7 “X” band receptions (1610-1700). Bruce Conti-NH heard seldom reported CBI-1140 Sydney (Cape Breton Island), NS Canada. The WBIX-1060 MA DX Test received reports from 18 states, 2 Canadian Provinces, Finland, Norway, Scotland, Sweden, & the UK! TN’s Dave White wrote a lengthy article entitled “The DXer & the Internets.” The 75th year Anniversary NRC Convention to be held in Pittsburgh, PA late August.

Here is Major League Baseball (MLB) flagship information for the 2018 season from my Internet searches. There are four teams for which last season's network list is still online. Please send me announcer information (and corrections), as some of the web pages either did not list the announcer names or were definitely from last season (and maybe did not change for this season, but I have no way of knowing). And sometimes I cannot determine if an announcer is on radio only, TV only, or both. Any copyright statement on an mlb.com page is probably placed there automatically, even if the page content has not changed for the current season.

http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List_of_current_Major_League_Baseball_broadcasters has broadcaster information, and that web site has been updated for the 2018 season (last modified on 5 April 2018, at 00:02). But some of the references date back to 2010.

In some cases I was not sure that the network list was for the 2018 season, as many lists were undated. If I found a list that had no definite 2018 date but differed from the list I found last year, then I treated the list as one for the 2018 season even though the list might be for last season but changed since I downloaded it at the beginning of the season.

Note that if a station streams its broadcasts over the Internet, that the station cannot stream the baseball broadcasts because the Major League Baseball organization wants listeners to get a paid subscription via mlb.com.

On the mlb.com site for some teams, the announcers are listed under the "Roster" tab.

It is now time to begin collecting Minor League Baseball information; please send me what you can find. Thanks.

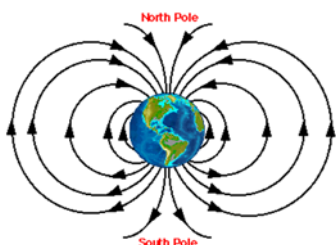
