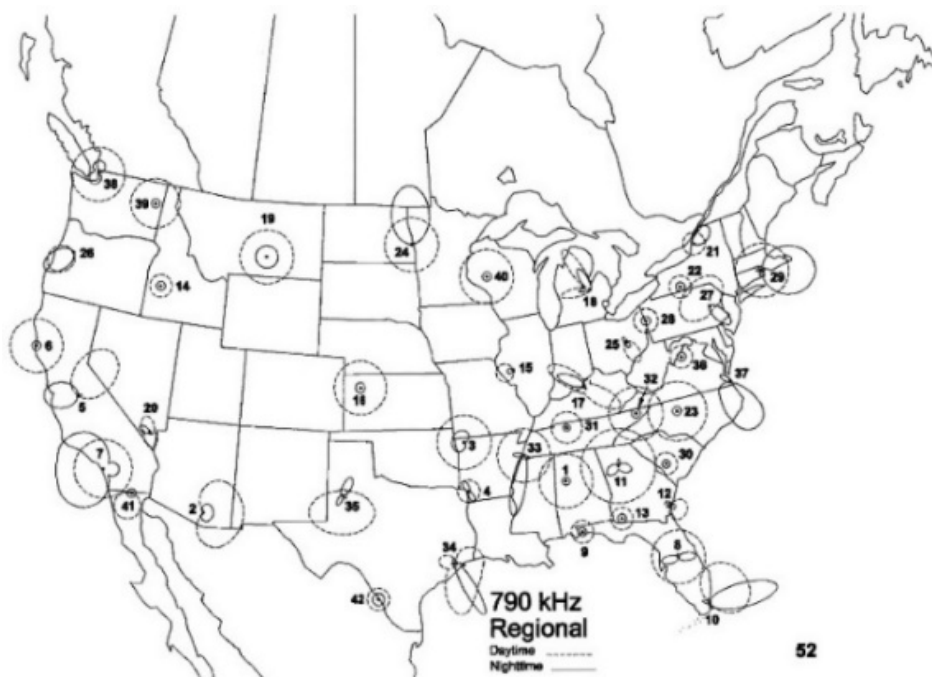
NRC Antenna Pattern Book 8th Edition

--- NOTES FROM CANADA ---

Canada Post has lost more than \$3 billion since 2018 and has not moved a piece of mail since November 15th, thanks to a strike that shows no sign of ending any time soon. Do not mail anything to or from Canada until the strike ends. So . . . If you plan to send or receive mail, to or from Canada, you will want to wait. The strike has created *ripple effects*, most notably with the overloading of United Parcel Service and Purolator, who are *dumping* their partners by refusing to accept packages from third-party couriers who use them for all of their shipment routine.

50 years ago, CHFC and CFPR-860 Prince Rupert, BC were the only Western Canada CBC stations "South of 60" where the NABET union allowed its members to be announcers as well as board operators. This was also the case for stations "North of 60" in the NWT and Yukon, where NABET members could, in addition, read, but not write, newscasts.

590 CJCL ON Toronto – Noted off the air at 2355 on November 27 (Saul Chernos). Suspected tower work as their signal has recently been heard well in northern Ohio despite a licensed nine tower directional pattern that sends virtually all of its signal to the north.

- 880 CHED AB Edmonton – Heard in London, Ontario at 2336 on November 27 with a very poor signal under WHSQ New York NY. CHED is licensed to use 5 kW non-directional at night, if emergency maintenance requires a tower be powered off. (Paul Snider)
- 990 CBW MB Winnipeg – Was off the air beginning at 0935 each day from December 2 to 4 and back on the air at or before 1900 each day (Saul Chernos). “This is to do tower maintenance and to repair and replace damaged parts.” (CBC). However, the only time that they were reported OFF the air during the three days of planned outages was on December 2 from 1140:16 to 1235 (Steve Babcock). The on-air hosts were still expecting the transmitter to go off at 0935 on December 2nd (Shawn Axelrod).
- 990 CBDB YT Watson Lake – Their carrier is on 990.0015, making them easier to detect, even with CBW’s carrier on, as they are almost exactly on 990. CBDB’s audio faded in and out during CBW’s planned outage on December 2. (Steve Babcock). This CBC Radio One repeater of CFWH-FM Whitehorse is 400 Watts days and 165 Watts at night, non-directional. (Jon Pearkins – Edmonton, AB)
- 1610 CHHA ON Toronto – It took a month to be written, but an October DX Camp in Chile was rewarded with a nice lengthy verification letter (in Spanish, of course, since the station broadcasts in Spanish and the DXer wrote the letter in Spanish!). (Néstor Damián Fischetto)

Fair for a spell, with WJXL in a tight semi-null. Doubt a Christian format station, but ruled out (per streaming) are: WXKG Atlanta; WKJW Black Mountain; WHIN Gallatin (non-religious). Suspect WIOI New Boston, Ohio at 1000/22 Watts. Weather and fade match closely, but of course, no streaming available on their website. (TK-FL)

- 1320 unID - 11/30 2043 – Very Poor-to-Poor, with an “FM” jingle, tunes by the Stylistics, Beach Boys (‘California Girls’), a 50s song, ‘Knock Three Times’ by Dawn and “Greatest Hits on Your Radio” It’s NOT WDMJ, as they play no 50s. Thus, syndicated? (JJR-WI)
- 1450 unID - NO DATE 2053-2054 – Started what was a talk show. Faded out into the jumble. Electric Light Orchestra’s ‘Evil Woman’ trying to fight through the QRM. Would fade out, then come back. Any clues, please? (RA-CA)
- 1680 unID - 12/01 2125 – Poor, coming up and down with ‘Get Outta My Dreams, Get Into My Car’ – Billy Ocean, then ‘Beat It’ – Michael Jackson, then ‘Don’t You Forget About Me’ – Simple minds. Nothing between songs. Pirate? More than a half hour of music with no ID or anything else. Very strong at times. Also reported to be heard in the south Twin Cities metro. Some searching on the internet gave me some Facebook posts from the NRC group that indicate the WPRR is known for doing this kind of thing and that their web stream often doesn’t match their radio broadcast which makes checking them more difficult. I heard them the following evening doing the same. Unable to find an internet based SDR that could hear their translator to confirm. (MT-MN)

- 580 WACQ AL Tuskegee – 12/06 0528 – An Oldie, then ID: "Classic Rock around the clock, Classic Hits 580 WACQ and 98.5 FM into 'Hotel California.'" (EB-AL)
- 590 WVLK KY Lexington – 12/06 0542 – ID: "97.3 and 590 WVLK" and back to 'America in the Morning.' (EB-AL)

Sad to see the CBW-990 Winnipeg MB three days of transmitter maintenance turn into an hour or so, from the reports I have seen. But I also know that broadcast engineers are like data center technicians: schedule the worst case scenario Planned Outage and the best possible outcome is not to need it at all.

Even though I never caught any of the outage(s), I did learn a bit more about daytime DX conditions and heard a new station on what had been a “One Station Frequency.” On day power, KSOO-1000 Sioux Falls SD was in strong in the late afternoon with no sign of KNWN Seattle WA. KNWN is not just unnullable here at night but often causes significant interference on 990 and 1010 even on my most selective radios.

As for CBW, it was interesting to see how many hours after Winnipeg sunrise that they were still listenable here in Edmonton. And how they would fade completely out for quite a while, only to reappear later. As someone recently corrected me on Facebook, there can be skip at High Noon. To put it in his words, “You sure weren’t getting groundwave from KSL-1160 Salt Lake City UT into Vancouver at Noon in the Winter,” referring to my mention of Salt Lake City being my most distant reception into Vancouver in the Winter in my Daytime DX Log.

For a few years in the late 1960s, a few of us in the Pacific Northwest kept a separate DX log, just for reception of stations from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM PST. We generally only kept an eye out for new stations during the shortest days of the year, from November to February. What surprised me most was how there might be a unique opening to a specific area, even a single city, on just one day. Reception could be solid or fluttery.

One example sticks in my mind as one daytime DX recording has survived the years, of hearing the two stations in Nampa ID. The most memorable moment was an ad for a one hit wonder, The Strawberry Alarm Clock, coming to Nampa long after their one hit when few people even remembered their name.

Admittedly, DX in the hours before sunset is a different matter. My KSOO reception this past week reminds me of WHO and WCCO coming into Vancouver in the Winter long before sunset. But it also reminds me of the, surprising to me, answer that I got from Edmonton DXers back then when I asked them about Trans-Atlantic DX. They would hear it on Winter afternoons even before Eastern U.S. clear channel stations started coming in.
