After a diligent search, Adrian has announced the entire "Indiana Heritage Collection" will be shipped to the Australian Radio DX Club where they will be stored in the government archives in the national capital Canberra.

As most members know, the NRC has an extensive archives of member QSL collections on display on the NRC website (<https://nationalradioclub.org/QSLs/qsls.htm>). Those scanned collections have also been in storage awaiting a permanent home. Adrian has kindly agreed to accept the NRC collections to be added to the ARDXC archives. It is expected that the QSLs will be shipped to Australia early next year.

- 730 CKDM MB Dauphin – 11/24 2203 – Music on top of the channel at good level. Female comes on and mentions “. . . 7-30 CKDM ...”, then back into more music. Relog. (JN-TX)

Hello everyone. It's great to be part of a new DX season. This is my first 'Musings' report to the club in a very long time. I'm a long time DXer' and member of the NRC, and send in 'DX loggings' often, to Editor, Mike Brooker. of the 'East Coast Digest' column. I'm a neighbor of 'Musings Editor,' Linda Brodsky, who lives just a few miles from where I reside.

Yes, I'm a long time DXer. I first began DXing back in the early 1960's, yeah, last century. When me and a neighbor, a long time friend of mine, discovered the hobby at about the same time. We heard distant newscasts, and ballgames listening nightly, on our transistor radios, and were amazed as to what we heard, and the long distances covered. Hearing Pirates baseball, from KDKA, Orioles baseball from WBAL, the 'Jamboree Show' on WWVA, and the "Joe E. Reynolds show' on 'KB radio,' WKBW.

We soon discovered that Sunset, and Sunrise hours were a great time for DX, and especially Monday mornings. And we began to hear other stations from across the country. I then began to pursue the hobby more seriously than my friend did, sending out QSL reports to stations. I remember my very first QSL card was from WBT in November, 1963, and thought that all QSL's might be like the oversized card. I soon received other QSL cards and saw that was not the case. And quite interesting letters too. I eventually obtained a rather sophisticated radio in the late 60's, a 'Laffayette Starfire' 18' xistor radio, and joined my first DX club, the IRCA.. I began hearing other countries, thanks to the DX aids in identifying foreign stations, and was so amazed when I first heard CMCA 730, all the way from Cuba. Then came the Colombians, and the Venezualans. With that radio I heard domestically, KOA 850, KRMG 740,, and one February Monday morning in 1971, I logged both KOMA 1520, and KFI 640. Another great catch was KFAB 1110, in 1970, when for one whole week in October 1970, WBT, was knocked off the air, with transmitter problems. I still have the broadcast, of my QSL report on cassette tape.

I was a member of the IRCA, in the late 60's and early 70's, briefly a member of NASWA, and a present member of the WTFDA, besides the NRC. I have been an owner of both the Superadio II and Superadio III, in the past, as well as an ICF 2010, which was my main DX radio until it suffered a breakdown a few years ago.. Now I use a CCrane SW radio, with a Tescun 100 loop. I'll be in the market for a new radio sometime soon, this winter. 73's, have a great 2023-2024 DX season!

The only MW station in Kiritimati, a.k.a. the ``Christmas`` Island in eastern Kiribati, is of special interest to me. It's far enough east, about the same longitude as Hawaii (tho on the "wrong" side of the Dateline), that it's the first and likely only "TP" signal I will be getting on MW, as a night-owl rather than early riser.

I am likely to get nothing but a just-barely-audible carrier direct, but that's OK as there could hardly be anything else propagating on its nicely split frequency of 846 kHz. I am not counting countries, stations or anything, so it really does not matter whether I can make out a positive ID. Here are my reports about it so far this "season" as in my original, complete, uncondensed log reports at <http://www.worldofradio.com/Hauserlogs.html> ---

846 kHz, Oct 23 at 0446, still trying to get R. Kiribati via Oahu SDR: nothing visible on waterfall, but SynchAM tries to lock onto signal plus/minus ~2 Hz. 24h earlier this was displaying a line at 846 but appeared to be boundary of something rather than a genuine signal.

846 kHz, re my not hearing carrier from R.K iribati direct, and no more than an uncertain trace sometimes at Oahu SDR: "Glenn - Here at Asilomar State Beach, have also noted no signal at all recently on 846 kHz. Conditions have been fairly good, as on Oct 22 (Sunday), actually had some rare audio on 1017 kHz, perhaps from Tonga, at 0701 UT, with religious singing; normally I only hear with a carrier. Ron Howard (California)."

846 kHz, Oct 26 at 0508, another try to detect R. Kiribati into Oahu SDR: nothing audible or visible on the H2Ofall, but SAM claims to lock on to an 846 varying plus/minus 4 Hz. Could it really be on but very QRP?

Bruce Conti, NRC IDXD ed., replies to my obs that 846 carrier is not being heard direct nor at Kaneohe, Oahu, KiwiSDR which used to hear it well: "AsiaWaves lists R. Kiribati schedule 0000-0130, 0500-1005, 1825-2030, mwlist 0000-0130, 0530-0936 [12456], 1800-2000, and the September 2023 Pacific-Asian Log lists 0000-0130, 0500-0935, 1630-2030. [Conti]"

Well, 846 was certainly on air by 0430 if not earlier, last year, and it's not clear if these listings be current. 1440 entry in Asiawaves is dated Jan 2020; and for 846, Oct 2020. Also, same UT sked for 1440 and 846 which are 2 timezones apart?? Is 846 a 100% relay // 1440? PAL explicitly states they are not //; but both off the air 0130-0500. I'll certainly check Oahu later from 0500 or even 0530. If they are not //, why should each reference claim exactly the same timespans for both despite two timezones apart?

Is Oahu or anyone hearing 846 deeper in the night to -0935, -0936 or -1005? Hardly ever any audio. It could also be that the carrier sometimes? stays on during the silent hours. That would not be reported as part of the schedule. It may really be totally off the air. Oahu remote at 0530 Nov 6 shows no 846 on waterfall yet suggests there is an inaudible signal fluxuating between -4.8 and +1.2 Hz. No different at 0600. I suspect that be a drawback of the SDR.

Casually, one may not realize how far East K. is from West K: "The islands extend about 3,900 km (about 2,400 mi) from east to west. From north to south they extend about 2,100 km (about 1,300 mi), straddling the equator. 4,468 mi {statute?} Distance from My Location (Enid, OK) to Kiribati."

846 kHz, Nov 22 at 0748, no signal from R. Kiribati, which I continue to check almost every night after 0700; last season this would be the earliest/only "trans"-Pacific MW carrier audible here. Probably off, but still must overcome local noise level here. Need further checking via Oahu remote.

846 kHz, Nov 23 at 0700, NO signal detected from R. Kiribati at Kaneohe, Oahu SDR which used to pick it up reliably on N/S antenna. And of course no trace direct as I used to often have it last wintrish.

Ron Howard replies Nov 25 to my latest report about R.Kiribati: "Glenn - This past week (Nov 19+) I have also been checking 846, here at Asilomar State Beach, and like you, have had no hint of a carrier (0630+ UT). Is probably off the air or running extremely low power? Ron." GB on 'Calling All Radio Nutzzz' also mentioned us about this not being heard as he also dealt with the other Xmas Island in the Indian Ocean. He pronounced K- and K- as if in English rather than approximating `kuh-ris-mas` and `kir-ee-bahss`.

And as of Dec 2 I am still not detecting even a carrier from it around 07 UT. Until the next, best of DX and 73 de Glenn.

Thought this might be worthy for a mention in *DX News*. My local utility, Jersey Central Power and Light (JCP&L) is installing what they call "Smart Meters" to replace the long standing electric meters. I sent them an email, asking about possible RFI to radio receivers. Got the response, below. (I forgot to ask about ingress from transmitted signals on HF, VHF and UHF, since I'm a ham.)

"The low-power design and intermediate frequencies of the smart meters being installed help reduce the probability of interference with other wireless devices. Based on standards and regulations from the FCC and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the likelihood of interference between the smart meter and other RF devices is extremely low. Electromagnetic shielding has been incorporated into the design of modern pacemakers to prevent RF signals from interfering with the electronic circuitry in the pacemaker.

"According to the manufacturer of our smart meters, 'The transmitting devices operate in compliance with 47 CFR Part 15 regulations, which require coexistence with other Part 15 certified devices. Within the 902-928 MHz frequency band, operation is limited to frequency hopping, direct sequence spread spectrum and digital modulation intentional radiators. This rule facilitates multiple devices operating in the same location. This includes devices such as security systems, cordless phones and pacemakers. The meter's transmit signal is of very short duration, which further decreases the potential to interfere with other devices.'"

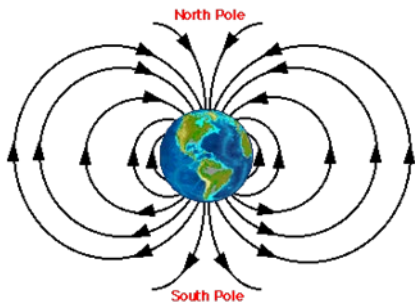
Although I'm no longer considering myself a DXer or even a radio listener, I still enjoy reading DX News. There are still a few club members I've met since I joined the club back around 1956. Thanks to all who keep NRC and DXN going.

Reception here has been so dull that I find myself pining for the "good old days" when the change back to Standard Time brought something new almost every evening. Last night I fed the RSPDx with 2 LNVs phased with the ANC-4 and made some IQ recordings that I haven't had time to listen to carefully. A quick look shows that the 180m ham band came in well, so I'm hoping that at least the top end of the BC band had something new.

I did some more cleaning up of old DX related papers and discovered a small trove of QSLs from the late '70's including some stickers from Radio Jumbo in Roseau, Dominica, a bumper sticker from WNLC 1510 and an aerogram from a female employee of the Australian BC Company in Brisbane responding to a reception report of a shortwave outlet in Papua, New Guinea that I sent in October 1974 but which could not be verified. She noted that they seldom get reception reports from women. Her letter spoke of her upcoming trip to the States and concern about visiting NYC in light of news reports of high crime and racial strife here (she wasn't wrong about that, but being a native NY'er, I was never uncomfortable traveling around the city by subway or on foot.) She described unusually bad weather in Brisbane including severe flooding. I apparently wrote back because she followed up with a note in March 1975 on a foldout card containing many views of Brisbane. In that note she mentioned that color TV was just beginning to take hold there, but that sets were very expensive (about \$1,000 US;) that the cost of living there was going up again; that they had a very hot summer and that the city of Darwin was wiped out by a cyclone. We think things happening around the world now are unique, but reading these letters reminded me that they really are not.

My last find was a photo of Chuck and Polly Hutton dated July 1980. My late friend, and fellow BCB DX'er, Vernon Shearer, who lived in Atlanta, frequently got together with Chuck and Polly. I know that Chuck was editor of the International DX column and very active in NRC at the time. He also wrote several technical articles, including one about phased beverage antennas, which was published in the December 17, 1979 issue of DX News. I believe he moved to Seattle, but have seen his name among our current members. If anyone has his contact information, please share it with me via email so I can send him a copy of the photo. 73 for now.

Radio History Revisted

KOA Denver

KOA (850 kHz) is a commercial AM radio station licensed to Denver, Colorado. Owned by iHeartMedia, it serves the Denver-Boulder media market. KOA is nicknamed "the Blowtorch of the West."

KOA was first owned by General Electric and began broadcasting on December 15, 1924. The station started with 5,000 watts, and in 1927, increased to 12,500 watts. KOA became an NBC affiliate in 1929, and the network took over operation of the station from GE shortly thereafter. On July 7, 1934, power was raised to the current level of 50,000 watts.

In 1941, NBC, which had been operating KOA and KGO in San Francisco for GE since October 1, 1929, also took over ownership of the stations. NBC continued to own KOA until June 1953 when it sold the station to Metropolitan Television Company, whose principal stockholder was Bob Hope; that same year on Christmas Eve, KOA started a sister TV station, KOA-TV on channel 4; like its radio cousin, it was affiliated with the NBC Television Network; it is now CBS-owned KCNC-TV. GE repurchased the station in 1968 and continued to own it until 1983, when it sold KOA to Belo Corporation. In 1987 Jacor Communications purchased the station; The company rebranded to iHeartMedia in 2014.

Radio host Alan Berg broadcast his talk show from the station, but was shot and killed by members of the white supremacist group The Order on June 18, 1984. Another host from an earlier era was Leigh Kamman, who hosted jazz programs during World War II. Kamman returned to his home state of Minnesota after the war. *The Sports Zoo* with Dave Logan and Scott Hastings ran for 12 years until Hastings left in April 2005 for the Altitude Sports and Entertainment network. Hastings resumed sports radio broadcasting on KKFN in January 2006 alongside former Denver Broncos lineman Alfred Williams. Ken Hamblin, "The Black Avengerm" also hosted a popular and long-running show during the 1980s.

Also in the 1980s, during the weekend evening hours on KOA, Larry Cox, and his dog Wilbur, would host the radio program *The National Recovery Act*, a listener-friendly call-in show. A certain topic was announced and people from all over the nation, picking up the KOA signal at night, would call in with their memories. Big band music from the 1930s and 1940s was also played. The program would always end with the song "And So To Bed". In December 1987, Cox began a new radio program, No Place Like Home, broadcast from his home on Chicago Creek. Listeners would often

hear the fireplace crackling and Cox's dog, Wilbur, snoring. In June 2022, longtime co-anchor of 'Colorado's Morning News' April Zesbaugh retired.

Rush Limbaugh had been heard on KOA until 2019, when the show moved to co-owned KDFD (760 AM/93.7 FM). As a result of the changes, KOA began calling itself "The Voice of Colorado". KOA brands itself as "Colorado's News, Talk, and Sports Station". KOA broadcasts a news/talk radio format, and is also the flagship station of the Denver Broncos, Colorado Rockies and Colorado Buffaloes.

Digging Deeper

In my continual search for material on radio station history I was able recently to run across two excellent books that may be of interest to the readers of this series.

The first is *Air Castle of the South, WSM and the Making of Music City* by Craig Havighurst, published by University of Illinois Press.

This is probably the most complete history of one radio station that I have ever read. At 250 pages plus another 26 pages of reference notes, it could seem a bit daunting to the prospective reader. But, rest assured, it is a fascinating book that covers not only WSM, but the related rise of country music, the famous Grand Ole Opry program, the subsequent development of the Opryland amusement park and ultimately the development of Nashville as an important southern city. Not bad for a single station that began as a somewhat small southern outlet and grew to national and international fame.

WSM was started by the National Life and Accident Insurance Company in 1925. It became one of the most influential and exceptional radio stations in the history of broadcasting and country music. The station gave Nashville the nickname "Music City USA" as well as a rich tradition of music, news and broad-based entertainment. With the rise of country music broadcasting and recording between the 1920's and 50's, WSM, Nashville and country music became inseparable, stemming from WSM's launch of the Grand Ole Opry to popular shows like Noontime Neighbors, and early morning artist-driven shows such as Hank Williams on Mother's Best Flour.

While early 50,000 watt, clear channel stations popped up around the country, the majority of them were in the East, Mid-west or far West. WSM joined just a few southern similar stations such as WHAS in Louisville, WSB in Atlanta and WWL in New Orleans.

In addition to the Opry program WSM also broadcast Noontime Neighbors and early morning artist-driven shows such as Hank Williams on Mother's Best Flour.

The book was prompted by a proposal to pull country music and the Opry from WSM in 2002. It goes on to document the station's profound effect on the character and self-image of Nashville and introduces the reader to colorful artists from the station's history, such as Owen Bardley, Minnie Pearl and Dinah Shore.

The other book that took a long time to read was the encyclopedic-style history of radio titled *Stay Tuned, A History of American Broadcasting* by Christopher H. Sterling and John Michael Kittross, published by Lawrence Erlbaum Associates in Mahwah, New Jersey and London, England. One will better understand the term "encyclopedic" when you learn that the book runs to 746 pages PLUS 124 pages of reference material. (That's enough to keep one occupied for a month or two!) My copy is the third edition which was published in 2002 — who knows, maybe a newer version is out with several hundred additional pages!

I must say that while the book may have been prepared for an academic audience, if one is really interested in radio history it is a "must-have" item.

The various sections include technical innovations, the history of the development of individual stations, broadcasting networks, educational broadcasts, broadcast advertising, radio-television programming, the broadcast audience, regulatory trends, and broadcasting and society (including foreign broadcasting).

Some of the individual topics are unexpected and fascinating, i.e.: The Pioneer Stations, The Rise of National Networks, The Split-up of NBC and Formation of ABC, a whole section on radio programming, a survey of the broadcast audience, foreign broadcasting, regulations, and a final section titled "And if There were No Broadcasting?" Another feature is frequent "boxes" and illustrations throughout the text including The beginning of Radio Regulation, Herrold's KQW (The first real station?), Amos and Andy, Baseball on television, Radio Drama at its height, The End of Radio's Daytime Serial, Coverage of the first moon landing, the O.J. Simpson trial, and an enticing topic titled "Here a Dish, There a Dish."

While lengthy, detailed, comprehensive and very heavy to carry (!), I highly recommend it to anyone who really wants to know more about broadcasting history or, for those of my age, want to remember so many things that we experienced over our lifetime.

(Since both of these books were published some time ago, one will more likely find them in a used book store or online at Amazon as opposed to a Barnes & Noble or Books-A-Million.)
