## From the Archives

**75 Years Ago:** From the November 13, 1948 issue of *DX News*: 27 different stations planned DX tests between November 16 and November 30, with 28 more tests already scheduled for December. Due to increases in paper and postage costs, NRC dues were scheduled to increase to \$3.00 per year in 1949.

**50 Years Ago:** From the November 12, 1973 issue of *DX News*: Bob Foxworth is hosting the annual Greater NYC Metro DXers in Mineola on November 24. *Broadcasting* magazine reported that the FCC was considering proposals to allow more stations on clear channels, and would make decisions in the coming months.

**25 Years Ago:** From the November 9, 1998 issue of *DX News*: New expanded-band stations being

widely reported are KCJJ-1630 Iowa City IA (playing DX reports left by voice-mail, including from Ray Arruda) and WJNZ-1680 Ada MI testing.

**10 Years Ago:** From the November 11, 2013 issue of *DX News*: There are 58 new station CPs in the United States still outstanding, and several more from the 2004 application window that likely will be eventually resolved.



## --- NOTES FROM CANADA ---

One of Canada's largest broadcasters, Corus, currently has a stock market price that is less than 10% of the value of its assets if they were sold individually on the open market. The most recent large drop came after Corus suspended its generous dividend to stock holders, despite receiving word a few days earlier that the CRTC was seriously considering offering Corus major relief related to Canadian Content financial commitments. Corus has been hit hard by the acquisition by Rogers of Shaw. Like Corus, Shaw was majority owned by the Shaw family and they had been using CRTC-mandated money to fund Corus local Global TV News operations. Rogers has, instead, moved that funding to its own City TV network of stations.

CJET-FM has returned to its previous Country format and CKBY-FM call letters. CIWW initially ran an announcement explaining why they were leaving the air but unconfirmed reports say the transmitter is now off the air. As well as simulcasting on CJET-FM, Rogers had also broadened the format from All News to include other Spoken Word programming, in an effort to make it work financially, but without success. Tracing back through call letter changes, CKOY and CKCO before that, the station first went on the air in 1924, after being licensed to the Ottawa Radio Association, which had previously broadcast some programming on what was then known as "Radio Station OA,"

run by the federal Department of Marine and Fisheries, the same department that regulated Radio back then. OA signed off forever for February 9 1924, likely to make way for CKCH, owned and operated by Canadian National Railways, and soon to be renamed CNRO. Note that Wikipedia and other broadcast history sites claim that CIWW first signed on in 1922, but reading the *Ottawa Citizen* newspaper from 1924 provides the information here.

- 770 CHQR AB Calgary – Not off the air on October 22nd as planned “for maintenance work” from 0100-0700.** The original news article on station owner Corus’ globalnews.ca site appeared October 21st but was deleted by the end of the planned outage period. In Edmonton, **KATL Miles City, Montana** was coming in especially well under **CHQR** with occasional traces of **Seattle’s KTTH**. At **0400**, groundwave/ skywave phasing kicked in for the majority of Calgary stations, coupled with excellent conditions for even low-power U.S. stations to the south, most notably 149 Watt **KDYL South Salt Lake, Utah** on the former Calgary frequency of 1060. Of the existing Calgary stations, **CFAC-960** was hit the hardest by other during the phasing. **KALE-960 Richland, Washington** was especially strong with all 1960s Oldies, but 91 Watt **KFLD Baker, Montana** was also present with C&W. Even **CBR-1010** was not spared, with religious talk and music from the ESE, likely 194 Watt **KIHU Tooele, Utah**. Still awaiting CRTC decisions on its simulcasting with CFGQ-FM, which would see the CHQR call letters disappear and 770 become a rebroadcast transmitter of CFGQ-FM, where the hourly ID still announces the FM call letters then the AM call letters.
- 1310 CIWW ON Ottawa – Owner Rogers is surrendering its license to the CRTC after ending the CityNews format at 1:00 PM on October 26th.** It had been simulcast on nearby CJET-FM Smith Falls, close enough to be heard in Ottawa.

- 1500 KXMO TX Merkel – 09/23 – Mixing with KJIM at 0800 when male announcer give call letters real slow: “This is a K-M-X-O 1500 AM on your Radio . . . Merkel Texas . . .,” then the same announcement in Spanish. Fair signal. Relog. (JN-TX)

- 1540 KGBC TX Galveston – 09/23 2000 – With male giving call letters and mentioning “K269GS.” Fair signal in the jumble. Relog. (JN-TX)
- 1550 KZDG CA San Francisco – 10/28 0056 – Mixing it up with KICS and KESJ with Music program in Hindi into TOH ID in English by female: “You’re listening to Radio Zindegi.” **California #10. (SD-MN)**
- 1550 KZDG CA San Francisco – 10/27 0858 – Punjabi vocal music to a Legal ID at 0900:20: “You are listening to Radio Zindagi, KZDG 1550 AM San Francisco and the entire Bay Area,” followed by ads, mostly in English. (JW-CO)
- 1550 KRZD MO Springfield – 09/23 0001 – With ‘Turning Japanese’ by The Vapors, then male giving ID as: “107.5 . . . Springfield K298CI – 107.5 Springfield” into ‘Another Brick in the Wall’ by Pink Floyd. Fair-to-Good signal, on top of the channel. Relog. (JN-TX)

- 1570 WSCO WI Appleton – 10/25 2345 – Fair, with bits of liner: “. . . high school football . . . 99.1 The Score.” Heard during an unsuccessful attempt to bag WWCK. (RD-IA)
- 1580 WCCF FL Punta Gorda – 10/29 0100 – With male giving ID as: “We’re News Radio 1580 AM WCCF Punta Gorda and FM 100.9 W265EA Punta Gorda,” then into Fox News bulletin. On top of the channel with a good signal. Relog. (JN-TX)

- 1590 KBJT AR Fordyce – 09/23 0800 – With male saying: “. . . Radio 98.9 FM and 15-90 AM KBJT Fordyce.” Poor-to-Fair signal under KGAS which was airing ESPN Radio. **New for Arkansas # 52.** (JN-TX)
- 1590 WALG GA Albany – 10/29 2200 – Checking my overnight recording, I noted XEVOZ was off air, they put a good strong signal into Central Texas on my south antenna, and seem to have transmitter issues as they were gone at 2135 till 2240, this one popped up with male: “Talk Radio 15-90 WALG Albany 99.3 FM W257ED. It’s 10 o’clock. News starts now,” into Fox News. Fair signal. **New for Georgia #22.** Noted again at 2206 with male mentioning: “. . . WALG, the Voice of South Georgia. Fair signal. (JN-TX)

- 1590 KEKR TX Mexia – 09/26 1959 – Fair level, in the jumble, with male mentioning: “. . . your Hometown Seamless Gutter Country, this is Kicker Country KEKR 15-90 AM and K257GO 99.3 . . . . .” then fading out here. Not heard in sometime, since November 2021. Relog. (JN-TX)
- 1590 KGAS TX Carthage – 09/26 2100 – With female giving local ID as: “You are listening to ESPN Radio KGAS 15-90 AM Carthage,” then back into ESPN programming. Fair signal. Heard often. (JN-TX)
- 1600 WKWF FL Key West – 10/29 0116 – Topping KLEB with male with ID as: “You are listening to WKWF Key West, your Tavern in Town, AM 16 hundred and FM 103.3. We’re excited to have you.” Fair signal. Relog. (JN-TX)

 693 unID NOV 5 0900 – Het against 690 CKGM and *R.Progreso* Cuba. Likely residual UK rather than Japan because 747 and 774 parallels not observed, and 693 was gone by 1000 UTC. [Conti-NH]
- 1089 **UNITED KINGDOM** *TalkSport* synchros NOV 4 2200 – Fair; promo for Time Out on *TalkSport*. [Conti-NH]
- 1305 **SPAIN** *RNE5* synchros NOV 2 2200 – Fair, over het from off frequency Iran; woman in Spanish continued talking through the top of the hour time pips, parallel 1107 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 1386 **LITHUANIA** *R.Baltic Waves*, *Viesintos* NOV 2 2300 – Fair; *R.Ukraine* interval signal, time pips, *Ukrainske Radio ID*. [Conti-NH]
- 1413 **SPAIN** *RNE5* synchros NOV 4 0400 – Fair; "Radio Nacional de España, servicios informativos." [Conti-NH]
- 1467 **FRANCE** *TWR Roumoules* NOV 2 2200 – Good; program continued through the hour. At 2300, one cycle of *TWR* interval signal and promptly off, now on winter schedule signing off an hour later. [Conti-NH]

*Transatlantic carrier search*: OCT 27 0332-0340 – On the R75 with east/west loop: 531, 576, 612\*, 684\*, 711, 774, 855, 891, 909, 999, 1044, 1098(2), 1107(3), 1125, 1305(2), 1413, 1449, 1611 kHz. Per mwlist, nothing significant in Europe on 1449, but 200 kW from Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, or less likely 400 kW from Iran. OCT 28 0514-0531 – On the NRD-545 with east/west longwire; this time I laboriously punch each of almost all 9/kHz channels minus one in USB. I started downwards from 855, then upwards from there but here put in order: 603, 612, 621, 639, 684\*, 702, 711, 747(2), 774(2), 801(2), 837, 855(2)\*, 864, 882, 891, 936(2), 963, 999, 1017, 1044, 1098, 1107(2), 1125, 1152(2), 1296, 1305(2), 1314, 1413, 1422 kHz. Above 1422, I hit only two anomalies, off-frequency approx. 1467.3 and 1565.13 kHz. Iran on 1467.39 per mwoffsets, but nothing that far below 1566. These could be local receiver birdies; or spurs from U.S. station(s). If matching from one station it would be exactly halfway between them: 1516.215 = very unlikely as nothing there. Does anyone else get carriers on those? Could also be Latin American variants. OCT 29 0302 – Versus high storm noise level, on the R75 with loop: 531, 774(2), 855(2), 891, 1098, 1107, 1116, 1125, 1134, and 1548 kHz at 0309, much stronger than the others but not audible; slight fades unlike something local. Right on 1548.00 to my ear. The only two big sigs on 1548 in Eurasia are *R.Farda*, 600 kW via Kuwait, and *TWR Europe*, 500 kW via Pridnestrovye, but mwlist, WRTH Update and EiBi show both on air only in local evenings, not mornings. Nevertheless possibly one of them testing, and no signal at next check circa 0325 UTC. Another bandscan at 0321: 585, 684\*, 693, 774(2), 837, 855(2), 891, 1008, 1098, 1107, 1305; and something offset below 1494, nothing listed. \*strongest. (2) at least two carriers beating. NOV 2 0640 – Not searched whole band amid s9+20 line noise level but manage to detect a couple, no doubt Spain, 855(2) and 1044 kHz. NOV 3 0710 – JBA on 621 and 711 kHz, surely *RNE Canarias* and neighborly Moroccan from occupied "Spanish West Africa" as in mwlist. Such ending in --1 are actually easier to spot than further splits, since the --0 North American stations provide no splash and quieten the frequency when tuning USB. Same would apply to those in --9 if I ever tuned in LSB. NOV 4 0536 – Picking some likely spots to tune USB 1 kHz below: 531, 684, 711, 774, 855, 999, 1125 – likely Algeria, Spain, Western Sahara. [Hauser-OK]

- 650 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, *Ciego de Avila* OCT 25 0203 – Spanish music, trumpets parallel 640 kHz; fair with WSM. [Yocis-VA]
- 660 **MEXICO** XECSBM/XEEY *Aguascalientes*, *Ag.* OCT 25 0500 – *Grupera* music, top of the hour ID contained the "La Kaliente 102.9" slogan, mentioned XHATF-FM and possibly one other, but the AM call (XECSMB or XEEY) was not heard; and *Grupo Radiofonico ZER* was the announced network. I also saw that the July 2023 *Infraestructura* from IFT lists XECSBM as the primary station and XEEY as an additional station. [Vance-TX]

- 760 **MEXICO** XEABC *R.Cañón*, México, CMDX OCT 26 0400 – Spanish music, ID "...de México XEABC ...Radio Cañón," under WJR but quite clear. New here. [Yocis-VA] NOV 5 0459 – Under WJR; *R.Cañón* ID by a woman, "La Camisa Negra" by Juanes. [Conti-NH]
- 770 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Las Tunas OCT 25 0400 – Cuban national anthem, announcements parallel 1180 kHz; way under WABC. [Yocis-VA]
- 820 **CUBA** *R.Ciudad Habana*, Arroyo Arenas OCT 26 0401 – Out of Cuban national anthem, signature piano interval signal, "Desde Habana Cuba" by man, piano interval signal again. Good with WBAP. [Yocis-VA]
- 890 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Chambas OCT 23 0547 – Woman and man speaking in Spanish with multiple mentions of Havana, over/under WAMG tropical music and WLS news/talk. Very strong at times, parallel stream. [Lupi-NH]
- 910 **CUBA** *R.Metropolitana*, Villa Maria NOV 1 0546 – Tropical music; mixing with WMOG Mississippi. Good signal. [Beu-TX]
- 1030 **MEXICO** XEQR *R.Centro*, México, CMDX NOV 3 0740 – "Radio Centro" ID with musical programming – mainly ballads. Night time power reduced to 1.2 kW according to IRCA Mexican Log. Good signal. [Beu-TX]

- 846 **KIRIBATI** *R.Kiribati*, Kiritimati OCT 23 0446 – Still trying to get *R.Kiribati* via Oahu SDR: nothing visible on waterfall, but SAM tries to lock onto signal plus/minus ~2 Hz. 24h earlier this was displaying a line at 846 but appeared to be boundary of something rather than a genuine signal. Regarding my not hearing carrier from *R.Kiribati* direct, and no more than an uncertain trace sometimes at Oahu SDR: "Here at Asilomar State Beach, have also noted no signal at all recently on 846 kHz. Conditions have been fairly good, as on Oct 22 actually had some rare audio on 1017 kHz, perhaps from Tonga, at 0701 UTC with religious singing; normally I only hear with a carrier." – Ron (California). OCT 26 0508 – Another try into Oahu SDR: nothing audible or visible on the waterfall, but SAM claims to lock on to an 846 varying plus/minus 4 Hz. Could it really be on but very low power? [Hauser-OK] AsiaWaves lists *R.Kiribati* schedule 0000-0130, 0500-1005, 1825-2030, mwlist 0000-0130, **0530-0936** [12456], 1800-2000, and the September 2023 Pacific-Asian Log lists 0000-0130, 0500-0935, 1630-2030. [Conti]



# AM Digital WWFD Concludes Its Test Phase

WWFD in Frederick, Md., has concluded the experimental phase of its MA3 HD Radio operation. It has notified the FCC that after five years, it will now continue to operate as a full-time all-digital AM station as is allowed under commission rules.

The Hubbard-owned facility was the first AM station in the United States to convert to the MA3 mode, doing so under experimental authority in 2018.

Dave Kolesar, the engineer and program director who spearheaded the initiative and has given numerous presentations at engineering conferences about it, tells me that Hubbard recently asked the FCC to conclude the special temporary authority.

"It was my intention all the way back then that this would be permanent, there just wasn't a legal mechanism at the time to do so. The STA had been kept so that we could do research on MA3, which required us to operate at variance with the NRSC-5 mask, for the purposes of furthering the understanding of all-digital operations in the field," Kolesar wrote in an email.

"The end of the STA simply means that WWFD is now operating under the same legal authority that the other stations are using for all-digital operations. We haven't ruled out filing for an STA again if the desire and need to conduct more experiments warrants it."

I asked him for a thumbnail takeaway of these past five years.

"We have learned that all-digital AM broadcasting is much more robust than the hybrid mode of HD AM, and in fact has many advantages over analog broadcasting in terms of sound quality and metadata," he replied.

"Stereo audio, song data, album artwork and even a secondary HD2 channel are all capabilities of MA3 broadcasting. It opens up the possibility of music formats on AM that can be competitive with FM, satellite and streaming services. It makes AM look and sound like every other broadcast service in the dashboard, and that's essential to the future of the band. It even works well in EVs, much better than analog in fact."

To my knowledge there are two other stations airing all-digital AM HD Radio right now. Crawford Broadcasting flipped WYDE in Birmingham, Ala., in September. And Cumulus station WFAS in White Plains, N.Y. went on with all-digital in 2021 and continues to operate in that mode.

Stations that gave it a try earlier but have since turned it off include WIOE in Ft. Wayne, Ind.; WTLC in Indianapolis; WMGG in Egypt Lake, Fla.; and WSRO in Ashland, Mass.

What about future adoption of MA3? Kolesar said it's hard to tell.

"I view MA3 transmissions as the goal that every AM broadcaster has to get to, sooner rather than later. Analog AM listenership is declining, and we need to stop worrying about obsoleting existing analog-only radios, because fewer people are bothering to turn them on."

He thinks stations without a significant audience should try digital now and build up a new audience, with a compelling format, perhaps from scratch.

"Legacy stations with established audiences can convert later, but their day will be coming soon. There's nothing written in stone saying that the AM band has to survive, but if you want to save it, I strongly believe that getting to digital ASAP and pairing it with compelling 'destination' content is the way to go."

He says that when you pair MA3 with a connected car platform such as DTS AutoStage, which tunes stations by flipping through tiles on a screen, you have a powerful solution to the band's woes.

"You simply select a station by its logo and then you hear audio. It doesn't matter if it's FM, streaming, satellite or digital AM. There's another argument for digital: Analog AM stations have no metadata capability, and so those stations will only show up as a number on a screen, and will likely be passed over."

# Stations on the FCC Silent List

By law, the FCC is to cancel licenses of stations that fail to broadcast for 12 consecutive months. Of the 101 stations on the current FCC silent list, 10 stations originally went silent more than 12 months ago. The FCC is generally fairly strict in not granting exceptions to this rule. Two of these 10 stations (KEPS-1270 and KEBE-1400) have apparently come back on the air, but for some reason are still on the FCC list. Presumably the others are somewhere in the process of having their licenses revoked.

- 950 WYWY KY Barbourville – Silent Aug. 1, 2020; on the air Aug. 30, 2021; waiver request to not have license cancelled due to Covid special circumstance is under review.
- 1410 WVCB NC Shallotte – Silent Sept. 15, 2021; transmitter failure.
- 1280 WANS SC Anderson – Silent Mar. 17, 2022; financial reasons.
- 1350 WELB AL Elba – Silent Apr. 15, 2022; loss of transmitter site.
