## From the Archives

**90 Years Ago:** From the June 1, 1934 issue of *DX News*: Instructions for making a "Filtered Aerial" from Aileen Jobs and Joe Stokes include an 8-inch long paper mailing tube, with a 2-prong electrical plug on one end, and a wire connection to the receiver at the other. (I can't imagine this would work very well, but antenna technology has sure changed since 1934! – DY)

**75 Years Ago:** From the May 21, 1949 issue of *DX News*: According to press reports, a West Virginia radio shop operator named Jimmy Costo

has invented a radio dial with a map of the United States with lights that will indicate the location of the station broadcasting, without having to wait for a verification. (Something tells me this didn't work very well either. – DY)

**50 Years Ago:** From the May 27, 1974 issue of *DX News*: Bill Bailey in Holden, MA logged Fort Lamy, Chad on 1169 kHz, with a political speech in French // 4904.5 SW, at 0018 UTC, well past their normal sign-off time. Glenn Hauser published his "Mexiglenn" list of Mexican stations.

**25 Years Ago:** From the June 14, 1999 issue of *DX News*: Mark Connelly published detailed information on constructing and using the BBL-1 Broadband Loop Antenna. (Probably works a whole lot better than the "Filtered Aerial." – DY)

**10 Years Ago:** From the June 9, 2014 issue of *DX News*: "K9FM," a new radio station designed for dogs, is going on the air in Auckland. The idea is to lower stress levels for dogs left home alone during the day.

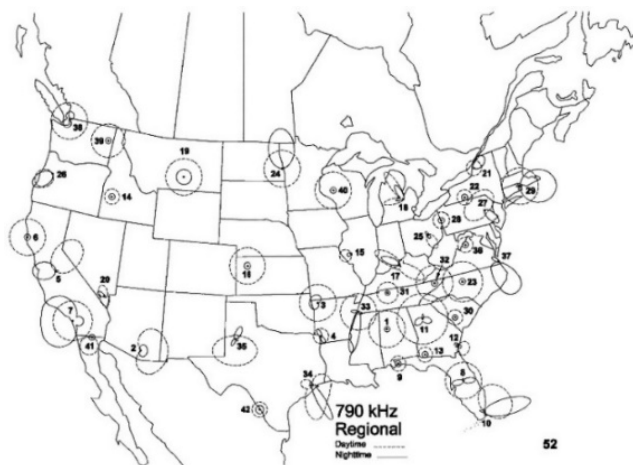

- 530 CHLO ON **Brampton** - Incorrectly stated last issue as Canada's only HD on AM station. A recent check with an SDR of CKZW-1650 Montreal QC indicates that they are still HD (Mauno Ritola). Both stations run hybrid HD (IBOC). CHLO owner Evanov previously announced HD plans for CFMB-1280 Montreal QC but a recent check with an HD receiver indicates that they are not yet running HD.
- 560 CFOS ON **Owen Sound** - The decision on the station's move to FM has been delayed by the station's failure to notify an existing low power FM station whose signal could be impacted by CFOS moving to 89.3 MHz. The CRTC will now not begin consideration of the CFOS Application until after May 13th, the new deadline for CFOS to respond to any new interventions received by the CRTC.
- 590 CJCW NB **Sussex** - Up and running on FM but the clock does not start counting down on the three months of required simulcasting until CJCW-FM completes its Test phase.
- 1340 CINL BC **Ashcroft** - This 1 kW rebroadcaster of CHNL-610 Kamloops BC is now off the air, with a CRTC application expected soon to remove CINL from the CHNL license. Management cited "technical inefficiencies" as the reason, with more details coming in the CRTC application. CINL first signed on after relocating the original CHNL transmitter.
- 1440 CKJR AB **Wetaskiwin** - The 2000-2300 time period on weekdays is now Sports, completing the station's 24/7 Sports schedule in an unexpected way. The South East Asian music/talk format that had been in this time slot for decades was provided through a long term contract with what is now The Universal Radio Network (TURN) and was CKJR's main source of income prior to moving to Sports programming. TURN has just changed their format to Sports, expanding coverage on Sports 1440 to include games and teams outside North America, especially those of interest to the South East Asian population of Edmonton, such a Cricket matches. The host is Navin Ramharak.
- 1710 CHIM ON **Timmins** - Was not on the air last November during a band scan in Timmins (sowny.net member known only by user name) but has been heard by DXer (another sowny.net member known only by user name) in the past at distances not possible with the legal limit of 100 milli-Watts for unlicensed AM transmitters. Still listed on <https://www.chimfm.com> but most of that website has not been updated in years.

--- U.S. STATION NEWS ---Thanks to 

- **1410 WZBR Dedham/Boston** and translator 98.1 W251CR Medford MA were cancelled as both were silent or operating with unauthorized facilities for more than a year. WZBR went silent on March 5, 2023 following the death of owner Alex Langer. The station filed a resumption of operation with the FCC noting that it was operating with 10 watts from a different location and then filed an STA to operate with those facilities a week later. WZBR then filed to go silent again on April 2.
- The license of **1490 KSYC Yreka CA** was cancelled after failing to respond to an FCC inquiry into its operational status. The commission noted that KSYC has been silent since at least July 19, 2022.
- The FCC has cancelled 1390 KHOB Hobbs NM with the station recorded as silent since June 28, 2022. The licensee failed to respond to the FCC'd operational inquiry in February.
- The FCC has cancelled the licenses of Regional Mexican "La Indiscreta" **1540 KASA and 106.7 K294CW Phoenix AZ**. Following an FCC letter of inquiry to the station in February, KASA filed three STA applications and responded to the LOI acknowledging some violations but arguing they could be resolved by the FCC granting their STA requests and a waiver. KASA sold the majority of its tower land in 2019 and filed an STA to operate at reduced power, which was reapplied for until the authorization expired in December 2022. In its last request to the FCC following the LOI, KASA claims it continued to operate under the STA facilities except from February 19 to April 17 of this year when it had an equipment failure but that the translator did continue to broadcast as it was "consistent with the Commission's efforts to revitalize AM stations by allowing them to obtain cross-service FM translators." KASA and is now seeking to rebroadcast 1280 KXEG Phoenix.

- 770 KATL MT Miles City - 4/30 0611 - Playing 'Save Me' by Jelly Roll. Calls. Fair! Loud! No WABC today. (JJR-MI)
- 880 WMEQ WI Menomonie - 5/10 0646 - Ad for 'PeoplesStateBank.com' in Menomonie. NO CALLS into 'America in the Morning.' (JJR-MI)
- 900 WDLS WI Wisconsin Dells - 4/28 0724 - Poor, with "97-3 RDB" playing Rocky Burnette's 'Tired of Town' the Line.' (Wrong feed! Co-Owned WRDB feed vs correct WBOO 102.9 feed. Oops!) They have six to seven stations in the Baraboo-Reedville-Wisconsin Dells area, but no mention of 900 WDLS, of course. I'm sure the guy on duty making \$7 an hour running six stations can, and will, flub up. Might be why I heard Hugh Masekela yesterday. Hardly sounds AC vs OLDies. They'll catch it in a month or so . . . (JJR-WI)

- 980 WPRE WI **Prairie du Chien** – 4/30 0806 – With “. . . that’s your WPRE Forecast” followed by the temperature and river levels! Poor – alone. Super rare! (JJR-MI)
- 990 KAYL IA **Storm Lake** – 4/30 0804 – “???? Juan” into next SS song. Very Poor, but no CBW. (JJR-MI)
- 990 WDEO MI **Ypsilanti** – 4/30 0730 – Very poor, mentioning two 734 area code numbers. Newscast. No CBW. (JJR-MI)
- 1050 KTBL NM **Los Ranchos de Albuquerque** – 4/25 0745 – Chatting about fast-food restaurants, eventually getting back to AC music at 0753; AM/FM legal ID and “The Pit” slogan at 0800:40. Good signal. (JW-CO)
- 1060 KNLV NE **Ord** – 4/30 0802 – Very Poor, with ‘Changes’ by David Bowie into Legal ID. Lost as quickly. (JJR-MI)
- 1060 KGFX SD **Pierre** – 4/30 0800 – Legal ID for AM and their FM translator in Fort Pierre. ABC News. Replaced KFIL. Poor. (JJR-MI)
- 1090 KNWS IA **Waterloo** – 5/1 0645 – Poor, with Sign-On . . . “KNWS returning to the air” . . . replacing WBAL. (JJR-MI)

- 1260 KMZT CA **Beverly Hills** – 4/25 0848 – Classical piano music, “K-Mozart” slogans; legal ID at 0902 for the AM and two FMs. Fair, with KTRC partially nulled. (JW-CO)

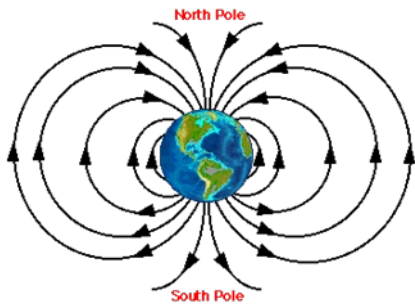

### INTERNATIONAL NEWS

**ARGENTINA:** 1030 LS10 *Radio del Plata* is operating at reduced power. A group of copper thieves caused serious damage to the driving lines of the transmitter-antenna signal, attempting to extract from the ground the existing copper cables in the place. Unable to fully achieve their task, the action of these vandals resulted in the total cut of the transmitter's air signal. At present, *Radio del Plata* is unable to use its AM transmitter of 100 kW power, connected to its 210 meters tall mast. For this reason, the Plant Chief decided a transitional solution to ensure continuity but the emergency system could only operate at 5 kW. [Argentina en AM y FM, MWC Medium Wave News]

**BRAZIL:** 1290 ZYH888 *R.Timbira*, São Luis, is definitely out of AM. Migrated to FM 95.5. [tudoradio, ARC mv-eko] This was once widely received due to a significant offset frequency.

**LITHUANIA:** *Radio Signal*, the new station broadcasting from Lithuania on **666 kHz** as reported by Mauno Ritola was observed April 19 at 0710 UTC, signing off every news report with their website URL radiosignal.news. The website includes a live audio stream and this statement: "Radio Signal is an information radio station. The most important topics of the day from the life of Belarus, comments from first persons, news from the union states, news from Europe and the world, chronicles of incidents, useful secrets, incredible facts, news from the world of stars, culture, information about holidays and historical events in Belarus and abroad. We talk about all this in an interesting and easy way! Radio Signal - details about the important things!" [David Kernick, Interval Signals Online]

**MEXICO:** 1270 XEGL Navojoa went off the air as a consequence of unknown persons having vandalized its installations and stolen high tension electrical wires. According to a statement published on the XEGL Facebook page, the theft of the cables and wires was perpetrated by persons with a knowledge of electricity and radio transmitters. XEGL had served the Mayo Valley for over 80 years, receiving its broadcasting licence on 11 June 1941, just months after the station went on the air in November 1940. [Guillermo Frescas, *El Sol de Hermosillo*, via Steve Whitt, MWC]

**VENEZUELA:** April 26, the National Telecommunications Commission (Conatel) closed the *Minuto* 106.1 FM radio station in Barquisimeto. The National Union of Press Workers reported that the station requested to renew the concession to Conatel without receiving a response. It can be assumed that even the medium wave station YVXM on **790 kHz** will be closed? [*El Nacional* via Cadena DX, ARC mv-eko]

My bi- or tri-national auroral monitoring reinforces my feeling that strictly separating "domestic" from "international" MW DX is counterproductive; this is not done in any other form of DXing such as FM/TV, or SW - it's just a tradition to divide up the workload among different MW editors - and to discourage DXers from crossing the line - even imposing different timezone requirements! I am here making no attempt to separate domestic from international, and it makes a lot more sense to leave them together.

Times and dates strictly UT: [*With Glenn's permission, logs found in IDXD this issue deleted - DY*]

MEXICO [and non]. During auroral conditions, bandscanning on caradio for anything unusual such as Spanish; reference IRCA 2023-24 Mexican Log:

750, May 11 at 0220, NO signal from WSB! Blacked out, or off? Easterly not northerly.

780, May 11 at 0224, WBBM is JBA

830, May 11 at 0225, no signal from WCCO

840, May 11 at 0226, Meximx rather than WHAS. Three XEs listed, but more likely KVJY Pharr TX in the RGV, SS:REL format

850, May 11 at 0226, no KOA

860, May 11 at 0227, romantic music in Spanish: probably XENL 5/1.5 kW Monterrey, only one with a partially ROM format.

880, May 11 at 0227, something about basura - waste. Only XE- is -CHEP in Chihuahua2. More likely just KJOZ Conroe TX

890, May 11 at 0227, no WLS

1030, May 11 at 0229, Mexican election ads, so not Corpus Christi; of 5 XEs, most likely XEQR, 44/1.2 kW, CDMX

1200, May 11 at 0651, no WOAI. Was sometimes audible, sometimes not. Would expect it to be enhanced rather than blocked by aurora.

1290, May 11 at 0234, religious talk in Spanish. Neither of two Xes with that format, rather very likely per NRC AM Log: KRGE, 5/5 kW, Radio Vida, Weslaco TX in the RGV.

1330, May 11 at 0242, political ad in gringo-Spanish for election later in May, presumably TX primary runoff May 28, but not caught name; and into C&W music. Of the 5 TX, two are C&W: KSWA Graham, 500/51 watts; and KCKM Monahans, 12/1 kW. Graham is S of Wichita Falls, WNW of Fort Worth. Monahans in SW TX near NM SE corner. {"Hi Glenn. KSWA (and co-owned KROO-1430) reportedly had their licenses canceled sometime around August 2023. 73 Tim Hall" - tnx, so by elimination that leaves only KCKM, not an unusual catch here anyway}

1340, May 11 at 0243, KGHM Midwest/OKC dominates instead of buried by graveyard QRM. Also many highband regional channels have only weak signals, so many of them blacked out.

1460, May 11 at 0238, Spanish music. KZUE El Reno OK should be off, daytimer. Several SS elsewhere in US, no good fits, as in TX, KBZO Lubbock is sports. KTKC Springhill LA is SS:REL. Only XEs are in Chih,Son.

1500, May 11 at 0238, no KSTP but Spanish. Likely XEDF CDMX 50/50? kW

We never could see aurora here in Enid OK, despite several tries, somewhat hazy. SWPC Oval 10% probability reached into Kansas, later retreated into Nebraska.

- 1480 KYOS CA Merced - 10/27 2116 - Briefly on top of channel, with ID "14-80 AM KYOS" and local ad for 'Stage Stop Gun Shop' 209-358-4867. Promos included the slogan "The voice of your valley, Merced's news talk station." 366 miles.
- 1490 KWAC CA Bakersfield - 10/27 2110 - On top of channel, with local ad string and 'Radio Punjab' liners, // KGST-1600. Strong het from 1489.966 (maybe KUGR?). 374 miles.

- 1550 KESJ MO St. Joseph - 10/31 0700 - Faded up under KXEX, KZDG, and one or two other stations with "Joe Town 107.5." Partway through the liner, another station underneath said "Springfield," possibly needed KRZD. 1025 miles.
- 1550 KXTO NV Reno - 10/28 1030 - Fighting KZDG and KXEX with Spanish religious programming and 'Radio Vida' liners, including the network's main phone number 956-968-7777. 312 miles. Relog but quite rare despite being so close.
- 1560 KVAN WA Burbank - 10/28 1030 - On top of channel, with 'La Estación de la Familia' Spanish Religious programming, including the network's contact number 206-439-1188. None of the other LEF stations were coming in at this hour. 552 miles.

- 1620 WNRP FL Gulf Breeze - 10/27 2358 - Under Radio Rebelde's chimes/anthem, with promo for the Newsradio Pensacola app. 1626 miles.

- 1700 WJCC FL Miami Springs - 10/31 0730 - Faded up over XEPE, with morning newscast in Haitian French. 2145 miles. **NEW! Florida #31.**
- 1700 KKLF TX Richardson - 10/30 0819 - Under XEPE, with older Mexican hits and ads in "Spanglish," including a concert at the Longhorn Ballroom in Dallas. 1054 miles.



## Unreported Domestic Stations
