- 1600 KGST CA **Fresno** – 9/3 0655 – Presumed with very distinct South Asian music, no talk ever heard. Seemed // to a nearby California SDR during live listening, but due to the poor copy on the remote Kiwi SDR, not definitive enough for me to count it. Did not match KVRI. West DKAZ. **(TT-MI)**
- WIDU NC **Fayetteville** – 8/15 0600 – Same concert ad audible at the same time on WYDU-1160, but then separate ID: “Your station for inspiration and information, 1600 AM 99.7 FM WIDU1600.com, we are WIDU Fayetteville ...,” to news. **(DY-VA)**

Unreported Domestic Stations

Wow, we had no fewer than six stations reported to DDXD this issue for the first time since at least Volume 67 (1999-2000): WYLS-670, WDYN-980, WOZK-900, WZGX-1450, WOMI-1490, and WCOR-1490. We’re also going to drop defunct CHNL-1-1400 from the list, but we’ll add in WJTO-750 (since we count frequency changes as new stations for these purposes) to balance it out, and that means we have only 168 currently licensed, full-power AM stations in the United States and Canada that have not been reported yet this century.

We also had 2,382 different stations reported to DDXD during Volume 91, or about 53 percent of all currently licensed stations. I believe this is the first time in the decade or so I’ve been tracking these that we have had more than half of all stations reported to DDXD in a single volume year.

The full list was last printed in issue 18 in July, but an updated one is included in *DXtra News*.

--- NOTES FROM CANADA ---

Sadly, Canada's oldest living broadcaster passed away on August 4, almost making it to the birthday many of us called 104.5. His family celebrated Gord's birthday every six months over the last few years, and he enjoyed his friends joking about the half-year birthdays as FM frequencies. He was born just two and a half months before Canada's first radio broadcast: by XWA Montreal to an audience in an Ottawa hotel.

Gordon Skuttle spent his career at CJCA Edmonton AB, essentially his hometown, having been born in nearby Onoway, where his Norwegian parents had homesteaded a farm. He was hired as a Studio Operator in 1943 and became Chief Engineer in 1957. He was in charge of constructing two new studio buildings and two new transmitter sites for CJCA, as well as converting low power CJCA-FM to high powered CIRK-FM. If you have a CJCA QSL card from before he retired in the mid-1980s, it has Gord's signature on it. CJCA-FM's longest serving employee, Irene Madoche, passed away on August 6th at the age of 88. She spent 51 years as receptionist, starting at CJCA AM & FM in 1959. The only reason that she retired in November 2010, just after her 75th birthday, was because her amazing

memory for faces, voices and telephone numbers was no longer perfect, which made her uncomfortable in the job. Over the years: CJCA-FM became CIRK-FM and CJCA-AM was shut down*; the owners of CFCW-AM and CKRA-FM bought CIRK-FM, leaving Irene as Receptionist for three radio stations in their West Edmonton Mall studios.

Edmonton is unique among Canada Major Radio Markets in that 100% of the AM stations existing at the end of World War II obtained FM licenses by 1951 and all of those FMs have operated continuously since then. And all three of those AM stations were signed off forever* by their owners. *CJCA-AM went off the air for more than four months, beginning at 6:00 PM on December 1, 1993. The new owners had already planned to apply for a brand new radio station license now that the CRTC invited non-denominational religious broadcasters to apply, so they jumped at the chance to take over CJCA's transmitter, frequency and call letters. CKUA-AM was the next to go. Simulcasting CKUA-FM and its FM relay transmitters across Alberta continued. The 580 frequency was then licensed to CHAH Edmonton. CFRN-AM was the most recent to leave the airwaves, though CHQT-AM is expected to sign off anytime now. The CFRN transmitter site is currently being developed into residential housing. Much of CFRN's Sports programming soon moved to CKJR-1440 Wetaskiwin, Alberta.

- 580 CKWW ON Windsor** – The Oldies music continues with the new owner relaunching the format on August 19. New slogan will be Made In Windsor.
- 690 CKGM QC Montreal** – TSN 690 remained on the air throughout a power failure that began at 0600 August 16th, caused by a major water main break in Downtown Montreal. Internet audio streaming was unavailable and station staff got extremely hot as the studios' emergency power generator was not connected to the building air conditioning.
- 800 CJAD QC Montreal** – Like CKGM-690, CJAD's studios lost power at 0600 August 16. The station stayed on the air but lost its internet audio streaming. The staff reported extreme temperatures in the studios.
- 820 CHAM ON Hamilton** – Despite new owner Neeti P. Ray's relaunch of CKWW-580 and CKOC-1150, the expected return of co-owned CHAM to Classic Country was not announced, possibly a result of the shutdown of CHML-900, which opened up other viable options for CHAM's new format.
- 880 CHQT AB Edmonton** – Noted with separate programming for each of CHQT, CHED-630 Edmonton, CHQR-770 Calgary and CFGQ-FM Calgary for the first time since the All News format ended. Until the recent re-launch of CFGQ-FM as a music station, late evening and overnight programming was almost always simulcast on all four stations. On August 16 at 0050, CHQT was airing 'The Ongoing History of New Music' with Alan Cross, CHED was airing 'A Little More Conversation' with Ben O'Hara-Byrne and CHQR was airing the Canadian Football League's Calgary Stampeders football 'After Game' show. Still no word on when CHQT and CKGO-730 Vancouver will turn their transmitters off for good.
- 900 CHML ON Hamilton** – Their transmitter was switched off early, just before the 11 o'clock news on August 14, with the official shutdown announcement only heard on the station's internet audio stream at 12 Noon. Owner Corus said that they have been losing money on the station for years.
- 900 CKBI SK Prince Albert** – Suddenly a much more viable DX target for many now that CHML is off the air. Their single tower non-directional signal with 10 kW days and 2.8 kW at night features a Country music format.
- 1150 CKOC ON Hamilton** – August 19 marks the station's new owner, Neeti P. Ray, flipping the format back to **Oldies** from Bloomberg Business News. Slogan will be 'Superhits of the 70s and 80s.'
- 1210 CFYM SK Kindersley** – Heard in McGrath, Alaska at 0400 on August 17 with clear call letter ID surrounded by Classic Hits. Likely their assigned 250 Watt non-directional night power as they are routinely very strong in Edmonton, Alberta if KMIA Auburn-Federal Way, Washington switches to night power and pattern.
- 1490 CJSN SK Swift Current** – Heard in McGrath, Alaska just after CFYM-1210 was heard (above). Clear mentions of both swiftcurrentonline.com and CJSN call letters.

- 880 WCBS NY New York – 8/25 2146 – **Special Last-day Program**: “WCBS Through The Years,” when “our call letters were WABC.” Audio snippets from 1939, then ID, traffic/ weather, ads, CBS News. Employees remembering their years at WCBS and thanking the audience and their team. Audio snippets from the 1940s. Strong with fading. (EB-AL)
- 880 WRFD OH Columbus-Worthington – 8/25 2024 – Religious talk, ad for ‘Bible Studies,’ closing ID: “880 Columbus . . . and 104.5 FM.” **Close-down at 2030**. Fair, with fading. (EB-AL)
- 1110 WTOF AL Bay Minette – 8/24 – The new NRC AM Log list this as “FCC silent 7/2024” and **indeed it remains**. Believe it’s the same ownership, or was, as WMOB (**non-log**). (TK-AL)
- 1360 WMOB AL Mobile – 8/24 – **Non-log**. This one turned in their license awhile back, and we can **confirm it is indeed silent**; no cheating! (TK-AL)
- 1640 WTNI MS Biloxi – 8/24 – **Non-log**. This one is definitely **not active**. I haven’t heard it in months from home, and confirmed silent when on the eastern shore of Mobile Bay this day. Forgot to check WANG 1490 kHz, which was simulcasting WTNI, however it too has gone undetected from the home location for months. Both are listed as silent in the new NRC AM Log. (TK-AL)

--- PIRATE ACTIVITY ---

- 1710 ARGH AL Birmingham – 8/28 1331 – Randomly tuned to this channel on my caradio, finding a strong station playing rock music. Obviously a music lover, since it’s a nice and varied selection and each song is played fully up to the very last note. Also heard in the evening and all day 8/29 and 8/30, so not a one-off. Using the directionality of the Sony’s ferrite bar antenna, I found out which street or two it’s coming from but I won’t tell except it covers the southern half of the metro area. I could not see an antenna but there are lots of backyards and a forest where it could be hiding. There was one ID one morning, a man saying: “You are listening to [...] Love Radio” when I was far away and the signal was not very strong, otherwise it’s music non-stop whenever I check. Music style is mostly CLR/OLD. (EB-AL)

--- UNID ---

- 930 unID – 8/25 2242 – A “broken record C&W station” – playing an intro of a C&W song, but only a few notes over and over, literally sounding like a broken record, for the length of a regular song, then the next song with the same behavior. Still going at 2258. Fair, with fading. Roughly East/West from Birmingham. (EB-AL1)
- 1340 unID – 8/30 0610 – Mexi-tunes, with same male canned imaging between every couple of tracks; thought I heard “La Jota” slogan but probably wrong. Not parallel WWFL Clermont, FL stream. (TK-FL)
- 1550 unID - 9/4 0100 – Started with music followed by a pastor. There was QRM, but getting through. Where is this religious station coming from? (RA-CA)
- 1570 unID - 9/4 0101-0103 – An ad for an Indian attorney for immigration (phone number with Area Code 415 mentioned). Two business ads mentioning Indian hamburgers and a market. A clue; was it from San Francisco or San Jose? (RA-CA) [The 415 area code covers San Francisco and up the Pacific coast. But . . . KCVR 1570 Lodi, California is listed in the NEW NRC AM Radio Log as ‘Punjabi’ and “Punjabi Radio.” I’ll bet that’s what you heard – BH]

--- TIS/HAR ---

- 1630 AL DoT AL - 8/24 -Two signages westbound on I-10 before Mobile Bay noted, stating active when the yellow light is flashing. **Nothing audible**, and who knows if they’re lying like most of these Interstate signs seem to do. (TK-AL)

--- TENTATIVE/ASSUMED ---

- 910 KCJB ND Minot – 8/25 0330 – Tentative with a traditional Country song, fading out completely before the song ended with antenna SE and decent signal, while it lasted. Same thing on 8/26 @ 0337. First intelligible audio since CKDQ signed off. (JP-AB)
- 1070 KWEL? TX Midland – 8/26 0620 – Poor, with with “WTSO, KNX, ??? & “FM 107.1” into TALK. Were they testing? On? They’re the only 107.1 with a 1070 . . . or a promo of a “sister station” on 107.1. Dunno. (JJR-MI) [Plentywood also has a 107.1 – BH]

- 1410 KDKT ND **Beulah** – 8/17 0637-0641 – Despite being more than an hour before Beulah sunrise, likely already on day power, as not heard a couple of hours earlier. Tentative with “Sports Radio” mention and a weather forecast ending with 86 degrees, which coincides exactly with the forecast high for Beulah on 8/18. Poor DX conditions. **(JP-AB)**
- 1540 KXEL IA **Waterloo** – 9/5 0307-0335 – First time heard with The Overcomer Ministry, which they run daily for two hours, from **0200-0400**. Frequent mentions of the host, Pastor Rice, with odd assortment of program material, including voice mail messages from listeners, long Bible readings that sound like a recording released by a major male Hollywood actor in the 1940s, testimonials by people in the studio and some music. Many mentions of ‘WTWW,’ a shortwave station that also carries this program, and the program’s web site highlights a new 300 kW shortwave station being built in Bulgaria. No ‘KXEL’ ID during the half hour monitored. Strong signal, but had to null a much stronger KXPA. **(JP-AB)**
- 1540 KXPA WA **Bellevue** – 9/5 0307-0335 – Oldies from the 1960s, which their web site titles ‘Music of Your Life,’ with occasional national ads. Listed as carrying ‘The Overcomer Ministry’ in NRC AM Log but no longer listed on the Overcomer web site nor on the kxpa.com web site schedule. Was nulling them to hear KXEL, as KXPA had a much stronger signal. **(JP-AB)**
- 1580 KFCS CO **Colorado Springs** – 9/5 0306 – Very strong, with Ranchero music in Spanish, likely on 10 kW day power, as have not heard anything discernible on 1580 for many months. **(JP-AB)**

- 540 WXYG MN **Sauk Rapids** – 8/22 0618 – Unknown album cut and “540 WXYG” into another song. Poor, no CBK. **(JJR-MI)**

- 550 KFYI AZ **Phoenix** – 9/28 0003- Heard with a mention of the West Nile virus. Jingle: “You are listening to Fox News.” Competing with KUZZ Bakersfield. Heard first in Henderson, Nevada. **(RA-CA)**
- 550 KFYR ND **Bismarck** – 8/18 0640 – “Todd Michell on K-Fire 550 and 99.7.” Weather; “. . . sunrise at 6:47.” Poor; no WSAU. **(JJR-MI)**
- 580 WIBW KS **Topeka** – 8/20 0617 – ‘Kansas Agricultural Network.’ Alone. Poor, but Steady. **(JJR-MI)**
- 580 WELO MS **Tupelo** – 8/30 1547 – Jingle: “. . . Classics . . . 104.3” and hiphop. New one; weak. **(EB-AL2)**
- 580 CFRA ON **Ottawa** – 8/21 0547 – Mentioning a \$46 Million jackpot, a lottery link, and an ad for ‘Mr. Lube’ in Ottawa. Poor. **(JJR-MI)**
- 590 CJCL ON **Toronto** – 8/21 0548 – “SportsNet 590, The Fan’ after a few PSAs or “.ca” mentions. Poor, but not heard often here. **(JJR-MI)**
- 600 KSJB ND **Jamestown** – 8/18 0638 – “KSJB Sports boosters. Best sports coverage in North Dakota is on KSJB.” Poor, but Alone. **(JJR-MI)**
- 600 KSJB ND **Jamestown** – 8/25 0500 – Tuning to 600, I had Country music playing, then male giving a nice clear ID as: “The Legendary Country music for over 85 years, this is KSJB 600 AM 100.1 FM and translator K261FC Jamestown, North Dakota.” Fair signal on top of the channel. Relog. **(JN-TX)**
- 600 KROD TX **El Paso** – 9/02 0618 – With string of commercials followed by male with “. . . 600 ESPN El Paso.” Fair signal. Relog. **(JN-TX)**
- 610 KFNZ MO **Kansas City** – 8/29 0644 – “96-5 the Fan” with ‘The Fan Morning Show’ including “. . . go to KCK.com.” Poor, but Alone. **(JJR-WI)**
- 610 KOJM MT **Havre** – 9/6 0708 – Poor, with “98.3 K-J-. . . ” and music, though too weak to copy. Unneeded. No KDAL. **(JJR-MI)**
- 610 KCSR NE **Chadron** – 8/23 0651 – With a Country song into “AM 610 KCSR” and a shop-local promo. Poor, but no usual KDAL. **(JJR-MI)**
- 610 KVNU UT **Logan** – 8/21 0742 – “News Talk KVNU” ID, followed by a few local ads. Fair signal. **(JW-CO)**



- 620 KTAR AZ Phoenix – 9/02 0615 – Checking out pre-sunrise DX, nice big signal here with ‘Home Depot’ commercial followed by male: “... home of Arizona Diamondbacks baseball, this is Arizona Sports 98.7 and the Arizona sports app.” Relog. Signals from the west were pretty good this morning. (JN-TX)
- 630 KHOW CO Denver – 9/6 0707 – Poor, with ‘I Heart’ radio app. No WREY or CHED, which goes to 880 soon. Hoping to hear before the move! (JJR-MI) [Methinks it’s too late – BH]
- 640 KFI CA Los Angeles – 09/02 0617 – Nice big signal this morning with Coast-to-Coast. Male comes on at 0630: “K-F-I News on the hour and the half hour and when it breaks.” Still heard at 0820. Relog. (JN-TX)
- 640 KWPN OK Moore – 8/23 0647 – “98.1 WWLS, the Sports Animal” in promo. Poor, but Alone. WOI was in earlier. No WMFN. (JJR-MI)
- 640 CFIQ ON Richmond Hill – 8/25 0602 – Global News heard. Not heard much. Poor, with 2-3 others (WOI and ???). (JJR-MI)
- 650 KGAB WY Orchard Valley – 8/29 0657 – Good, with promo for ‘Cheyenne Animal Shelter Steady Sidekick Program’ and a PSA for US Forest Service. ToH ID: “KGAB, Orchard Valley, Cheyenne. A Townsquare Media Station. AM 650 KGAB Cheyenne’s #1 Newstalk Radio” into FOX News. Relog. (LB-CO)
- 660 KTNN AZ Window Rock – 8/29 0648 -“KTNN Window Rock” between songs. Fair! With C&W standing out. A Shocker! **Again in on 9/3 @ 0710** – Poor, with Tribal chanting. All alone and // stream. No KBHR or CFFR. Steady. (JJR-WI)
- 660 KTNN AZ Window Rock – 8/30 0756 – C&W music to 0758 ID: “KTNN Window Rock-Tohatchi-Kirtland;” more music followed. Good signal; actually readable through local KLTT’s IBOC hash. (JW-CO)
- 660 KTNN AZ Window Rock – 09/02 0700 – With Country music, and male giving ID as: “KTNN Window Rock, KTNN-FM Tohatchi, KKNS Corrales,” then into AP News. Another station with a big signal this morning from the west. Relog. (JN-TX)

Studio, Newsradio KEYZ Williston, a Townsquare Media station” into ABC News. **NEW.** Recorded. (LB-CO)
- 660 CFFR AB Calgary – 8/21 0637 – Poor, with a news reader. Finally: a “Number One for breaking news” Nuff said! With a weak WBHR. **Appeared again on 8/23 @ 0645** – Poor. with talk of Cyber Security in Calgary and Calgary Businesses. All alone. Solid. **Logged once more on 9/4 @ 0656** – Poor, mentioning a . . . “.ca” address in an ad, then stocks, “. . . Bank of Canada. . . ,” “. . . Wall Street freefall. . . ” and Legal ID/tone at 0659. (JJR-MI)
- 670 WYLS AL York – 8/30 1700 – Heard some Gospel music a little earlier, so I made sure to check at ToH. Heard talk of events at Missionary Baptist Church. ID: “Thank you for listening to WYLS Radio,” and “Call to submit your church announcements to WYLS.” Weak. DDXD – Unreported. **New one.** (EB-AL2)
- 670 KLTT CO Commerce City – 09/02 0615 – Fair signal this morning, with religion message, followed by ID. Relog. (JN-TX)
- 680 KNBR CA San Francisco – 8/30 0649 – Poor, with Infinity Sports with CBS’s old sports music sounders, replacing WHBE! The only ISR station! **Logged again on 9/2 @ 0706** – With Infinity Sports. Poor, but Alone and Solid with Steady signal. No WDBC or CJOB. The only fit! (JJR-WI)
- 680 KNBR CA San Francisco – 09/02 0655 – Noted a station under KKYX with sports talk. At 0700 male mentions: “. . . KNBR . . . Francisco.” Only partial words were noted under KKYX. which was very strong. **New for California #29.** (JN-TX)
- 680 WHBE KY Newburg – 8/29 0644 – Poor, with ESPN. Ad: “. . . on the Louisville side, on the Indiana side.” Logged as WJIE in ‘99. (JJR-WI)
- 690 WQNO LA New Orleans – 9/2 2308-2312 – Strong and alone answering questions from Catholic listeners with several mentions of EWTN. (NB-WI)
- 690 KFXN MN Minneapolis – 9/5 0637 – With only Hmong chanting noted on frequency today. Poor. (JJR-MI)
- 690 KTSM TX El Paso – 8/22 0648 – Poor, with three PSAs, then I Heart promos, mention of podcasts, and “News Talk 690 KTSM El Paso.” Alone. (JJR-MI)
- 700 CJLI AB Calgary – 8/21 0632 – Christian music, steady/stable. “AM 700 – The Light.” Poor, and no WLW!!!! (JJR-MI) **In again on 8/23 @ 0644** – Again Poor, with “Pastor Rick Warren – One PM Saturday on AM 700 – The Light.” No WLW! Rare. (JJR-MI)

- 710 WNTM AL Mobile – 8/30 1608 – Newstalk, with interview with a congressman. Partial ID as: “W_TM” caught at 1628. Quite strong! **New one. (EB-AL2)**

- 1310 KNOX ND Grand Forks – 8/26 0708 – Poor “in the Grand Forks area.. ..sports.” Poor, with no WIBA/some WCCW. (JJR-MI)



- 1340 WFEB AL Sylacauga – 8/26 1346 – With ads for mowers and other companies “on Highway 280 in Sylacauga,” and Central Alabama Community College. ID: “WFEB 101, Sylacauga’s best hits and all-time music.” Fair, in southeast Birmingham. (EB-AL1)
- 1340 WYNF GA Augusta – 8/30 0536 – Very poor in the 1340 kHz pile, with BIN network feed. Presumed, at 1000/990 Watts and pointing that-a-way, and the only other BIN on the channel I find is 1000/1000 watts WIZE Springfield, OH, not pointing that-a-way. As in that these call letters were reassigned from what was the once-great 94.9 MHz WYNF “95YNF” AOR Tampa station. **First time log.** (TK-FL)
- 1340 WMBN MI Petoskey – 9/6 0734 – Poor, with “104.7 and 1340 The Ticket” into Michigan sports chatter. Rare. Calls once were on FM outlet (96.3 Petoskey): Michigan’s Beautiful North . . . and it is! (JJR-MI)
- 1340 WQSC SC Charleston – 8/30 0632 – Poor, but fading in/out over a huge pile of others with C&W, ‘Joe’s Truck’ (in Summerville) and ‘Sleep King’ spots. Parallel station stream. 1000/1000 Watts. (TK-FL)

- 1360 WVRQ WI Viroqua – 8/31 0713 – With calls and music from the Monkees and Beach Boys. Poor, with a little WTAQ. (JJR-WI)
- 1370 KGEN CA Tulare – “Esta es la Ley” ID preceded by, and followed by, Spanish tunes. No call letters heard. Briefly fair. (JW-CO)

[Wilkins-CO] SEP 1 1102 – Another killer signal at the same level as KAAAY; calm Spanish religious talk and nice ID by female mentioning calls and location. Only second logging and last heard about a decade ago when KAAAY was off for an extended period of time. [Tromp-MI]
 1100 **MEXICO** unID AUG 19 0639 – Meximusic. No WTAM. No U.S. stations fit, per NRC AM Log 2024. IRCA Mexican Log 2023 has three entries: XECSDZ R.Tonatiuh, Moroleón, Gto. (2023 CP for new social/community station.) XECPOG Ometepec, Gro. (License expired in



late 2021, but re-granted with new calls, ex-XEGRM.) XETGO *La Ke Buena*, Tlaltenango, Zac. (Staying on AM per IFT. AM was off the air 8/21 per IFT audit, but active again in 2023. SDR monitoring 7/23 confirmed the AM was still on.) [Hauser-OK]

- 1017 **TONGA** A3Z *R.Tonga*, Nuku’alofa SEP 1 1005 – Weak male and female talk in domestic splatter noted at 1005, 1028, and 1054 UTC. Presumably in native language. [Tromp-MI]
- 1611 **AUSTRALIA** *Vision Christian Radio*, multiple locations (400 watts each) SEP 3 1056 – Tentative; briefly fading up to where weak Christian music is being heard amongst a jungle of at least 9 visible carriers on 1611 kHz. 1611.0007 is the strongest and presumably the one producing audio (Adelaide?). The *Gold MX* carrier from Southwestern Australia on 1611.0264 is also in the mix, but no audio despite a nice peak at times. [Tromp-MI]

I looked at the *DX News* with the network lists and saw there are two. Fine, thought I'd wait for a station ID or local ad placement. Naturally, the station, which was solid for 15-20 minutes, faded before either ID tool. So, I noted in my log it was either WALG or WCAM.....

Sorry to see CHML-900 gone, their QSL is displayed in my radio room. Only stations noted since, so far, were all relogs, WURD, which is the dominant for most of sunset, WJWL and popping out of the mix after sunset, WABY.....I write the following very tongue in cheek, of course – It would have been nice if a couple of our most prominent DXers sat in the MLB owners meetings when they decided on the 20 second pitch clock and the continuation of the ghost runner. Both have somewhat hindered DXing of baseball nets with the shortening of a 9 inning game and very much so for extra inning contests. They need to take DXers into the equation! The pitch clock is the best thing, maybe the only good thing, MLB has done in years, the ghost runner one of the worst. How MLB pulled a fast one on the minor leagues is another pet peeve for discussion another day.....

Suggestion for reporters to the various DX columns – if you have multiple receivers/antennas listed in the reporters section, perhaps list, after each logging, which receiver/antenna was used. 73! Bob

I recently had a chance to do a revealing side-by-side comparison of my Qodosen SR-286 and GE Superadio II (SRII), both functioning properly, to the best of my knowledge. On July 27, I heard CMBQ-530, Cuba's 10KW Radio Encyclopedia, for the first and only time since April 5. With a strong enough signal to do a decent comparison of the two radios. The SRII required a very tight antenna alignment while the SR-286 delivered a listenable signal over almost 90 degrees. The SR-286 had a strong and steady background roar, but no other RFI, while the SRII eliminated the roar but was full of lightning strike RFI. The SR-286 was set to widest bandwidth and the SRII set to flat audio, with treble and bass both set to the center position. Turning the volume up to maximum on both receivers delivered, at times, understandable Spanish speech at about the same loudness, but the SRII was easier to understand without the roar of the SR-286. Both radios were barefoot on fully-charged batteries, with the SR-286 set to INT ANT; it also has a Whip Antenna which is activated when set to EXT ANT but does not work well except during power failures in my DX location.

Just read about the new Tecsun S-2200X, a huge monstrosity of a portable, but promising to be the best portable for those of us hungering for MW Upper and Lower Sideband settings on a portable radio. An e-mail from Jay Allen, a broadcast engineer who compares portables for both AM and FM reception at radiojayallen.com, indicates that he is currently (September 5th) evaluating the S-2200X. He will publish his review on his web site in the very near future. As a sidenote, I read where the S-2200X has a very retro look because Tecsun is using an old plastic mold for the front of the radio.

As well as the Qodosen SR-286 and GE Superadio II, I just pulled my Sangean PR-D15 out of mothballs, now that 910 KHz has been deserted by CKDQ's move to FM. 910 is now a very RFI-noisy frequency on the Qodosen SR-286 and the SRII faces RF Overload from nearby CJCA-930, giving the PR-D15 a significant edge over the other two on 910. So far, only a tentative KCJB.

The upcoming DX season could be interesting with all the frequencies that have opened up here in the last year or so. 630 should be a lot quieter around late October after CHED-630 moves to 880.

My full report is in the DX West column. I tried to use the SDR# AM Co-Channel Canceller on some overnight IQ recordings and see that I still have a lot to learn about that feature.

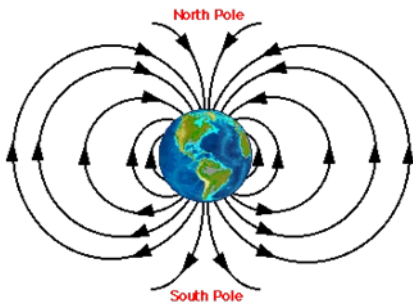

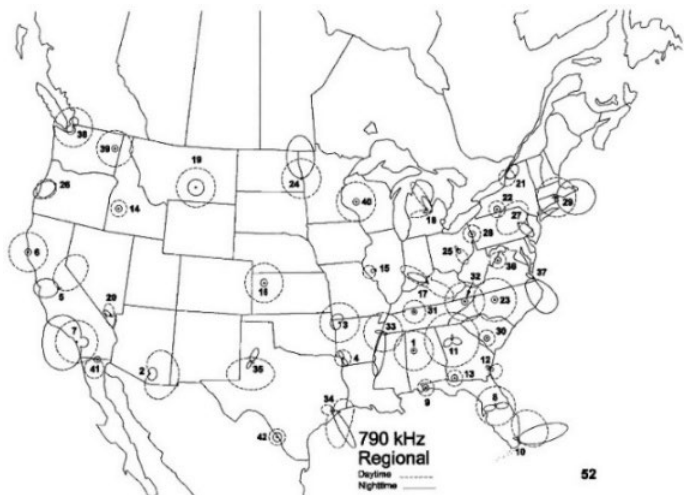

Pro Sports Networks

Here is National Football League (NFL) flagship information for the 2024 season via Internet searches. Some of the network lists are undated, so I do not know if they are for the current season. And I cannot rely on the copyright date at the bottom of each page, as that is probably added globally for the web site, even if the specific web page being viewed has not changed. And some team sites do not list the announcer team, while others have bios that are a few seasons' old, so I do not know if they are current. I found some network list pages that were not linked from the team home page or sub-section "home" page; I assume that there are "orphan" pages that are not current.

Some of the online lists cannot be cut-and-pasted, as they are graphical images. One could download the JPEG image file and then feed it through an OCR scanner, but I find it simpler to hand-compare it to the text file I have saved from last season and create a new text file.

These lists were checked by David Yocis against the official FCC AM and FM databases, so what you see below might differ from what you find at the URLs listed. And, before I sent the column to David, he checked the lists for the Arizona Cardinals, Atlanta Falcons, and Chicago Bears; he found stations that had changed calls letters two times and one that had changed frequencies. I was assuming that the network lists posted by the NFL team would have come from the department that handles the advertising and thus would be up-to-date with respect to call letters and frequency.

And I am not sure that I have all of the Spanish-language stations correct.

The various gotknowhow.com sites claim to have current lists, according to the date "by Doug"; I have no idea from where Doug gets his information. I did compare Doug's list with the official San Francisco 49ers' list, and I found seven stations on Doug's list that were not on the official list. David Yocis says that the gotknowhow lists have "station information that is wildly out-of-date."

I found some of the lists in the "News" section of the team's website under the headline "How to watch the ... pre-season game against ..." I do not know if the pre-season list of stations differs from the list for the regular season. And some of these articles only listed the flagship station(s).

Due to NFL Restrictions, online streaming of games is prohibited by affiliates. You can listen and/or watch games online via NFL.com

The announcer names are found at this URL:

That page seems to have been updated for the 2024 season, but the footnotes on that site point to web page retrievals in 2012.

There is a site <http://nflfootballtv.com/onlineradio.html> that has Internet online radio - streaming audio and video information on each team. I have no idea if that web site is current.

The Westwood One Radio Network (renamed to Dial Global Sports and in 2013 and then renamed to WestwoodOne Sports) will broadcast NFL games that occur Sunday nights, Monday nights, and Thursday nights. This URL <http://westwoodonesports.com/football-announcers/> has the list of announcers. Here are the announcer teams:

- Monday night: Kevin Harlan, Kurt Warner, Rich Eisen (studio host)
- Sunday night: Ryan Radtke & Rod Woodson or Ross Tucker, Scott Graham (studio host)
- Thursday night: Ian Eagle, Tony Boselli, Scott Graham (studio host)

As this list is the same as last year (and the 2024 station list has not yet been posted), I do not know if this announcer list reflects the 2024 season broadcasts.

Entravision, a Spanish-language network, will be broadcasting games Thursday night season kickoff, Sunday Nights, Monday Nights, and all post-season games. The web site did not list the announcers.

As always, any of these network lists can change during the season. Please send me any additions and/or corrections. Thanks.

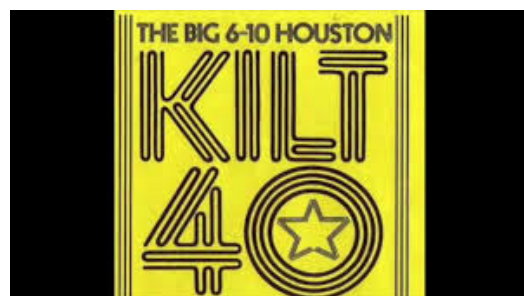
