FCC and CRTC Decisions and Applications

CALL CHANGES

Call changes reflected in FCC's Licensing and Management System "LMS" database:

- 850 WKVL TN **Maryville** – Call change to WSMM (Sept. 22).
- 1010 WHFS FL **Seffner** – Call change to WJBR (Sept. 19).
- 1110 KRDC CA **Pasadena** – Call change to KWVE (Sept. 12).
- 1230 KKPC CO **Pueblo** – Call change to KDZA (Apr. 21, finally corrected in LMS).

It looks like there are still 4 call changes from earlier this year that still haven't made it into LMS (WKYX-570 to WBMP, WNTI-990 to WGGI, WTZA-1010 to WXKG, and WIOV-1240 to WRLD), plus the two mystery callsign requests that haven't been approved pending finalization of the stations' sale but seem to be in use on the air (WXJX-910 to WJFG and WCNS-1480 to WJFA). Otherwise, the callsigns in LMS seem to be up to date and accurate. Use this database, not AM Query.

- For those of you who have a new radio or antenna to evaluate, please do so and inform others the good / bad features of them.
- More on 'Liners'/'Sweepers'/'Bumpers': Rick Dau writes to say . . . "A few issues back, I saw Robert Vance use the term "splitter," a term HE says he's been using for decades (when I e-mailed him about it), although that was the first time I'd ever seen anyone use it. I think people who are in the DXing hobby who are also actual broadcasters would probably tell you that "liner" and "sweeper" are probably the most commonly-used terms in the radio industry to describe a short ID between songs. I myself prefer to use "liner" -- my two cents is that we run the risk of confusing people if we start using too many terminologies in DDXD-W (or DDXD-E) describe what is essentially the same thing." Rick also notes that 'Radio Sweeper' is defined in Wikipedia (now why didn't I think of them? Doh! – BH) like this: "A radio sweeper is a short, pre-recorded sample used by radio stations as segues between songs that give listeners a brief station identifier or promo, generally 20 seconds or less: "You're listening to the soft sounds of [NAME] radio. Easy listening throughout the Bay Area," for example. Dry radio sweepers are voice only – no music or sound effects – whereas wet sweepers generally contain sound FX (also known as "sonic," a global term for all sound effects and elements used in a sweeper.) Sweepers are also known as liners, bumpers, radio imaging, sweeps, station imaging, stingers, IDs, idents, promos, shotguns and intros. Most sweepers will have a voice over included on the audio."

Canada's National Post reporter Anja Karadeglija seems to be the only one who noticed that the CRTC has announced that they will not deal with any new radio applications or complaints for the next two years. To give them time to implement the federal government's new Bill C-11, the On-line Streaming Act, which requires companies like Netflix to contribute to the Canadian content system.

Delays are now expected in the realization of recent predictions of sudden moves to AM-FM simulcasting. CHQR-770 Calgary, Alberta set the stage with their surprise move to simulcasting at the beginning of the year. First there was the CRTC's short extension of CHQR's existing license to give them more time to think about the station's flouting of both simulcasting and FM Spoken Word regulations. Then there was the two-year moratorium on new radio applications and complaints.

- 530 CHLO ON Brampton** – HD (hybrid/IBOC) transmissions were discontinued when the transmitter was damaged some time ago. There is no word on when HD will be restored, and the station's web site 'https://am530.ca' still prominently displays HD logos.
- 1220 CFAJ ON St. Catharines** – Their Grand Opening, after years of running in Test mode, was scheduled for September 11, but a staff member reported that the launch had been delayed by a week. And their 'classic1220.ca' web site no longer has the September 11 launch info, which named the AM & PM Drive hosts. But, as of September 22 it simply says "Your Hometown Radio Coming Soon!"
- 1330 CJYM SK Rosetown** – Simulcasts CFYM-1210 Kindersley, Saskatchewan all, or most of the time. Despite being the less powerful of the two stations, the programming originates from the CFYM studios. Splitters between Oldies music often simply say "Classic Hits," the branding and format shared by both stations. **Not listed as Simulcast in current NRC AM Radio Log.**
- 1440 CKJR AB Wetaskiwin** – As predicted, the station continues its former W-14-40 format outside of the All Sports hours (0900-2000 weekdays): South Asian 2000-2300 weekdays and Oldies otherwise, with the exception of a few other blocks of paid programming. The W-14-40 branding is gone with splitters saying Sports-14-40 even during the Oldies programming.

- 1580 WWTF KY **Georgetown – 9/9 0650** – Tentatively the source of nonstop Fox Sports Radio with no IDs or local inserts. Format listed is ‘Alt Rock’ along with their 97.7 translator. The website still shows the same and has song scrolls for said, but clicking on the audio, it was not that or FSR, but instead two old dirtbags with a remote at some Lexington area horse track. Wiki states they were FSR before flipping to Rock, for what it’s worth. Threshold pieces of the signal still present up to **0930** my local time, so maybe WWTF, since they’re 10,000 Watts day power, and even weaker threshold WLAC on 1510 kHz present at the same time. The only FSR listed on 1580 in the latest AM Log is 1000 Watter KOKB, Blackwell, OK which can be ruled out this late. Remotely thought it could be WNTF, Bithlo with a format change. Not so. David Crawford in Indian River City, Florida confirms they are not on the air (this day), not unusual, they are a mess, and when on, normally Anglo-Caribe format. (TK-FL)

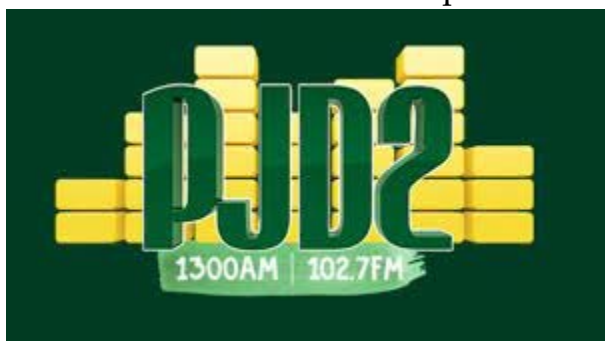

Parallel station stream. For some reason, the 2023 WRTH claims this as *Señal 1060 AM*, but that wasn’t the ID, nor is that what remains listed in the newest IRCA Mexican Log, 26th Edition. Parallel 6185 kHz with shockingly great audio modulation level. [Krueger-FL]
- 1090 **MEXICO** XEPRS Rosarito, BC SEP 17 1228 – Poor; ESPN. (I’m thinking, did WAQE flip to ESPN?) National ads, Subaru of San Diego. “The Mightier 1090! ESPN Radio.” No other west coasters/Mexicans in! Unreal. Been a while! [Rieger-MI]
- 1140 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple sites SEP 17 0359 – Fair, over other Cubans; midnight lullaby and choral national anthem parallel 600 and 670 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 1170 **MEXICO** XERT *La Raza*, Reynosa, Tamps. SEP 10 1025 – Nonstop Mexi-tunes save for male canned “La Raza” and “La Raza 1170” between most tracks. [Krueger-FL]
- 1300 **ST. MAARTEN** PJD-2 Philipsburg SEP 4 1935 – I bring up the TWR Bonaire SDR to check out RHC 15140, q.v., and find it’s tied up but I may camp upon someone listening to 1300; and hear music. What could that be? Soon quits so I get 1300 myself at 1936 to hear an ad in English in US\$, and www.pjd2radio.com, so that’s it. 1300 is weak s5 but fairly steady overwater from one part of Caribbean Netherlands to another, not bad, 862 km = 535 st miles



= 465 nmi. 1945 playing “Love, Sweet Love”, 1950 hardsell ad in English. 1955 mentions 102.7. Guess what, that website does not lead to a radio station but to a blog in Thai! Here’s the correct radio link: <https://pjd2radiosxm.com/>. Slow loading. “Welcome to the Voice of St Maarten – We are proud to be providing the Caribbean with the best in broadcast radio for over 35 years. We have two channels 102.7 FM and 1300 AM. Our listeners are guaranteed to get the latest in news in and around our community. We have the most talented collection of DJ’s on the island to keep our listener entertained and update with the latest music.” And with separate AM and FM player links. If you play one, the other stops. Maybe not/always parallel but are the same at 2018 in a female talk show about self-images, social media influencers. Ends at 2043, adstring at 2050 for flights to Bonaire, St. Maarten Concrete, Caribbean Lottery, etc. Seems that “SXM” is common lingo for the place, not just ITU. “Power 102.7 is here to cool it down,” 2051 back to music. [Hauser-BES]

They are daytime only. 9/19 880 WCBS for a second report. Report last year was not answered. This time I sent a prepared card. 9/21 1170 Boss Hogg Radio from WKFL Bushnell FL in at night. Another daytimer at night. 1340 WWFL in briefly with Spanish music and ID, new. DX is hampered by almost daily thunderstorms. Changed all of the batteries in the Sony 2010. I'll change the AA's every year, the D's get changed more often. I'm trying to prevent damage caused by battery leakage. 73's, Martin

An expedition some 10/15 miles north of Enid allows me to check 1550 KKLE Winfield KS better than I can hear it at home. In a previous report I heard sibling station 1130 KLEY in nearby Wellington utter a joint ID for them as well as several FM outlets. But Sept 10 at 1943 (UTC) they are certainly not //: one caradio but tuning back and forth, 1550 with music, 1130 with ad. After 2000, KKLE goes from a banjo bluegrass tune, to country, which is exactly the format listed in the new *NRC AM Log*. KLEY however sounds more rockish to me than country whenever I check it, and it has been modulating lately. Never heard the slogan "Red Dirt Country." BTW an FCC report says the FM translator of 1130, which is all that matters, has changed from 100.3 to 104.1 MHz, unknown why. 100.3 was relatively clear but never heard this far away, and 104.1 is impossible with OKC fullpower on it.

Another check on the caradio inside Enid, Sept 11 circa 2005: 1130 KLEY ID jointly for KKLE and two FMs, probably their translators. But once again, 1550 with weaker but sufficient signal is NOT // 1130!! Playing bluegrass while 1130 goes on with classic rock. True, I have not heard how 1550 IDs, but it can't be the Okie, KYAL Sapulpa/Tulsa which is a Sports Animal. At 2143 on home rig, 1550 promos as bluegrass 24/7; and I think My Town Media, as below. Does have a fast SAH, probably de KYAL.

These stations used to belong to Rocking M Media LLC, as if on a branding iron, M atop an arc, as still shown at radio-locator; but FCC LMS, which is allegedly kept more up to date than "unexpected error," AM Query, says licensee is My Town Media Inc., but expired 01/04/2023! which would seem to imply it should be off the air. Ditto for KLEY. But "Facility Status Date" is 08/12/2021! That's MM/DD/YYYY format per other entries. And I believe the two are conjoined twins, axually operated from the same studio, or rather computer bank.

1550 kHz, Sept 10 at 2359 on E/W LW, I'm checking still tuned here for a legal ID from KKLE, q.v. No call letters, but ``greatest hits of all time, Motown(?) 107.5``. Looking thru all 56 entries on 1550 in the new *NRC AM Log*, it's not the first one, WLOR Huntsville AL, 50000/44 watts which does have a puny FM translator on "107.5, The Beat." But gotta be this, also likelier by proximity: KESJ St. Joseph MO, 2500/500, ``Joe Town 107.5``! Another translator tail wagging the AM dog.

1130 kHz, Sept 19 at 1635, no signal on caradio from KLEY Wellington KS; despite high storm and line noise level, should be audible as usual daytimes. At 1655 I get a JBA carrier on the R75; on the DX 398 I can't get a DF fix. Could be image, or: how about running ``one watt`` night power in day rather than 250 watt day power at night? So KLEY seems totally off the air, and not merely dead air as often. Meanwhile sibling KKLE Winfield KS 1550 is quite audible with bluegrass, altho always weaker than KLEY when it's normal, and DF for NNE/SSW. Or 1130 trace: daytime groundwave remnant of KWKH LA?

1130, Sept 20 at 1656 & 1855 UT chex, KLEY Wellington KS is still silent. Likewise Sept 24.

A reintroduction to mark 50 years in the NRC. I joined just after the NJPC took over producing *DX News*. Musings were then a majority of every *DX News* with Ernie Cooper, who had a remarkable number of stations heard considering he was in NYC, in charge of the Musings. My favorite thing to read was Richard Wood and his DXing from Hawaii.

My equipment was not very good in those days – an 8-band portable with an inductively coupled Space Magnet antenna. I soon got a DX160 which was actually a step up! My college roommate was impressed that I could get WDR-1586 from Germany.

My best setup was when I had a Beverage antenna on the Maine coast. In the daytime I could get WUST Washington DC with 1 kW, WOSU-820, WHLO-640, WLW-700 from Ohio, Philadelphia 1210, and WJJD 1160 Chicago. This was before the clear channel frequencies filled up. But it was daytime only; I had to move for my first job before finding out what I could get at night. Too bad, the antenna was near the salt water and over rocky soil. Even though I later purchased an R8A and Quantum Loop, I could never match that setup. It is true that spending money on antennas is much more effective than spending it on receivers. With the Drake I heard a lot of LW European stations before most got shut down. I might be moving to a place where I can put up an outside (not really long) antenna, which I cannot do here.

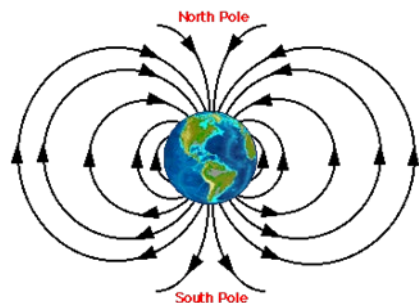

I'm back in NY after almost a month and trying to find time to review the IQ recordings I made with the Airspy Discovery while in CO. While there, I also spent some time on the C.Crane SSB sitting on 1290kHz where KMMM, Pratt KS dominates. Naturally, one evening around 11pm MDT when I did not have the audio recorder turned on, KCUB Tucson, AZ came in for about 30 seconds, loud and clear with multiple mentions of Wildcats Radio. That would have counted as a new listing but I'm sticking to my practice of only adding stations to my logbook if I have an accompanying recording. If I'm lucky, perhaps it will show up on one of the IQ recordings,?

Also while at the CO QTH, I noticed a triband ham antenna discretely mounted on the back of a home down the block (so as not to inflame the HOA spies) and had a chat with the owner about the seemingly increased RF noise level in the neighborhood over the 7 years I've been coming out there. He noticed the same and we speculated about the possible source(s). I suggested it was related to the solar panels on all the houses, many of which had been damaged in a hailstorm a few years ago and, we suspect, had not be reinstalled properly. This was a source of noise he said he had not considered before. The other likely source are all the WIFI devices everyone seems to have from RING doorbells and cameras to ALEXA , garage door openers etc. as well as the increased number of residents working from home on their computers. He said he would try to locate the source and perhaps the next time I'm out there, he'll have figured out some way to combat the noise.

Pro Sports Networks

Here is National Football League (NFL) flagship information for the 2023 season via Internet searches. Some of the network lists are undated, so I do not know if they are for the current season. And I cannot rely on the copyright date at the bottom of each page, as that is probably added globally for the web site, even if the specific web page being viewed has not changed. And some team sites do not list the announcer team, while others have bios that are a few seasons' old, so I do not know if they are current. I found some network list pages that were not linked from the team home page or sub-section "home" page; I assume that there are "orphan" pages that are not current.

These lists were checked by David Yocis against the official FCC AM and FM databases, so what you see below might differ from what you find at the URLs listed.

And I am not sure that I have all of the Spanish-language stations correct.

I do not know the sources for the gottoknow lists, so I cannot trust them 100%. I did compare the 2023 lists for the Los Angeles Chargers from both sources, and there were differences. I trust the list from the team's web site.

I found some of the lists in the "News" section of the team's website under the headline "How to watch the ... pre-season game against" I do not know if the pre-season list of stations differs from the list for the regular season. And some of these articles only listed the flagship station(s).

Due to NFL Restrictions, online streaming of games is prohibited by affiliates. You can listen and/or watch games online via NFL.com. The announcer names are found at this URL:

http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List_of_current_NFL_broadcasters

That page seems to have been updated for the 2023 season, but the footnotes on that site point to web page retrievals in 2012.

The Rams and the Steelers claim to have Grupo Imagen as a Spanish language network. The Steelers' web site has a list of stations; the Rams' site does not. And I cannot find a web site that contains a station list for Imagen Radio.

There is a site <http://nflfootballtv.com/onlineradio.html> that has Internet online radio - streaming audio and video information on each team. I have no idea if that web site is current.

The Westwood One Radio Network (renamed to Dial Global Sports and in 2013 and then renamed to WestwoodOne Sports) will broadcast NFL games that occur Sunday nights, Monday nights, and Thursday nights. This URL <http://westwoodonesports.com/football-announcers/> has the list of announcers. Here are the announcer teams:

Monday night: Kevin Harlan, Kurt Warner, Rich Eisen (studio host)

Sunday night: Ryan Radtke & Rod Woodson or Ross Tucker, Scott Graham (studio host)

Thursday night: Ian Eagle, Tony Boselli, Scott Graham (studio host)

The "Station Finder" on that web site has an option to select NFL broadcasts, but the heading has "2022 NFL." There is one station on the list that did not appear last year, so I am treating the list as current for this season.

Entravision, a Spanish language network, will be broadcasting games Thursday night season kickoff, Sunday Nights, Monday Nights, and all post-season games. The web site did not list the announcers.

As always, any of these network lists can change during the season. Please send me any additions and/or corrections. Thanks.

With the Future of AM Unclear, A Look Back at the Powerful Role Radio Plays in Baseball History

NEW YORK (AP) — Growing up in the Boston suburbs, Suzyn Waldman fell madly in love with two things: baseball and Broadway shows.

During the 1950s and '60s, the long arm of AM radio brought both into her home.

"I can still hear Ned Martin of the Red Sox reciting poetry about the mountains in Anaheim," said Waldman, the pioneer announcer and former star of musical stage who's been calling New York Yankees games for decades. "I can still hear Curt Gowdy with that Wyoming twang.

"Not everyone can remember who their first television broadcasters were — but everyone knows who the radio team was. Everyone."

Like many fans, especially older ones, Waldman originally got hooked by America's pastime listening to ballgames on an AM signal. In fact, next month will mark the 100th anniversary of the first World Series broadcast to a national radio audience, when Graham McNamee and Ford Frick were among those who called the 1923 Fall Classic between the Giants and Yankees on NBC.

A century later, however, some consider AM stations a dying medium in the modern age of digital technology. Several major automakers are eliminating broadcast AM radio from newer models — prompting lawmakers on Capitol Hill to propose legislation that would prevent the practice for safety and other reasons.

A bill with bipartisan support, the “AM for Every Vehicle Act” is winding its way through Congress.

To be sure, from satellite radio and streaming services to FM stations and cell phone apps, baseball fans nowadays have all sorts of options for tuning in their favorite team — even all 30 teams — whether their car features AM radio or not.

But those options aren’t necessarily free. And it’s not necessarily that simple.

Because for generations of fans, the warm memory of climbing into the family car on a hot summer night and finding the ballgame on that dashboard dial, leaning in to listen pitch by pitch with mom or dad over the persistent static of crackling AM airwaves, is the kind of age-of-innocence nostalgia that evokes “Field of Dreams.”

“I still like baseball on the radio,” John Thorn, official historian for MLB, said in an email. “I suspect that is not only because it is my favorite game, but also because it is a stop-action sport whose rhythms are well-suited to pauses, visualization by the listener, and reflection about the wonder of being ‘there’ at a distant game.”

Even if the future of AM radio is uncertain, there’s no denying its impact on the growth and popularity of baseball.

The marriage dates all the way back to Aug. 5, 1921, when Harold Arlin delivered the first play-by-play broadcast of a big league game between the Phillies and Pirates at Forbes Field in Pittsburgh on KDKA.

“Joined at the hip,” said longtime New York Mets announcer Howie Rose, who is 69. “What radio has meant to baseball and vice versa is probably the quintessential symbiotic relationship.”

It’s a romantic history, too, thick with unmistakable voices and signature calls forever immortalized as the familiar soundtracks to those grainy old highlight reels of Joe DiMaggio, Willie Mays and Ted Williams.

And beloved broadcasters, community icons still inexorably linked to their teams even generations later: Mel Allen (Yankees), Red Barber (Brooklyn Dodgers), Ernie Harwell (Detroit Tigers), Russ Hodges (New York Giants), Bob Prince (Pittsburgh Pirates), Chuck Thompson (Baltimore Orioles), just to name a few.

And charming tales, including a young Ronald Reagan, long before becoming the 40th president of the United States, announcing Chicago Cubs games in Iowa during the 1930s by recreating play-by-play at Wrigley Field that was initially transmitted via Morse code.

“Some clubs resisted the advent of radio, as they later would the introduction of television, believing it would deter attendance at the game,” the 76-year-old Thorn said. “But like the introduction of night baseball in 1935, radio had already brought major league games to the working class, and especially to women.”

Indeed, AM radio provided a gateway to the game for all sorts of folks at a time in America when ballpark stands were mostly filled with white men.

Before cable television took over, it was the long range of clear-channel AM stations that carried baseball all over the country and gave fans living far from big league cities the chance to follow a favorite team.

“Milo Hamilton and Ernie Johnson, Atlanta Braves, under the covers. My dad would come in, get on me, and then go, ‘What’s the score?’ The Braves, that’s the one thing we could pick up,” said 67-year-old Mets manager Buck Showalter, raised on the Florida panhandle. “Listening to Hank Aaron, Rico Carty. I can tell you the whole Braves lineup.”

KMOX in St. Louis, with its powerful signal reaching all over the central and southern United States, spawned countless Cardinals fans from Minnesota to Mississippi and beyond, as Hall of Fame broadcasters Harry Caray and Jack Buck described the scintillating exploits of Stan Musial, Lou Brock, Bob Gibson and more.

“You think about the teams that first started broadcasting on the radio, whether it was the Pirates or the Cardinals or the Reds, on these enormous clear-channel stations, it definitely grew the game,” said 65-year-old Mets announcer Gary Cohen.

“It definitely brought the game home for fans who were too far away to attend in person. At a time when most baseball was during the day and a lot of working people couldn’t attend, they could listen on the radio. So yeah, I mean, the connection between AM radio and baseball is not only one in terms of just entertaining the fans, but also creating fans.”

One of them was Rick Rizzs, the longtime Seattle Mariners broadcaster who spent his childhood on the South Side of Chicago.

“With that little magical transistor radio, that AM radio, you could not only get your teams, but maybe four or five other teams, wherever you were located,” said Rizzs, who turns 70 in November.

“So your baseball horizon was expanded, not just the Cubs and the White Sox, but to the Milwaukee Braves, at the time, or maybe when the weather was just right you could get the St. Louis Cardinals or the Detroit Tigers, or whoever was playing somewhere nearby. But because of AM radio, it expanded your chance to hear about all the stars that you had in your mind.”

The IRCA MEXICAN LOG lists all AM stations in Mexico by frequency, including call letters, state, city, day/night power, slogans, schedule in UTC/GMT, formats, networks and notes. The call letter index gives call, frequency, city and state. The city index (listed by state, then city) includes frequency, call and day/night power. The transmitter site index (listed by state, then city) tabulates the latitude and longitude of transmitter sites. Also, in this edition, there is a spread sheet with links to web sites, live broadcasts and facebook page of many of the Mexican stations. This is an indispensable reference for anyone who hears Mexican radio stations.

From the Archives

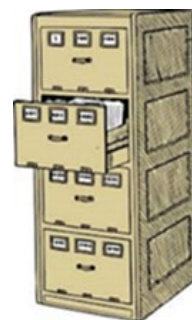
75 Years Ago: From the October 2, 1948 issue of *DX News*: WTCH-960 Shawano, Wisconsin offered a \$5.00 prize for the farthest report on its most recent DX test; the winner was from Seattle. The 1050 kHz station in New York has changed call letters to WMGM, with the slogan "Call Letters of the Stars."

50 Years Ago: There was no early October issue in 1973 as publishing moved from Boston to New Jersey.

25 Years Ago: From the October 5, 1998 issue of *DX News*: Bruce Conti reported on his DXpedition to Mount Megunticook in Maine. Longtime KDKA news anchor Bill Steinbach died in September 1998; he had been the speaker at the 1990 NRC Convention in Pittsburgh.

10 Years Ago: From the September 30, 2013 issue of *DX News*: The FCC announced a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking with a variety of proposals to "revitalize" AM radio.

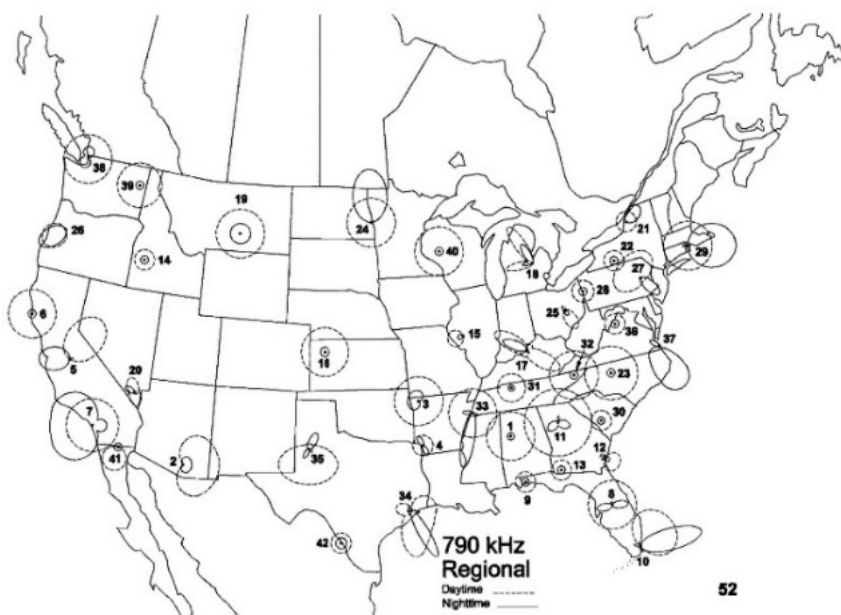
