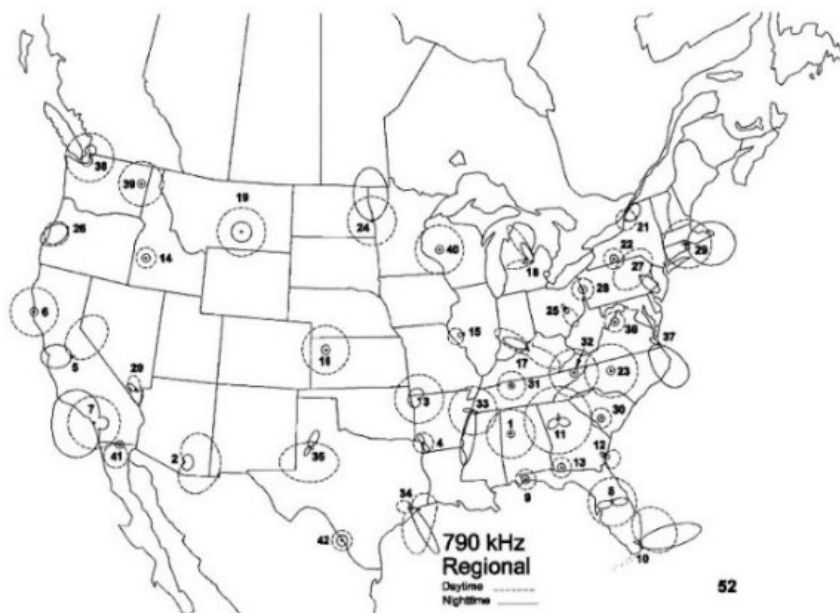

It’s been a sad week after the death of **Dan Sys** due to cancer on Canadian Thanksgiving. He almost died years ago, but time passed and we all forgot how ill he had been, so it was a big surprise. Dan was well known as the author of the monthly *Canadian Radio News*. RIP, Dan!

Fans of CHED-630 Edmonton will be interested in a book by recently retired News Director, Bob Layton. Titled Welcome to Radiol!: My life in broadcasting, so far. It covers all the crazy things that happened during his half century at CHED, as well as his first job, at CKNL in Fort St. John, B.C. It is now available from Amazon. I cannot speak for the U.S. but Amazon’s Canadian site sells copies of the book printed by Amazon at Acheson, a suburb of Edmonton.

The second Monday in October (the 14th this year) is Thanksgiving in Canada. Unlike the U.S. version of Thanksgiving, Canada’s annual family reunions occur at Christmas, thanks to December 26 being a holiday, Boxing Day, minimizing the vacation days needed to be off work from Christmas to New Years. Christmas Day is the only remaining day of the year when virtually all retailers are closed. Even radio stations operate with little or no staff, running special programming like the 12-hour “Christmas Is” which was produced in the mid-1980s by CKNW New Westminster, BC and is still aired by some Corus stations. And, yes, Thanksgiving in Canada sees more turkeys consumed than any other day of the year.

630 CHQT AB Edmonton – Swapped frequencies with CHED at 0200 October 9. They initially ran a simulcast of CHED-880, fading it down for an announcement of the CHED change in frequency to 880 then faded back up. That did not last long, and by that evening, it was just the announcements with a few seconds of dead air between them. The announcements were recorded by on-air hosts, are of random lengths averaging 30 seconds, and are rotated. If you consider call letter changes as separate DX log entries, this is a unique and short opportunity to log CHQT-630, as there is no word from the station as to when the 630 transmitter will be turned off forever. This is the second frequency change for CHQT; it began in 1965 on 1110, but found KFAB interference at night a major problem as the population increased south of the transmitter site, prompting the move to 880 in the mid-1980s. CHQT is currently the

newest Edmonton station still on AM. Ironically, when CHQT goes off the air, CHED will inherit the title of newest Edmonton station still on AM.

- 880 CHED **AB Edmonton** – The call letter change was made at 0200 on October 9 when the official move of CHED from 630 to 880 occurred.
- 920 CBKG **BC Granisle** – The CBC has applied to the CRTC to convert this 40 Watt LPRT to CBYG-4-FM on 105.9 MHz with 106 Watts non-directional at 142 feet below average terrain (EHAAT). It will continue to simulcast CBYG-FM Prince George, BC, part of the CBC Radio One network.
- 990 CBQF **YT Carmacks** – The CBC also wants to move this 40 Watt LPRT to FM, without a change in call letters, on 105.1 MHz with 852 Watts directional at 585 feet above average terrain (EHAAT). It will continue to simulcast CFWH-FM Whitehorse, YT, part of the CBC Radio One network.
- 1260 CKHJ **NB Fredericton** – Although the station has been operating with only 32 Watts non-directional at night for quite a while, the reduction in night power from 10 kW directional has just been listed as completed by ISED in September. The most likely reason for the delay is that the technical certification for the 32 Watts was just received. The station slogan is currently “Pure Country 103.5” reflecting the frequency of 250 Watt rebroadcaster CKHJ-2-FM in nearby Oromocto.

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STATION NEWS

- 600 WICC CT **Bridgeport** – Added FM simulcast on 95.9 MHz taking over the facilities of the former WFOX-FM in Norwalk. They can now be heard from the Bronx to New Haven on FM. They are also heard on FM translators through HD subchannels on WEBE-Westport and WPLR-New Haven. These stations are all under the same ownership. A week after WCBS-880 left the airwaves, WICC put all of the aforementioned changes into effect and started calling itself “The Voice of Connecticut.” They contracted with CBS to provide hourly newscasts and hired Brigitte Quinn, a veteran news anchor who spent many years at WINS-1010 and WCBS-880. Last week she started the same interview show she did on WCBS, from noon to 2pm on WICC. INTERNATIONAL NEWS

CUBA: A nationwide electricity blackout on Friday, October 18, resulted in the shutdown of all radio stations into the weekend. The blackout was reported to be due to failure of the Antonio Guiteras power plant which set off a chain reaction while Cuba is also in the midst of a nationwide fuel shortage. The *R.Rebelde* and *R.Progreso* websites were up and running Saturday with streaming audio and news reports about ongoing efforts to restore el Sistema Electroenergético Nacional (SEN). El Ministerio de Energia y Minas warned that due to the technical complexity of the process of restoring the electrical system, disconnections of subsystems may occur as plants are restarted. [www.radiorebelde.cu] DX reports indicated that a few medium wave radio stations were back on the air by Saturday night, possibly at reduced power or with a limited number of synchros per frequency, but many remained off including 530 *R.Enciclopedia* and 640 *R.Progreso*.

Dan Sys passed away on the morning of Canadian Thanksgiving, October 14th. He was Mr. Canadian Radio News to people who knew him, as he has been distributing monthly lists of all changes at Canadian radio stations since e-mail first became popular. After that, he branched out to daily updates on discussion forums, web sites and Facebook. Even radio station management relied on Dan's expertise, often asking him questions that he patiently answered. Despite never having worked a day in Radio, either paid or volunteer, Dan's knowledge proved more accurate than some Corporate Legal departments, such as 20 years ago when Legal gave the go-ahead for stations not to announce call letter IDs hourly, because the CRTC had no requirements to do such. Dan knew that the federal government's Spectrum Management department had regulations of their own, checked them out and confirmed that call letter IDs were required hourly. Several large broadcast corporations got Non-Compliance Notices from the CRTC, as a result.

Then known as Danny, he emerged in the mid-1960s as one of the more than dozen Medium Wave DXers in the Greater Vancouver area, most of them teenage boys. Some of us, including Dan, also started collecting radio memorabilia. In more recent years, Dan focused on radio station stickers but never stopped DXing. For example, shortly after CJLI-700 Calgary came on the air, Dan was having no luck hearing them, so he contacted me. It was August, so I calculated official sunrise times at CJLI and the station blocking Dan's reception, KXLX near Spokane, and discovered a 15 minute window of opportunity when CJLI was on day power and pattern, and KXLX was still on night power (they are always non-directional). Dan got up at 4:15 AM the next morning and heard CJLI; he was that dedicated to DX.

Dan's career was spent as a traditional Mail Man, for Canada Post. He retired at 55 years old but was later hospitalized with cancer and nearly died. He seemed fine after he recovered and, as the years passed, many of us forgot about his close call with death. Which is why his death caught so many of us by surprise. Dan was 72 years old.

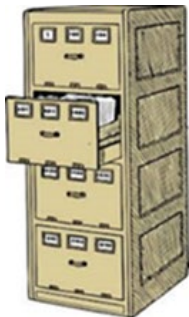

From the Archives



90 Years Ago : From the October 24, 1934 issue of *DX News*: KMAC-1370 San Antonio TX (1370 was then a graveyard channel) switched on their new antenna during a recent NRC DX test and “the results were amazing,” with the station being heard clearly in the U.S. Northeast with the new antenna and not at all on the old one. WPTF Raleigh received special temporary authority to broadcast with 1 watt daytime power on 550, 620, 670, 720, 770, 800, 840, 910, 980, 990, 1230, 1320, 1330, and 1490 kc/s “to make antenna tests.”

75 Years Ago: From the October 29, 1949 issue of *DX News*: New station CPs granted included a 5,000 watt daytime-only station for Los Angeles on 1540 (today’s KMPC). Several DXers noted continued poor conditions with high levels of noise and many Latin American stations.

50 Years Ago: From the October 28, 1974 issue of *DX News*: Several DXers reported Paraguay on 645 kHz coming in unusually well. Gary Siegel submitted a write-up of the 1974 NRC convention in Toledo (actually Perrysburg), Ohio, with 54 members attending (some of whom are still NRC members after all these years).

25 Years Ago: From the October 25, 1999 issue of *DX News*: A lengthy article from the *Toledo Blade* recounted how corporate ownership of local radio stations has changed broadcasting; once there were 20 reporters for the news departments of four Toledo radio stations, and now there are only two reporters at one station (WSPD). Jean Burnell offered an initial report from the Cappahayden, Newfoundland DXpedition.

10 Years Ago: From the November 3, 2014 issue of *DX News*: Ken Chatterton announced his retirement from the NRC Board of Directors. British DXer Graham Maynard, designer of the ferrite sleeve loop antennas popular with Ultralight DXers, died on October 4.

Unreported Stations

One station – KVL1-1140 – was reported to DDXD in this issue for the first time since at least Volume 67 (1999-2000). We now have only 166 currently licensed, full-power AM stations in the United States and Canada which have not been reported to DDXD during this time. The last full list was published in issue 91-18 in July and electronically in *DXtra News* in September.
