## From the Archives

**90 Years Ago:** From the April 18, 1934 issue of *DX News*: Many stations were heard running DX tests on a recent Saturday morning DX Frolic, sponsored jointly by a number of radio clubs.

**75 Years Ago:** From the April 16, 1949 issue of *DX News*: Daylight savings time begins in some places on April 24; *DX News* will continue to use Eastern Standard Time for all loggings because it's too hard to keep track of which places are and aren't going on daylight time. A full list of stations in Australia and New Zealand was published.

**50 Years Ago:** From the April 22, 1974 issue of *DX News*: Eight new members joined the NRC this issue, including Paul Mount in Teaneck, N.J. Bob Foxworth published what has become a classic NRC reprint, a lengthy discussion of how to DX the "Class IV" (graveyard) channels.

**25 Years Ago:** From the April 19, 1999 issue of *DX News*: Two new X-band stations are now on the air, KNAX-1650 Clovis CA and KTBK-1700 Sherman TX.

**10 Years Ago:** From the April 21, 2014 issue of *DX News*: Yimber Gaviria's DX logs from Santa Marta, Colombia were published, as were the Major League Baseball networks for 2014 – about two-thirds of the flagship stations are the same as in 2024.

## NRC AM Log Updates

**CBS Sports Radio becomes Infinity Sports Radio** – “Audacy’s ‘CBS Sports Radio’ network will rebrand as ‘Infinity Sports Radio’ on Monday, April 15.

“As first reported by Barrett Sports Media, distributor Westwood One informed stations that they must cease using the CBS Sports Radio name in any form on-air, online, social media, and in sales materials no later than April 15. We have confirmed the upcoming change and can add that it is being caused by a clause in the Entercom/CBS Radio merger that was to originally see the ‘CBS Sports Radio’ brand be dropped at the end of 2020.” (**Radio Insight**)

**From Radio Insight:** High Plains Radio Network has filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection in the Northern District of Texas. The company, founded and led by Monte Spearman, is claiming both assets and liabilities worth between \$1 million and \$10 million. Many of its stations have been silent over the past couple of years, with a few having their licenses cancelled in the past two years. The company's 980 KICA Clovis NM and 98.3 KICA-FM Farwell TX were cancelled earlier this month after losing their tower leases at the end of 2022. 92.5 KKRE Hollis OK was cancelled last month after being silent for over a calendar year.

The company filed last July to sell thirteen of their stations in Arkansas and Mississippi to Jay Brentlinger's Broadcast Industry Group for \$3.5 million, but the sale was withdrawn a few weeks later. A similar sale between the parties failed to close in 2020.

High Plains Radio Network currently holds licenses in Arkansas, Colorado, Mississippi, Oklahoma and Texas.

# Unreported Domestic Stations


One station (WTWG-1050) was reported to DDXD this issue for the first time since at least Volume 67 (1999-2000), and another station on our unreported list (KBAI-930) is now defunct. That leaves just 178 currently licensed, full-power AM stations in the United States and Canada that have not been reported yet this century. The full list was last published in Volume 90 Issue 29, although an updated version was included in the first issue of *DXtra News* for those who received it.

## NRC Antenna Pattern Book 8th Edition

The 8th Edition of the NRC *AM Station Antenna Pattern Book* is now available. This all-new edition was prepared by Bill Hale and accompanies the 2018 (39th Edition) of the National Radio Club's *AM Radio Log*. The book comes shrink wrapped in 8½ by 11 three hole punch format for placement in your own three ring binder. The book has maps covering 530 through 1700 kHz showing day and night patterns for U.S., Canadian, and selected Mexican and Caribbean stations.



- KCAX** MO **Branson** – 4/6 0710 – Poor signal with ID, “KCAX AM 1220 Branson Missouri” then song “Power of Love” by Huey Lewis & the News. New. (SC-IN)
- KLPW** MO **Union** – 4/6 0108 – Very weak signal and man with ID, “AM 1220 KLPW dot com.” (SC-IN)

- 1480 **WABF AL Mobile** – 2/16 0007 – Poor, light rock music, promo for Jimbo’s Golden Oldies with mention of WABF1480.com then weather report mentioning WABF. **(MT-FL)**
- 1490 **WMBM FL Miami Beach** – 2/16 0000 – Poor, “Today, tomorrow, and all year long, south Florida’s only 24 hour Doppler station AM 14–90 WMBM” then fades into noise. **(MT-FL)**
- 1500 **WFIF CT Milford** – 3/20 1900 – “Life Changing Radio WFIF” ToH ID into SRN news over usual WLQV/WFED mix. **(MKB-ON)**

## --- NOTES FROM CANADA ---

The CRTC issued Calls for Applications for new radio stations to serve Calgary AB and Yellowknife NT. Although it is generally a foregone conclusion that only FM applications will be received, this time is different for Calgary, as explained in the 910 and 1060 entries below. On the other hand, Yellowknife would not benefit from the extended range of an AM transmitter since CJCD-FM's 400 Watts is more than adequate to cover the Yellowknife area; CFYK-FM is 5500 Watts from a shorter tower than CJCD's.

The Calgary Call for Applications was triggered by an application for a community ethnic FM station by Fraser Media Diversity Inc. As such, the CRTC is most interested in stations that would provide ethnic and/or Indigenous programming but will consider all applications received.

The Yellowknife Call for Applications results from a re-application by Cabin Radio for a 540 Watt FM transmitter to expand the reach of its existing Internet station, which has proven popular with Yellowknife audiences. COVID-19 and wildfires have convinced the CRTC that Yellowknife could support another radio station.



**Bruce Hogel**, CFRN Edmonton's longest serving News Director, has passed away. His father Bill was CFRN-TV's founding News Director and was the first to bring Editorials to Canadian television. Bruce continued the family tradition, writing and reading 15,000 editorials on CFRN AM & TV. Bill died unexpectedly in February 1965 and Bruce was recruited to replace him. In turn, when Bruce retired in 1995, his son Steve became News Director (until 2007). Both Bruce and his wife of 70 years, Gail, passed away in March; Bruce was 95.

In Canada, Broadcasting, Banking and certain other industries are governed by two sets of employment laws, federal and provincial. They are known as federally regulated industries and many of their employees automatically got a raise in pay on April 1st when the Federal Minimum Wage increased from \$16.65 to \$17.30 per hour. Even in provinces like Saskatchewan and Alberta where the provincial minimum wage continues to be \$14 and \$15 per hour, respectively. The minimum wage for employees in federally regulated industries in Canada is the maximum of the federal and provincial minimum wage.

- 600 CFQR QC Montreal** – Montreal's The Suburban newspaper announced that the station is finally moving away from its decade-long preparation for regular programming with the movement and expansion of a local podcast to the station beginning at 1100 on March 12. But the article's real surprise was this: "Phil Richards is the new owner of CFQR AM 600". Either the CRTC has not yet announced its approval of the ownership change, or the station risks losing its license for allowing a new owner to take control before CRTC approval. A little research turned up a mid-January The Suburban article reporting the station purchase agreement was awaiting CRTC approval at that time.
- 680 CFTR ON Toronto** – Again calling themselves "680 NEWS", as they were prior to October 2021. So far, they are the only CITY NEWS station to stop using that slogan.
- 910 CKDQ AB Drumheller** – With the recent approval of their move to FM, 910 kHz becomes available for a 50 KW station in Southern Alberta, including Calgary, where the CRTC has just issued a Call for Applications. CKDQ will sign off its AM transmitter three months after the new FM transmitter goes on the air and completes its Testing Phase.
- 1060 CKMX AB Calgary** – Went off the air forever last June, leaving the frequency open for an AM station application in response to the CRTC's Call for Applications. Like CFCW-840 Camrose, there is a large and potentially profitable rural/agricultural audience that could be served by a 50 kW signal.
- 1550 CBSI-8 QC La Romaine** – The move to FM has been delayed by a lengthy local approval process and construction delays. The CRTC has given the CBC a new deadline of April 8, 2025 to make the move.

**--- U.S. STATION NEWS ---**

- 790 WSNF GA Brunswick:** "A proposed \$16,200 forfeiture has been proposed against Southern Media Interactive's 790 WSNF Brunswick, Georgia for multiple violations as well as the cancellation of its translator 103.7 W279BC Brunswick. WSNF's violations included discontinued operation from 9/1/2022 and 1/1/2023 and at various times in 2023, but didn't file a Silent STA until October 31, 2022 and never did in 2023. The station also continued to broadcast from facilities specified in an engineering STA after it expired and would not file for a new STA until a few months later. Additionally, the commission finds that there was an unauthorized transfer of control to Shanks Broadcasting on September 1, 2022 when WSNF, 1400 WSEG Savannah and 1350 WFNS Blackshear began simulcasting Shanks' "Sports Superstations" network based at 1150 WXKO Fort Valley/Macon. Southern Media Interactive did not comply with the FCC's two letters of inquiry as it failed to provide information including the agreements with Shanks, station logs, EAS logs, and utility bills to show compliance with FCC rules. The FCC notes that the translator had been operating from an unauthorized location for more than a year deeming its license cancelled. W279BC's tower was dismantled on January 4, 2023 with an FCC field agent noting in April that the translator was operating from a tower 3 miles north without any authorization. As the translator had not operated from its licensed site in over 365 days its license was considered expired on January 4, 2024." -- **from radioINSIGHT** --
- 930 KBAI WA Bellingham** – Saga Communications has requested the cancellation of the license of KBAI. The station's Classic Hits "98.9 K-BAY" format will continue on 98.9

K255DC and 92.9 KISM-HD3 Bellingham. The station had flipped from Liberal Talk to Classic Hits in August 2017. KBAI operated with 1 kW day and 500 Watts night from a two tower array just north of Bellingham. Originally licensed to Bellingham-Ferndale, the station originally signed on in 1958 as KENY. It was best known for its 30+ year run at KBFW from 1968 until 1999 most of which featured Country music programming. -- **from radioINSIGHT** --

1050 WJSB

FL Crestview – 3/31 1430 – While they’ve seemingly got the 104.7 MHz FM restored to their 100 kW, or maybe 25 kW, the AM is surely not at full 3100 watts; surprised if



they’re even at 1000 watts with such a spotty signal only 20-ish miles north of me. Their W266DF Crestview translator (seemingly silent for at least a couple weeks check) is instead simulcasting WAAZ-FM 104.7 MHz, similar Country format, and even the WAAZ top of hour ID includes the translator. WAAZ-FM and WJSB are not simulcasting but separate C&W formats, though top-of-hour CBS News and a quick recorded local weather forecast are all in sync until dumping back to separate programming. And thus technically, the translator at 101.1 is an FCC violation being that it’s simulcasting WAAZ-FM

instead of licensed for WJSB. And the 101.1 translator at 250 Watts is pointlessly airing the same programming as the 104.7 100 kW translator covers. But wait! The morning of **April 5, the translator is simulcasting WJSB! (TK-FL)**

1400 (WFDM)FL

Fort Walton Beach – Per the FCC dB, this long-inactive Omni Broadcasting cheater (previously claiming WFDM to be on the air) had the **license canceled** on March 28, 2024. Meanwhile, they blatantly continue to **illegally** keep the W232CF 94.3 MHz translator on the air with the all-talk “The Sound of Freedom 94.3” slogan. Meanwhile, their “The Ticket Sports Network” Fort Walton Beach (W259AN 103.7 and Pensacola 97.1 W246BN) also continues. Those are allegedly simulcasting WTKE, Milton which I haven’t heard in ages from here and suspect is also long silent. That would make three translators operating illegally if so. The Omni website still proudly lists 94.3 (with no reference to 1400 kHz). Canned ID top of each hour now does omit the 1400 WFDM reference, and is now “100 point 3 WTKE HD3 Niceville, W232CF Sienna-Fort Walton Beach “Freedom 94 point 3.” (100.3 is WTKE-FM “K-Rock” Ft. Walton Beach, despite licensed to Niceville). As for the “Sienna” in the ID? There’s no such location in this area, an imaginary city created by Omni. **(TK-FL)**

- 580 KJMJ LA Alexandria – 02/07 2200 – Fair, with several mentions of ‘Radio Maria’, then TOH ID with many call signs lasting for more than a minute. (MT-TN)
- 580 WELO MS Tupelo – 02/08 2102 – Very Poor, sounding like they’re playing music into TOH ID coming up stronger – “The Pulse, WELO Tupelo 580 AM and 104.3 FM, W282AS Tupelo Mississippi”, then fading back into the abyss. (MT-AL)
- 630 WLAP KY Lexington – 3/15 2205- 2208 – Fair-to-Good in CFCO null, with University of Kentucky basketball talk. (NB-WI)
- 630 KYFI MO St. Louis – 02/07 2200 – Fair, with choir music, then TOH ID: “Non commercial listener supported radio KYFI Saint Louis”, then ‘Christian Classics’. (MT-TN)
- 640 WBIN GA Atlanta – 02/08 2100 – Fair, with TOH ID jumping above a Spanish Language music station, then BIN news. (MT-AL)
- 640 WMFN IL Peotone – 3/21 2008-2009 – Good, with Chicago news, mentioning Black Information Network. (NB-WI)
- 660 CFRR AB Calgary – 3/20 0800 – Fair, with “6 in Calgary. City News. Yesterday was the 1st day of spring. Winter is here!”. (JJR-MI)
- 680 KNBR CA San Francisco – 3/15 0800 – “KNBR and KNBR FM San Francisco” into CBS Sports Radio. Fair! Alone!! (JJR-MI)
- 680 WCTT KY Corbin – 04/01 2015-2100 – Mellow oldies by Dean Martin, Louis Armstrong, others. Fair-to-Good. 830 watts at 388 miles. (LTH-IL)
- 680 WMFS TN Memphis – 02/08 2100 – Poor, with Memphis Grizzlies halftime show periodically trading places with a Country station. TOH ID coming at six after the hour. (MT-AL)
- 690 WJOX AL Birmingham – 3/30 0740 – Poor, but alone, with ‘Fox Sports Saturday’, “. . . from the Tire Rack studios . . ., etc”. “Alabama” mentioned in PSA. (JJR-WI)
- 690 WQNO LA New Orleans – 3/15 2257-2259 – Fair-to-Poor with promo for an EWTN program. **New.** (NB-WI)
- 700 CJLI AB Calgary – 3/17 0758 – Very poor, but in for about seven minutes under WLW, with Christian music and “The Light” slogan. Only third time heard. (JJR-MI)
- 710 WOR NY New York – 02/07 2201 – A few iHeart promos with the TOH ID. Poor, competing with multiple stations. (MT-TN)
- 720 WGST GA Hogansville – 03/27 2059 – Noted a couple of talk stations, one was WGN of course, the other had a commercial for ‘Goodwill’, then at 2100 I was rewarded with male giving ID as “WGST Hogansville, available everywhere with the I-heart radio app, 720 The Voice, an I-Heart Radio Station”, then into Bloomberg financial news. Fair over WGN. **New, for Georgia #24.** (JN-TX)
- 740 WMSP AL Montgomery – 02/08 2100 – Multiple stations fighting when a TOH ID in the noise: “Sports Radio 740 WMSP Montgomery”. Poor. (MT-AL)
- 740 KRMG OK Tulsa – 02/07 2159 – Fair, with TOH ID, then promo for ‘KRMG Morning News’ into local news. (MT-TN)
- 750 KAMA TX El Paso – 03/31 0800 – Noted with regional Mexican music, followed by female with ID in Spanish as: “Esta escuchando K-A-M-A AM, KAMA, Siete-Cincuenta AM en El Paso”. Good signal, back into more music. A relog. Was silent, but is back on the air now. Noted website given much later as “kama750am.com”. (JN-TX)
- 770 KATL MT Miles City – 3/15 0750 – Phone number “406-951-38XX serving Montana, South Dakota and North Dakota”. ‘Billings’ mentions and Farm news. GOOD! and LOUD! (JJR-MI)



- 770 KKOB NM Albuquerque – 3/27 0816 – Long enthusiastic chat about the upcoming Albuquerque Isotopes opening day and some new concession items, including the El Fuego Burger, Pig Candy, and The Dentist’s Delight. The Isotopes are my favorite Minor League team name, followed closely by the Amarillo Sod Poodles and the Lansing Lugnuts. (JW-CO)
- 770 WABC NY New York – 02/07 2200 – TOH ID, then local news. Poor. (MT-TN)

- 830 WMMI MI Shepherd – 3/20 0757 – Very poor, but “You’ve waited for a station like this for years! Buck 92” heard, in WCCO null. (JJR-MI)
- 850 WXJC AL Birmingham – 02/08 2100 – Good, with preacher guy talking about how God is never wrong, then TOH ID, then ‘Through the Bible’. (MT-AL)
- 850 WQRM MN Duluth – 4/1 2044-2050 – Very good, with religious program, ‘Love Worth Finding’. (NB-WI)
- 870 KFLD WA Pasco – 3/11 0608-0620 – Syndicated Talk with a two-minute local break beginning at 0618. Lots of call letter mentions and at least two included AM and FM translator frequencies. Also used “News Talk” as an ID. (JP-AB)
- 870 CKIR BC Invermere – 3/11 0608-0623 – At times, their strongest signal ever with no slop (Adjacent Channel Interference) from local CHQT-880 with antenna SSW in a slow (about 9 minutes) fade cycle between them and KFLD. Despite the signal strength, both stations were probably on their 250 Watt non-directional night power. CKIR was initially immediately recognizable playing ‘Rise Up’ (1983) by The Parachute Club, which never charted in the U.S. but was a hit in Canada that is frequently played here as an Adult Contemporary Oldie. - 940 KTFS TX Texarkana – 02/07 2300 – Poor, with an PSA for ‘Neighbors in Need’, then TOH ID followed by 45 seconds of dead air before ‘SportsCenter’. (MT-TN)
- 960 KROF LA Abbeville – 02/07 2300 – Poor, with New Orleans Pelicans vs. LA Clippers game. Assumed, based on affiliate list. (MT-TN)

- 960 CFAC AB Calgary – 03/19 0159 – Male with commercial for ‘Metals Supermarket’ followed by ID as “This is CFAC, Sports Bet 9-60 The Fan broadcasting from the Doug Lacey . . . system studio in downtown Calgary, this is Rogers Sports media radio station”. Owning the channel at this time. Relog. (JN-TX)
- 970 KKRK ID Rupert – 3/14 0228 – Strong and dominant, with Adult Contemporary Oldies and “100.5” splitter in a huge Idaho DX opening that included strong signal from 125 Watt KYWN-890 Meridian ID. **NEW! (JP-AB)**
- 970 WGTK KY Louisville – 02/07 2303 – Fair, with Louisville basketball postgame show, that cut abruptly to TOH ID into commercials. (MT-TN)
- 970 KQAQ MN Austin – 3/17 0845 – Poor, with EWTN vs WDAY. Not all that common due to others. WZAM nowhere. (JJR-MI)
- 980 KFWB CA Los Angeles – 03/19 0500 – Tuned to 980 when I noticed a strong Spanish talk commercial between female and male. I was rewarded with call letters and “980 La Mera Mera”, and back into more music. Noted KMIN earlier in the evening, with a big signal for about three minutes, then dipped into the jumble. **New, for California #17.** (JN-TX)
- 980 KMIN NM Grants – 03/19 2100 – Noted with Garth Brooks song, then male with ID as “K-Min Country”. Good signal, owning the channel at this time. Relog. (JN-TX)

- 1010 WPCN WI Stevens Point – 3/21 0807 – Poor, with Legal ID for AM and their FM translator after Weather Channel forecast. (so proud to log this (as ‘Top40 WSPT’) in 1968 as DX! And still DX’ing decades later.) (JJR-MI)
- 1010 CBR BC Calgary -3/17 2335 – Very strong, with the CBC program ‘Reclaimed Music’. ID at top of the hour, then weather for Calgary and Banff, (high of 15 C), into ID. (RWL-MN)
- 1020 KCKN NM Roswell – 3/16 2301 – ToH ID given in Spanish with Mexican Choir accompanying the announcer, then repeated in English as “1330 AM WWRV New York, 1020 KCKN Roswell New Mexico, 1440 WWCL Fort Meyers, Florida, 1580 WVZN Columbia, Pennsylvania, 96.5 FM Columbia, Pennsylvania, proclaiming Jesus Christ is Lord”. Then repeated the same Spanish choir music. (RWL-MN)
- 1020 KDKA PA Pittsburgh – 3/16 2318 – Beginning of Old Time Radio program ‘Sam Spade’ starring Howard Duff, sponsored by ‘Wildroot Hair Dye’. Confirmed via their website content. (RWL-MN)

- 1050 WFAM GA Augusta – 3/24 0815 – Frequent “WFAM Augusta” drops between commercials and program promos. (TK-FL)
- 1050 WMNZ GA Montezuma – 3/21 2026 – Surfaced briefly with tail end of C&W song, “. . . I’m Johnny Powers (?) on WMNZ.” A mere 250/41 Watter. (TK-FL)

Greetings all and belated Happy St. Patrick’s Day. There’s been some great DX this season. Kudos to the group that keep it exciting by team-DXing the weekly Frequency Challenge on a Slack channel. While my after-the-fact recording-based listening doesn’t offer much contribution, the channel is a great source of tips.

Here in the shack I was lucky to find a deal on a second-hand Lenovo computer, a heavy beast that strains the definition of “laptop.” The size doesn’t matter as it just sits there, and it has many USB-C ports which does matter. It’s running two SDRs and a Total Recorder session with no issues.

On the DX front, 1170-WWVA-WV missed their network handoff for another Saturday evening on 2/3, leaving just alternating 3 seconds of OC, 3 seconds of tone, and the tone is easily notched. Nothing new this time – just the usual WAVS-FL. On 2/18, 1110-WBT-NC was on OC for several hours leaving KFAB underneath.

Very strange atmospheric event on 2/22 evening. From about 2225z – 2300z domestic skywave just vanished. The waterfall display was fascinating, with the locals staying strong, but the frequencies in between dropping dramatically, some to nothing at all. But the weirdest part was that trans-Atlantic signals remained steady. Audio remained on 999, 1089, 1179, 1467 and others. On 1179, Romania was clear with 1180-WHAM-NY completely gone. Not sure what happened, and nobody else saw similar effects. Just another example of what makes this hobby so interesting.

Great western opening on 2/24-25 – I’m calling it “Bruce Portzer Night” given his reception of Delaware from Seattle that night. Both 1630-KFBU-WY and 1510-KPLS-CO made it here. I’m still reviewing recordings from this night hoping for some other gems.

In the woodland antenna farm, high winds separated a splice in my south Beverage feedline, then a few weeks later winds brought down my west-pointed superloop. Both easily repaired. Any antenna repair that doesn’t require donning chest waders and getting into the swamp is a win. Very excited to do some changes to the feedlines this spring/summer. Received a couple sets of transformers from Bill Nollman to allow me to switch feedlines from coax to twisted pair. Am hoping to get all 3 antennas as quiet as my NE superloop that is using twisted pair and Bill’s boxes.

All times and dates strictly UT!

900, March 29 at 0721, just as I tune across, English ID as WKDA, and 98.3. This is Lebanon, TN, U1 5000/136 watts in NRC AM Log, but shows FMs on 101.9 and 98.9, NOS/C&W format. Radiolocador.com shows Spanish! Radio Luz, also on 101.9. WTFDA FM DB does not show WKDA relayed by anything, but there is a 98.3 in Lebanon: W252DU relaying WCOR-1490, 100 watts, 87m, format Country, slogan FM 98.9 Real Country, //WANT 98.9. What a confusing situation.

980, March 22 at 0300, Spanish mentioning an iglesia in Pasadena, Tejas. Surely KQUE, U4 5/4 kW, R. Aleluya, Rosenberg- Richmond TX. Dominant signal now without even trying. Night pattern has a notch due N but a lobe NW, so we are in between NNW. Day pattern very similar.

1120, March 19 at 2227, I notice on the DX-398 that KETU Catoosa/Tulsa is back on air after absence a few days, partial ID in passing in Spanish as "La Diferente." 1120 kHz, March 19 at 2351, KMOX in English dominating; as in previous report, KETU Catoosa/Tulsa in Spanish was back on air less than a sesquihour earlier at 2227 check. FCC shows official March SS/SR times for KETU are 0030/1230 UT, so should be on until 0030, but with Critical Hours power reduced from 10 to 7 kW starting at 2230. April: 0100/1145. Real sunset March 20 at Enid: 0043; Vernal Equinox was at 0307 March 20.

1670 kHz, Sunday March 24, at 0152, with a K-index of 5.67, I am hoping for some auroral conditions enhancing southsigs; but routine MW bandscan hits 1 kHz tone restarting every 11.5 seconds, in between, "This is the Brewers Radio Network." Got to be WOZN Madison WI, sports format, and reported last August to have been really carrying Milwaukee Brewers baseball. But their first silly ballgame this season is not until March 28 v Mets - no wonder there is nothing to broadcast tonight! Why not "spring training"? <https://www.mlb.com/brewers/schedule/2024/fullseason> This also loops roughly NE/SW on the altazimuth wrist-mounted D-808. At 0237 I check the stream, but we are deprived of tones, rather an adstring. Claiming to be on air now is sportstalk show of Jody McDonald starting at 9 pm CDT Sats: <https://www.madcitysportszone.com/> 0239 back to "Jody Mac" from CBS Sportsradio - Jody with a really annoying voice sounds like a male person, but you never know. 0242 I check 1670 direct and it's still the tones & Brewers. This might have been helpful for DXers afar, even if they could not copy the keyword Brewers, nor could I at first. Maybe CBS SR is on their FM 96.7 only. Obviously no one in charge of WOZN knows or cares what they are mistransmitting on 1670, plugged into satellite downlink? Or web.

WOZN is our normally dominant 1670 here anyway. But at 0155 I counted a SAH of 88/minute = 1.47 Hz; what could that be? There are only a few other 1670s in N America. Probably WMGE in Georgia, which was 2 Hz away, but mwoffset measurements were 25 months apart and each also has a variable range. I have a hard time getting XEFCR in Reynosa, but well-known for being much further off, 1670.047 as of 2024-03-14.

Here is Major League Baseball (MLB) flagship information for the 2024 season from my Internet searches. Some of the team web sites did not list the names of the announcers, and frequently when they did, the biographies mentioned information such as "For the 17th season ...", which does not tell me if the bio page has been updated for the current season. I do not save the bio pages from each season. I am assuming that, if the announcer bio page is linked in the web site menu, then it is current; there is no need to update the bio if the announcers have not changed. And sometimes I cannot determine if an announcer is on radio only, TV only, or both. On the mlb.com site for many teams, the announcers are listed under the "Roster" tab.

Any copyright statement on an mlb.com page is probably placed there automatically, even if the page content has not changed for the current season.

Please send me announcer information (and corrections),

If a network list web page has a different URL than last year and is linked in the site menu, I treated the list as current for the 2024 season; I did not compare the list with last year's list.

has broadcaster information, and that web site has been updated for the 2024 season (last modified on 30 March 2024, at 21:09 (UTC)). But some of the references date back to 2010.

In some cases I was not sure that the network list was for the 2024 season, as many lists were undated. If a list differed from the list I downloaded last year, I treated the list as new for this season, but the list to which I was comparing already had duplicates removed. Some lists have the same station listed two or three times, each with a different city (and maybe a different state).

In the past, the "contact" form on each web page went to the individual team, but this year it goes to the League. I asked about the Chicago Cubs' list, as it seems to be the same as last year. The response from the League was to contact the Cubs directly. I did, and I was told that the League handles the radio network web page. The Cubs' respondent said that she thought that the list was current for 2024.

Note that if a station streams its broadcasts over the Internet, that the station cannot stream the baseball broadcasts because the Major League Baseball organization wants listeners to get a paid subscription via mlb.com.

Some of the stations are actually translators, and I might not list the stations' official six-character call letters. The Twins' list has "FM signal" instead of the six-character call letters; I had to use radiocator.com to get the six-character translator call letters. I assume that David Yocis will convert any call letters that I do not have correct.

I did not find the 2024 network list for the Arizona Diamondbacks (the list is unlinked and the same as 2022) and the Philadelphia Phillies (unlinked and same as 2023).

And I am not sure that I have all of the Spanish-language broadcasts listed.
