From the Archives

90 Years Ago: From the January 16, 1935 issue of *DX News*: Many heard a powerful carrier on 1040 kc/s after 2 a.m. Eastern over the last week; this is Rennes, France, testing with 200 kW.

75 Years Ago: From the January 14, 1950 issue of *DX News*: Carroll Weyrich is planning to issue a new version of the old NNRC AM logbook for \$1.00; the advantage of this Log is that it has room to write in changes and corrections.

50 Years Ago: From the January 13, 1975 issue of *DX News*: Should loggings with a Beverage antenna be marked with an asterisk (like Roger Maris’s 61 home runs)? Can you make loggings from away from your home location? A lengthy debate was kicked off by the editors.

25 Years Ago: From the January 17, 2000 issue of *DX News*: Terry Krueger confirmed that the mystery station on 580.7 kHz is YNEA Managua, Nicaragua.

10 Years Ago: From the January 12, 2015 issue of *DX News*: A number of German stations, including 153, 177, 702, 792, 828, and 972 kHz, have or are about to go silent.

- 620 WZON ME Bangor** – 12/22 0104 – Code ID (.-. --- .-. --- -.) and swoop tones poking through WRJZ/WTMJ mix. **(MKB-ON)**
- +++** – 12/22 0103 – DX Test copied fair to good signals o/u CKCM with tones, Morse code “WZON Bangor 73 de K1CZ,” and the PacMan music, before fading under CKCM for a while, then re-emerging with the announcer giving a brief history of the 98-year old station, and mentioning that their tower had a “date with the bulldozer” in the coming days. Then the start of “Nobody Does It Better” by Carly Simon before fading back down under Grand Falls. I posted two MP3 recordings to my shared Google Drive. **(BT-PEI)**
- +++** – 12/22 0103 – DX Test mixing with WDAE and R. Rebelde (endless singing on R. Rebelde made for the worst QRM between WDAE and R. Rebelde). Began with morse code cutting thru WDAE talk. Then, rising tone, phone type tones, morse code again, siren type sounds and the Carly Simon song “Nobody Does It Better.” **(KK-VA)**
- +++** - 12/22 0104 – Special test as WZON prepares to leave the air on Dec. 31. Code IDs, a big sweep at 0104. Brief history of the station. Final song. Test seemed done by 0112. **(JR-NY)**

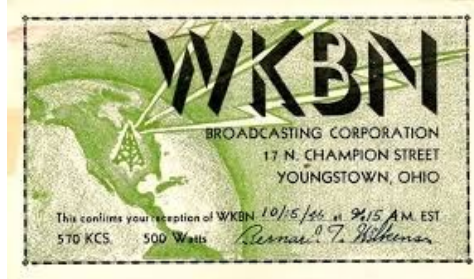

Canada Post re-opened their doors on December 17 after the federal government forced employees to go back to work until May 2025. Notices to recipients of parcels are already indicating that they will receive them later than promised.

"The Federal Court of Appeal says big streaming companies won't have to pay for Canadian content until it hears their appeal of a CRTC decision ordering them to pay. In June, the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission said foreign streamers must contribute five per cent of their annual Canadian revenues to a fund devoted to producing domestic content, including local TV and radio news. Big global streamers like Netflix and Disney Plus launched court challenges of that order, which the regulator made under the Online Streaming Act. Earlier this month, the Federal Court of Appeal agreed to hear the case. [On December 23rd,] a judge said [that] the streamers won't have to make the payments, estimated to be at least \$1.25 million each annually, until that court process plays out. The parties have agreed to an expedited schedule, meaning the court hearing would take place in June before the bulk of the money is due in August." (The Canadian Press)

Local News on medium and small market Radio and TV stations, and even some of their owners, are now in jeopardy, having planned for this funding. Corus, for example, set records for their lowest stock price ever, after breaking the previous 10 cent per share so-called bottom. No word yet on the banks and other creditors, who also recently increased the money available to some broadcasters, including Corus, based, at least partially, on the guarantee of CRTC funding of local News.

- 1430 KAMP CO Aurora – 12/31 0922 – With talk of “BetMGM,” “BetQL stuff,” “wagers,” and “games.” It’s been a while! Poor. **(JJR-MI)**
- 1430 KNSP MN Staples – 1/2 0817 – Poor, with mentions of “HyVee studios” and “Minnesota Vikings” . . . “on the Fan.” At one time, a lot more common. **(JJR-MI)**
- 1430 WRDN WI Durand – 12/25 0908 – Poor, with ad for ‘Adams Super Service’ in downtown Durand, and another including “. . . On Main Street in Durand. **(JJR-WI)**
- 1440 KCHE IA Cherokee – 12/21 0831 – Christmas music; blocks of short Holiday greetings from local merchants between songs; call letter IDs. Fair and occasionally on top, with no sign of Wray. **(JW-CO)**
- 1440 KCHE IA Cherokee – 1/2 0816 – Poor, but alone, with many Iowa mentions in a newscast. **(JJR-MI)**
- 1440 WEBR NY Niagara Falls – 1/1 0827 – “105-3 and WEBR” into ‘Sundown’ by Gordon Lightfoot. Poor, but Alone. **(JJR-MI)**
- 1440 KPUR TX Amarillo – 12/19 0650 – Amid the QRM and long, deep fades came an ad for ‘Oliver Saddle Shop’ on Plains Boulevard, but no city. Of course it took a long fade-out at the TOH. Doing a web search, I found an ‘Olivers’ in Amarillo. So . . . it very well was KPUR, which has a sliver of their night pattern headed in my direction. **New here! (BH-TX)**
- 1450 KATE MN Albert Lea – 12/17 1759 – Call letter ID, possibly a legal ID, in QRM; not sure what followed. Seldom heard here. **(JW-CO)**

- 1450 KBMW MN Breckenridge – 12/16 1849 – “The most Country on the radio – 1450 KBMW” wafting above the noise. Rare here. (JW-CO)
- 1450 KMMS MT Bozeman – 12/16 0810 – Fair in QRM, with weather, ads, and ID as “AM 1450 KMMS, where Montana talks.” (JW-CO)
- 1450 KZZJ ND Rugby – 12/9 0833 – Presumed, with Rugby high school sports results. No ID heard. (JW-CO)
- 1450 KZZJ ND Rugby – 12/12 0926 – Very poor, with “. . . invest in Rugby’s future, shop Rugby. . .” and fade out and fade-in with “. . . KZZJ 92.1.” **Heard again on 12/27 @ 0854** – Very poor, but heard 701 area code, calls, “Friday morning . . .” and oldies. (They’re C&W, but Friday they have OLDies). (JJR-MI)
- 1450 KSIW OK Woodward – 12/16 1800 – Programming note: “. . . on WWLS The Sports Animal.” Presumed. (JW-CO)
- 1450 WRCE WI Richland Center – 1/5 0822 – ‘Music of the Stars’ on Civic Media network. Poor, but Alone. Rare. (JJR-WI)
- 1450 KJCV WY Jackson – 12/12 0728 – Tentative, with Bott program note, ad for ‘Good Samaritan Center’ in Jackson. No ID heard. (JW-CO)
- 1460 KXNO IA Des Moines – 12/1 0955 – “Des Moines’ sports station 106.3 KXNO,” followed by ads; partially readable Legal ID at 1000:30. (JW-CO)
- 1460 KHOJ MO St. Charles – 12/19 0915 – Solemn carols sung by choir. Man talks about “contributions to your local Catholic radio station,” and gives a complete postal address which exactly matches the one in the NRC log. Fair with some fading on the car radio. **Heard again** with hymns **on 12/31 @ 1436** – Strong daytime reception while testing a 100 meter wire coupled to the Sony. **New, for Missouri #03.** (EB-AL)
- 1460 CJOY ON Guelph – 12/14 1050 – ‘Livin’ on a Prayer’ by Bon Jovi and a barely heard “CJOY.” Poor, with a weak KXNO. (JJR-MI)
- 1470 KWSL IA Sioux City – 12/1 0939 – Older Latino hits; IDs as “La Preciosa 98.7 y 1470”; also heard “mas y mejor variedad” slogan; Spanish and English ads noted a bit later. Fair and alone at times. (JW-CO)
- 1470 KLCL LA Lake Charles – 12/06 1831 – PSA for ‘ssa.gov,’ ID: “Listen live online wherever you are at talk1470.com” [this website belongs to KLCL], secure the future of AM radio.” Talk program. Strong peak, fade out. **Louisiana #13.** (EB-AL)
- 1470 KHND ND Harvey – 12/17 0916 – Very poor, with “1470 The Mix – KHND” into FOX News. Still in a bit better one hour later. **In the air once more on 12/30 @ 0948** – “31 degrees at 8:49, 1470 the Mix – KHND, FOX News coming up.” Poor, but Alone. (JJR-MI)
- 1470 KHND ND Harvey – 12/20 0951 – “We are The Mix, AM 14-70 KHND Harvey,” followed by ads; Fox News Business Update at 0952. Fair signal on peaks. (JW-CO)
- 1470 WVOL TN Berry Hill – 12/31 1444 – Weak, with Urban Contemporary Oldies under WRGA. On the Sony coupled to a 100 meter wire. Parallel to webstream. (EB-AL)
- 1480 KSDR SD Watertown – 12/15 1700 – Two PSAs, Legal ID and “Sound of Watertown” into Fox Sports. Poor, but alone. Rare! (JJR-MI)
- 1490 KXRA MN Alexandria – 12/25 0905 – With Town Hall News, then “KXRA 1490, 100.3 and 105.7.” Poor, but on top. (JJR-WI)
- 1490 KIBM NE Omaha – 12/30 0854 – Poor, with “. . . taking you back in time with your favorite hits . . . Boomer Radio” into a 70s Oldie. (JJR-MI)
- 1490 KOVC ND Valley City – 12/28 0922 – Weather from ‘NewsDakota.com,’ then a ‘KOV’C’ jingle into C&W. Poor, but Alone. (JJR-MI)
- 1500 WFED DC Washington – 12/25 2020 – Interview about the logistics of a presidential transition. Later at ToH, ID as “Federal News Radio,” then legal ID beginning with “WFED Washington” plus more affiliates, into ‘WTOP News and Traffic.’ **First DC station in my log.** (EB-AL)
- 1510 KTTT NE Columbus – 12/29 0945 – Poor, but alone, with “K-Triple T” into ‘Engine, Engine Number Nine’ by Roger Miller. (JJR-MI)
- 1520 WZBU WI New Holstein – 12/30 0829 – Poor, with “. . . call #920 a/c.” Talk format “WISS” and this are 100% //; news is ABC on the hour. (JJR-MI)
- 1530 WLCO MI Lapeer – 12/14 0921 – Very poor, with “Merry Christmas from The Bridge.” For a change, WCKY was gone. (JJR-MI)
- 1540 WBNL IN Boonville – 12/06 1848 – Ad for RV storage in “Newburgh, Indiana,” with an 812 phone number. Strong in a peak, then gone again. Also heard on 12/18 @ 1847, popping up once from underneath KGBC with slogan which sounded like “The beacon is back, 99.9 FM and 1540 AM,” Christmas music. (EB-AL)
- 1540 KGBC TX Galveston – 12/18 1830 – Spanish pop music, several Houston references, and ads with 832 phone numbers. Frequent IDs as “Power Ciento-cinco punto tres” (105.3) Fading in and out on the car radio while driving. **Texas #24.** (EB-AL)

- 1550 KESJ MO Saint Joseph – 12/30 0918 – Poor, with “Joe Town 107-5 plays the Christmas Hits.” No usual WHIT. (JJR-MI)
- 1550 WEVR WI River Falls – 12/27 0922 – Poor, with “. . . the weather forecast for our immediate area . . .” and FADE out/in, then “WEVR.” Rare! (JJR-MI)
- 1560 WSEZ IN Paoli – 12/31 1525 – Van Morrison song, ID as “WSEZ 98.7” and multiple references to ‘Orange County,’ then more oldies matching webstream. Weak, but to catch a 250 Watt station at 574 km/356 miles in the middle of the day is a very nice result of hanging 300 feet of wire in some trees. **New, for Indiana #10.** (EB-AL)
- 1560 KBEW MN Blue Earth – 1/1 0820 – With Satellite-fed OLDies today vs regular local stuff. Poor, with KLNG in back. (JJR-MI)
- 1570 WWCK MI Flint – 12/27 0849 – Poor, but alone, with Lady Marmalade and “K107.3. No WLKD, etc. (JJR-MI)
- 1590 WPIW IN Mt. Vernon 12/30 1845 – Announcement about High School sports information on website ‘poseycountyradio.co,’ followed by ID: “Stay tuned as we have more of your Country favorites coming up on 98.9, WPIW.” (SD-MN)
- 1590 KGFK MN East Grand Forks – 12/15 0933 – Heard “Hugo’s will be closed Christmas Day,” followed by weather . . . on Rock 95.” Poor. (JJR-MI)
- 1600 KLEB LA Golden Meadow – 12/31 – Noted mobile **early afternoon** with Gerry Bishop at the wheel, in Fort Walton Beach – closer to the coastline where it typically would propagate daytime before going unnoticed after Hurricane Ida destroyed the transmitter in 2021 – returning to 1600 kHz on April 27, 2022 per Wiki. It’s indeed still active, but sadly, at least weekdays daytime, has digressed to Oldies (Toto, The Eagles, Fleetwood Mac, Roxanne). Local spots and “The All New 102.7 Rajun’ Cajun” slogan (K274DE is the 102.7 MHz translator). So they’re still using the ‘Rajun’ Cajun’ branding, but where’s what used to be all Cajun music? (TK-FL)
- 1600 KUSH OK Cushing – 12/19 2248 – First potential log in the 1600 soup, with a reference to ‘101.5 FM.’ Confirmed the next morning, **12/20 @ 0659:** Country music and ID: “This is KUSH . . . Oklahoma’s Americana Station,” stronger in the peaks, but stations on 1600 are taking quick turns fading in and out. **Heard AGAIN on 12/20 @ 1829** – “The Voice of Oklahoma, Sixteen Hundred KUSH, Cushing, and 1600KUSH.com. This is news from the Oklahoma News Network.” Fair, but fading, this time even on caradio. **New, for Oklahoma #07.** (EB-AL)
- 1600 WUCT TN Algood – 12/19 2306 – First, a short ID fading out of the 1600 soup: “Newstalk 94.1.” Better heard on **12/20 @ 1749** with talk about Alabama football, then ads for a pharmacy in downtown Cookeville, ‘?? Power Equipment’ in Cookeville. “Newstalk 94.1.” Ad for ‘Charles Stone Heating and Cooling’ [another Cookeville business]. Now strong, dominating the channel at this time of day. **New, for Tennessee #40.** (EB-AL)
- 1600 KRVA TX Cockrell Hill – 12/20 0817 – Vietnamese music. At 0830 an ID: “KRVA [. . .] Cockrell Hill” and then an instrumental version of the US National Anthem by a marching band. Quite strong. **New station, for Texas #25.** (EB-AL)
- 1600 WKXX WV Wheeling – 12/22 1900 – Signal came up just in time for a TOH ID: “This is AM 1600 WKXX Wheeling, and FM 97.7 and AM 1370, WVLY Moundsville.” **NEW! West Virginia #5.** (SD-MN)
- 1670 WMGE GA Dry Branch – 12/20 1705 – With ‘iHeart’ ads and “HipHop and RnB.” Frequent IDs between songs,. Could not make out call at first, nor find matching streams. Finally ID: “Here’s the latest 97.9 WIBB . . .” which is WMGE’s sister FM station in Macon’s. Routing error or format change? **When heard again on 12/29 at 1639,** they were still going with Hip Hop, very long commercial breaks, and IDs for “97.9 WIBB.” But there is also some almost-white noise emanating from the same transmitter, fading in and out in sync with the music. (EB-AL)
- 1680 WOKB FL Winter Garden – 12/17 1853 – Hip Hop and promo: “When I’m in Orlando, I listen to Inspiration 16-80 AM and 100.7 FM to get the hot and soul.” Ads for a local event . . . “DJ for rent.” Full ID: “You’re listening to Inspiration 1680 AM WOKB Winter Garden, W264DV 100.7 FM Kissimmee and around the world at WOKBradio.com. Inspiration on 16-80 AM and 100.7 FM Kissimmee.” Strong, and without interference today on the car radio. (EB-AL)
- 1680 WTTM NJ Lindenwold – 12/20 1650 – Spanish songs and announcement, tropical music matching webstream. Behind WOKB. **New station,** and **first** “proper” **New Jersey** station if not counting NYC and Philly-based transmitters on New Jersey soil. (EB-AL)

- 1089 **UNITED KINGDOM** *TalkSport* synchros DEC 21 0600 – Fair; 6 o’clock time check and news parallel 1053 kHz. DEC 28 1000 – Presumed source of het against 1090 WBAL. DEC 29 0500 – Good; “TalkSport News, from the Sky News Centre at 5...” [Conti-NH]
- 1413 **SPAIN** *RNE5* synchros DEC 30 0100 – Fair; “Radio Nacional de España, servicios informativos.” The best of the Spain synchro frequencies tonight. [Conti-NH]
- 1467 **FRANCE** *TWR Roumoules* DEC 27 2300 – One cycle of *TWR* interval signal then promptly off the air as usual. [Conti-NH]
- 1476 **BENIN** *TWR Parakou* DEC 18 0434 – JBA carrier, soon blocked by start of some local noiseblob. The only 9/kHz carrier audible in complete MW bandscan. Surely it’s *TWR* Benin, which starts at 0419, so I have been checking for it often. I guess right now higher-latitude paths from Europe are attenuated. Per mwlist, it’s 150 or 200 kW, but with outdated sked; the only possible competition powerwise would be 200 kW from UAE. [Hauser-OK]

- 660 **MEXICO** *XEZF Monterrey, NL* DEC 16 0605 – Choral national anthem, fades by 0607 finish. Most likely *XEZF*. DEC 27 2315 – Dominant signal is Spanish with spirited sports talk, on my north/south antenna only. Must be *XEZF*, the only sports format in Mexico or USA. [Hauser-OK]
- 720 **MEXICO** *XEDE La Lupe, Saltillo, Coah.* DEC 30 0756 – “Lo que quieres escuchar, La Lupe, 105.7,” overcoming WGN. [Hauser-OK]
- 730 **MEXICO** *XESOS La Ranchera 97.3, Agua Prieta, Son.* DEC 31 0559 – Highly tentative at best, with end of a Mexi-tune, clear “La Ranchera” presumed slogan by man, lost to all the others on the channel. Seems a long shot being that it’s 2 kW best and nearly on the west coast of Mexico, but no U.S. stations appearing with this slogan located. No trace of *XEX* for hours of checks. [Krueger-FL]
- 739.98 **MEXICO** *XEQN Torreón, Coah.* DEC 16 0608 – LAH against KRMG 740.00, no doubt *XEQN*. [Hauser-OK]
- 750 **DOMINICAN REPUBLIC** *HIDB R.Jesús, Santiago de los Caballeros* JAN 3 0059 – Fair; theme song, woman singing “Radio Jesús.” [Conti-NH]
- 770 **CUBA** *R.Artemisa, La Salud* JAN 3 0300 – Over/under WABC; tropical music montage with raygun effects between cuts, parallel 1020 kHz, not parallel 670, 1180, and 1620 kHz, so this is *R.Artemisa*, not *R.Rebelde*. [Conti-NH]
- 770 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde, Las Tunas* DEC 20 0758 – Under WABC; cuckoo sounders. [Conti-NH]
- 810 **BAHAMAS** *ZNS3 Freeport* JAN 03 2155 – Announcer identifying as, what sounded like, “1540 AM, the national voice of the Bahamas.” Website provided parallel audio. Frequent uptempo music. Coming in fairly well during the period with a couple stations underneath. [Weber-PA]

DEC 31 0450 – Whooper/wobbler mixing with WWL, none vs 1040 WHO right now. [Hauser-OK] JAN 3 1059 – Through self-destructive wobbling; “Radio Reloj,” beep, time check, and RR Morse code. [Conti-NH]

- 940 **PUERTO RICO** WIPR San Juan JAN 3 0400 – Fair; program of Puerto Rican salsa music, “la mejor música... por 940 AM,” and “Dame la Mano Paloma” by José Nogueras e Ismael Miranda. JAN 4 0300 – Poor; promo by woman, “...en Deportes 940 AM.” [Conti-NH]
- 960 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, Guantánamo JAN 3 0400 – Over/under WFIR; time marker, RR Morse code, syncopated clock, and woman with titulares. [Conti-NH]
- 970 **MEXICO** XEJ *La Jota Mexicana* 970, Cd. Juárez, Chih. DEC 30 0745 – Romantic songs in Spanish. DFed toward west/southwest so not CDMX Fórmula. At 0752, “La Jota Mexicana 970” with horny music. Dominant and easy pull by local 960 KGWA. IRCA Mexican Log lacks that slogan. It’s news/talk but also lots of music. 1/1 kW, but NRC Pattern Book showed ND with larger daytime circle. [Hauser-OK]

Presumed HJAQ which is regular vs never received co-channel HJJG *R.Nacional*. RCN parallels at 760 and 770 not coming in at this time. [Conti-NH]

- 1020 **CUBA** *R.Artemisa*, Bahía Honda JAN 3 0300 – Over/under KDKA; tropical music montage with raygun effects between cuts, parallel 770 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 1040 **CUBA** *R.Mayabeque*, Güines DEC 22 0224 – Wobbler is JBA under WHO and Florida. Not heard on 870 this time. DEC 27 0533 – Wobbler/whooper audible under WHO, and likewise under 870 WWL. [Hauser-OK]

I check almost every night just in case; it used to be a regular JBA carrier, so far east from the rest of Kiribati, about the same longitude as Hawaii, that it could be detected as early as 0430 UTC. [Hauser-OK]

PAN-AMERICAN DX

- 530 **CUBA** CMBQ *R.Enciclopedia*, Villa Maria OCT 26 0958 – Solid signal almost the entire weekend, even during the blackouts. Usual easy listening format and female announcer.
- 530 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Guantánamo//Caribe OCT 28 0257 – Under *R.Enciclopedia*; musical programming parallel 1180 et. al.
- 540 **MEXICO** XETX *La Ranchera de Paquimé*, Nuevo Casas Grandes, Chih. OCT 26 1059 – On top of channel with ID and distinctively amateur male choral version of Mexican anthem, which they usually air at this unusual hour of 5 a.m. local time. 685 miles.
- 540 **MEXICO** XEHS *La Mejor*, Los Mochis, Sin. OCT 28 0058 – On top of channel with Navojoa Mayos vs. Los Mochis Cañeros beisbol and “La Mejor FM” liners. 958 miles.
- 550 **MEXICO** XEPL *La Superestación*, Cd. Cuauhtémoc, Chih. OCT 28 0300 – Under KFYI and KCRS; full FM/AM ID. They don’t seem to be airing the 3+1 800Hz time pips I was hearing just after top-of-hour last year. 841 miles.
- 560 **COLOMBIA** HJGS *R.Nacional de Colombia*, Tunja OCT 28 0259 – Audible briefly with Sunday night classical music program parallel 680 kHz. About 3433 miles. New, Colombia #33.
- 570 **COLOMBIA** HJND *R.Nacional de Colombia*, Bogotá OCT 28 0259 – Audible briefly with Sunday night classical music program parallel 680 kHz. 3428 miles.
- 570 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, Santa Clara OCT 25 0953 – Under KWML (which may be running day power at night again); usual news programming and clock ticks.
- 580 **MEXICO** XELRDA *La Rancherita del Aire*, Piedras Negras, Coah. OCT 26 1100 – Good signal over WIBW; morning greetings by male and female announcers. Although the AM received the new call sign (XELRDA) when they repurchased their old (XEMU) AM license at auction several years ago, IDs only mention their FM, 103.7 XHEMU. 1047 miles.
- 590 **CUBA** *R.Musical Nacional*, La Julia OCT 26 0152 – Good signal with Ravel’s “Bolero” parallel 1140 kHz.
- 610 **MEXICO** XEGS *La GS*, Guasave, Sin. OCT 26 0159 – Under KVNU and one or two other stations; AM/FM ID. Like most Mexican stations, they were heard much less often than usual this year due to the blackouts. 989 miles.
- 620 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Colón OCT 26 1000 – Barely audible with fast 9-note interval signal parallel 670 et. al.

- 630.09 **unID** OCT 28 0158 – On the SESE (Colombia) wire, a station playing Mexican AC music (the one song Soundhound could identify was “Volverá” by Alfredo Olivas in 2020). All 4 surviving Mexican AMs are well south of the direction the antenna was aimed (135, 136, 137 and 150 degrees vs. antenna direction of 121 degrees); however, the radio blackouts were starting to lift (briefly) at this hour, and stations from Mexico City and Guadalajara were suddenly coming in on this wire. So far no stations have been reported broadcasting at this high offset.
- 640 **COLOMBIA** HJBJ, RCN, Santa Marta OCT 26 0959 – RCN pips very weak under KFI and *R.Progreso*, parallel 770, 910, 1000 and 1020 kHz. About 3106 miles.
- 640 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Guanabacoa//Las Tunas OCT 26 0958 – Morning program with male and female announcer, including “Esta día en la Historia” feature with *R.Habana Cuba* march.
- 640 **MEXICO** XELOVE *La Lupe*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 28 0159 – In their top-of-hour liner they have started mentioning their new simulcast on 104.7 (XHLOVE), so the FM is apparently on the air now. I have not heard the new AM calls used on the air yet, and others have heard some liners that still use the old XEJUA calls. 660 miles.
- 650 **COLOMBIA** HJKH, RCN *Antena Dos*, Bogotá OCT 26 1000 – Noted briefly with RCN sounder, talk by male announcer. Heard again around this time 2 days later. About 3446 miles.
- 650 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Ciego de Avila OCT 28 0300 – Progreso top-of-hour theme music parallel 640 kHz. Relog but rare.
- 650 **unID** OCT 26 0959 – On the SESE (Colombia) wire, I seem to have 2 possible “Universal” jingles, suggesting HIAT, still needed here. 1000 UTC is the only chance we western DXers have to catch a Dominican station on day power with a full path of darkness to our location. A minute later, HJKH was heard here.
- 670 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple locations OCT 28 0159 – Under KLTT; music and *R.Rebelde* liners. Many echoes were noted, probably more than the 4 previously noted on this channel. The same was true at this hour 2 nights earlier.
- 680 **COLOMBIA** HJZO *R.Nacional de Colombia*, Barranquilla OCT 28 0259 – Steady signal under KNBR; Sunday night classical music program parallel 570 kHz. 3101 miles.
- 690 **MEXICO** XEWW, PSN/*La Gigante/LV del Pueblo*, Rosarito, BC OCT 25 0259 – On top of channel with PSN promos, including slogans and IDs for the other PSN-operated stations (1270 XEAZ *La Romántica*, 1700 XEPE *TuDN Deportes*, etc.). Since PSN took over, they have been announcing 100kW. This seems unlikely, but PSN owner does have a long history of exceeding the licensed power of his stations. 496 miles.
- 690 **unID** OCT 26 0959 – On the SESE (Colombia) wire, 5+1 1000Hz time pips at the top of the hour. This was after sunrise in Argentina. Monitoring the web streams of the other surviving South American stations on 690, only HJCZ runs these pips, but I can’t find any other identifying details. HJCZ is still needed here.
- 710 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple locations OCT 26 0401 – Chimes and Cuban anthem parallel 670, 1550, etc.
- 720 **MEXICO** XEJCC *La Zeta 103.5 FM*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 25 1159 – Fast adult choral version of Mexican anthem, ID and “buenos días” announcement by male announcer. They still seem to sign on just before 6 a.m. local time, but they occasionally forget they are a daytimer, and remain on the air past their traditional sign-off time of 8 p.m. 663 miles.
- 730 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, La Fe, Isla Juventud OCT 28 0359 – Cuban anthem parallel 640 kHz. Fairly rare here.
- 730 **MEXICO** XEHB *La Mas Picuda*, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. OCT 26 0301 – Faded up under XESOS and XEX; “La Mas Picuda” liners. 965 miles.
- 730 **MEXICO** XESOS *La Ranchera 97.3*, Agua Prieta, Son. OCT 26 0958 – Good signal, mostly alone on channel, with FM/AM ID mentioning 25 kW and including secondary slogan “una emisora de Grupo Radiofónico ZER.” 591 miles.
- 739.943 **MEXICO** XEQN *R.Fórmula*, Torreón, Coah. OCT 26 0159 – Mexican PSA and *R.Fórmula* programming. Still off frequency after all these years. 1125 miles.
- 760 **MEXICO** XEEB *La Zeta 98.5*, Cd. Obregón, Son. OCT 27 1206 – During the radio blackouts, when none of the Mexican stations normally heard here were coming in, this station was on top of the channel with a beautiful signal, parallel web stream with regional Mexican music and numerous “La Zeta” liners. 828 miles. New, Sonora #25 and México #233.
- 770 **COLOMBIA** HJJX, RCN, Bogotá OCT 26 0959 – RCN pips very weak under KKOB, parallel 640, 910, 1000 and 1020 kHz. 3444 miles.
- 770 **CUBA** *R.Artemisa*, La Salud OCT 25 1000 – Cuban anthem parallel 1020 barely audible under KKOB.

I am a new club member and would like to add my musings. I have been MW DX-ing since the mid 1960s. I was tired of the music played on my local stations, so I started tuning around on the MW dial to find something new. I was bitten by the DX bug and it has never left.

I am now living in Warner Robins, Georgia, and have begun logging my catches more faithfully. I have an RSPdx r2, an IC-7100, and just received a brand new Qodosen DX-286. The only antenna I have so far is a Chameleon TD Lite, which is about 25 feet in the air. I am retired and living on a budget, so I will be content with what I have. I am happy to be a club member. Thanks to Larry van Horn for the DX Central livestream. This is what led me to the club.

Tim Hall, Chula Vista CA (DXing from the NV-UT Border near Baker, NV)

The Border Inn DXpedition for 2024 took place the last weekend of October. This was a challenging one because the geomagnetic conditions were so tough. Due to all the auroral conditions throughout the year, I had spent a lot of time researching South American targets. Unfortunately, "radio blackouts" really hurt my ability to hear stations from Mexico and South America most of the weekend. Three of the four nights had mostly poor conditions. The second night was closer to normal. Thankfully, that was high school football night so I made a lot of recordings. The DXpedition was originally scheduled for 5 nights, but we had to wrap up one day early due to an impending snowstorm that was expected to drop 5 inches of snow, possibly turning to ice. Besides adding to the already-difficult task of manually rewinding 8000 feet of wire, this would have made for a dangerous drive home, as every route home from the Border Inn has to traverse at least one high mountain pass that would be subject to chain requirements or closure. I ended up with 130 recordings, slightly fewer than usual. During the brief gaps between the radio blackouts, several good new catches were logged, including 3 Colombians, a 3kW Venezuelan, 4 Mexicans (including XEPL in Chiapas, which is now broadcasting around 1039.761 - 1039.769), a Cuban, some low-power stations from Nebraska and South Dakota, graveyarders KNSN-1240 and KZZJ-1450, and even a few long-distance TIS stations on 1710. New east-of-Mississippi catches so far include WISN-1130 and WCRT-1160. I'll be reviewing recordings until sometime around early August, when I'll start bringing my station list up to date and choosing my targets for Border Inn 2025. 73 Tim

When it rains, it pours! The E/W Flag developed more issues, and it now has an open feed line. I've been using the same salvaged RG-58/U for 10 years or so. Doing research now to convert to CAT5, RMHAM has some that is not quite the right stuff for our installations, so I'll see about getting a

couple hundred feet from them. This will entail some 9:1 baluns being wound and substituted for the 16:1 baluns that match the Flag to the 50Ω coax. To make matter worse, the Wellbrook loop has starting being "Omni-directional"! After some inquiries on the IRCA list, a couple of the knowledgeable antenna gurus (many thanks to Colin Newell and Everett Sharp) confirmed my suspicions that I either have a bad connection or broken wire between the loop and the amplifier. I bought a replacement amplifier from Everett a while back, so I can just clean up the screw areas on the loop and swap the amplifier out. Both projects need warmer weather to reappear and no winds, at almost 75 I am really careful about ladder work! Notable additions to the log 11/28 at 0600 "Noon to 5 on AM 1450 and FM 103.1 KEYL" Long Prairie MN a new one for me and looks like a new GYDXA record at 664 miles. 12/06 at 0700 "KSTA Coleman Texas Good morning" sign on, I taped this 250 watter for the collection. Last logged in 1988. Many more of the usual suspects have been heard to bring the log up to 431 so far this season. Til next time 73

It has now been 60 years since I first heard WBZ-1030 Boston MA. For several years, it remained my most distant station heard from the suburb of Vancouver, Canada, where I grew up. I still have the QSL card for that first reception. In mid-October 1964, I had heard three stations from New York City, WNBC-660, WABC-770 and WCBS-880, which had been my most distant stations heard, before WBZ. I did not yet know about QSL cards in October so it was years before I got my QSL cards from them.

WBZ instantly became my favorite station to listen to, thanks to their Top 40 format that somehow managed to play most of the hits before anyone else that I could hear, with WLS-890 Chicago IL previously holding that honor. DX conditions that Winter of 1964-65 were very good and it seemed like I could listen to WBZ every evening, either while writing reception reports to radio stations or doing homework. Yes, I was in my last year of Elementary School, Grade 7, but we already had homework.

I still fondly remember those days when there were so many Clear Channels with only one station on the frequency at night among the remaining signatories of the Havana Treaty; Cuba pulled out after Castro came to power in 1959. If I was not hearing that one station, I could be hearing a foreign station beyond the Havana Treaty countries. Most notably, TGJ-880 from Guatemala when they were still playing marimba music and YNX-750 from Nicaragua. Or any of a number of stations in Cuba. I was still at an age where my parents would not let me stay up much past 10:00 PM, so this was all evening reception.

In a sort of premonition of the upcoming doubling up on the Clear Channels, I still distinctly remember asking myself why the FCC was protecting the zero listeners that WBZ had in Washington State. When KTWO Casper WY moved from 1470 to 1030, I mourned the loss of WBZ and never was able to hear WBZ with KTWO on the air. Which still gives me a nostalgic joy here in Edmonton where WBZ is usually quite listenable by nulling KTWO, even if WBZ no longer plays music.

Band conditions here in December have been all over the place just like the weather. We've had nights where only the strong locals were heard and then a few nights where I was able to log some new East Coast stations and 2 new Canadians and one new Ohio station, all of which was reported to this issue's Domestic DX East. I was hoping to do an IQ recording on New Year's Eve but when a major thunderstorm started, I took the safe route and disconnected the SDR and all the antennas. Taking advantage of an unusually warm day, I laid out a new Loop on Ground antenna and have been playing around with various configurations including using the original homebrew matching transformer, connecting it up with a 15 foot high Low Noise Vertical, terminating it with a 0-500 ohm variable resistor and using a professionally made matching transformer actually meant for a Beverage on Ground. With the resistor set at 250 ohms, it seems to work best on frequencies above 40 meters. When it warms up again, I'll see if I can find a setting that works better on the lower frequencies. And, if I can figure out a way to get a wire up in the 30 foot tall Blue Spruce at one side of my backyard, I'd love to put up an E-W Flag. No matter how many videos I watch or articles I read, my technical understanding remains very basic, so I always end up employing the trial and error method - fun, but not necessarily efficient. 73



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
