The number of anomalies that don't get reported to the FCC ... stations off the air for part or all of the day, stations operating with less than their licensed facilities, stations running day power at all hours, stations off frequency ... these continue to multiply even as those stations that do notify the FCC, as they are required to do, also grow. We do our best to keep track of all of these, but something close to 10 percent of all licensed AM station in the United States are either silent or operating under STAs different from their licensed parameters. Everything that gets reported to the FCC does show up here in AM Switch, but your eyes (and ears!) help a great deal as we try to keep track of what's actually happening on the ground and on the air!

Back in three weeks ... DX is slowing down but it's not done yet for the season, so keep your reports coming!

As mentioned previously, the CRTC is not making any decisions, or even holding Public Hearings, until the next federal government takes power. Results of the April 28 election will be known almost immediately, but it could take a while to form a new government if no party wins a majority of seats. Based on current polls, there is likely to be no obvious Coalition of Parties with shared values.

With no CRTC News to report, a previous topic of this column, the **Qodosen SR-/DX-286** is worth revisiting with RadioJayAllen.com's April 5 update. When posted on Facebook, some owners reported making the same discoveries as Jay. Nonetheless, anything that increases the AM sensitivity ratings for a radio from three to five stars bears repeating. Jay rated the radios three stars when run on batteries (one rechargeable button-top 18650 Li-ion battery) with the internal ferrite rod antenna.

When switched to the whip antenna, it scores five stars but only in very quiet areas, as the whip is not directional and is extremely susceptible to local RFI from any direction, including the internal display circuitry, which varies on a unit-by-unit basis.

Jay's big discovery was that five star sensitivity was also possible without the RFI. He got these results with a tuned passive loop, testing both the Kaito AN-100 and the Terk AM Advantage, using a cable to plug into the Qodosen's aux antenna input, and enabling the Qodosen's 20 dB antenna amplifier.

As an added bonus, those loops are a lot more directional than the Qodosen's rather short internal ferrite rod antenna. This is very important when trying to get a tight null on a dominant station, to hear a weaker station from a different direction. RFI may still be a problem for two separate reasons. The predecessor to the Terk and Kaito loops was a Radio Shack model with its hardwired unshielded twin lead with tinned ends for the pair of screws or similar bare wire connectors found on many DX receivers 50+ years ago. That twin lead functioned as an excellent antenna for receiving local RFI. Back in the 1960s, larger home-made loops had clear instructions in their published plans to connect them to a receiver with a grounded shielded coax, rather than 'lamp cord,' the primary source of twin lead back then.

The second source of RFI is the display circuitry on the Qodosen radios. The amount of RFI varies dramatically from unit to unit, arguably a manufacturing quality issue, which is quite surprising given the build quality of these radios. There is a setting to turn off the display after some period of inactivity. Unfortunately, every touch of a button or knob, including the volume, turns the display back on. This can be more than just annoying, becoming hard on the ears, as you try to set the right

volume level for clear listening without the RFI from the display, and have to wait for the potentially very loud noise from the RFI while the display comes on as you adjust the volume, until it automatically Jay's complete report goes off. https://radiojayallen.com/godosen-sr-286-am-fm-sw-high-performance-portable/ where includes the SR-286 manual, as well as a link to a report on the differences between it and the newer DX-286 DX-286. No clue in The Log, or I missed that update somehow, but radiodiscussions has a thread about 1230 KCOH: 'After their tower collapsed, their programming moved to 1380 in October of 2024.' - 940 KIXZ TX AMarillo 4/7 0730 'AMerica's First News,' then a promo for the 'AMarillo RV Road Show.' (JJR-MI)
- 950 KTNF MN Saint Louis Park 4/14 0825 With (Santina Jackson) talk of Bernie Sanders. Poor, with some KOEL. (JJR-MI)

Despite lots of atmospheric noise, and a few electrical storms, I was able to log several new stations in middle of the MW band. I'm sure at least one was heard in previous years with different call letters, but I didn't have time to go back into the logbook and check. The complete list is at Domestic DX East.

Especially in noisy conditions, I find the combination of the Airspy HF with the preamp turned on and the YouLoop to be quite effective, but continue to be frustrated by its inability to record the entire MW band at one time. Once again, I had to replace the RG-402 conductors on the YouLoop and this time I secured it around a plastic hula hoop with zip ties and hung it in a south facing window. I also experimented with using the always reliable 3 foot amplified copper loop located about in another room about 20 feet away and oriented EW combined with the YouLoop. I pulled in a few stations I

might not have received on either antenna alone but the receptions were done unattended so I have no way of knowing if the combination really made a difference. Next project will be testing the combined loops with the RSPDx. I've tried the YouLoop alone with that receiver but the lack of a preamp seems to make a difference.

I'm getting better using the AM Co-channel canceler. It's fun to be able to get rid of a 50kw local even if no other stations appear underneath. It's helpful at reducing interference on adjacent channels which seems to have gotten worse. Until a year or two ago, I never had a problem hearing WWL 870 next to WHSQ 880 (which I'll always think of as WCBS) or WGN 720 next to WOR 710 but now these require either tuning in sideband mode, playing with the IF filters or using the IF offset on the canceler.

All these "challenges" are what keeps the hobby interesting. Wishing you all lots of good DX in the weeks to come.

FCC Delete, Delete, Delete

The Federal Communications Commission has not been immune to President Trump's government shakeup. On March 12, the FCC opened docket #25-133 – better known as "Delete, Delete, Delete." This docket asked for comments on every rule & regulation people felt the Commission should eliminate. Comments were due by April 11. As I check on April 22, I see 939 comments filed – although many of them do not address broadcasting. (Many were filed by hams, and telecommunications firms are also affected and have filed.)

Below are what I feel are the most important proposals. I read every comment that appeared to be filed by a broadcast interest. I may have missed some – many were filed by individuals, and I have no way of knowing if that individual was a broadcaster, a ham, or a consumer advocate. The most interesting ones are in italics.

Note the proposal (by public broadcasting interests) to eliminate the legal ID regulation! (frankly, while the DXer in me hates the idea, the broadcaster in me says this should have gone away decades ago...)

By service:

<u>**AM**:</u>

- Consider all AM frequency change applications to be "minor" changes, not just those within 60 kHz.
- Eliminate minimum efficiency standards for antennas used by AM stations.
- Allow applications for the AM expanded band on a first-come, first-served basis, with a priority for existing stations below 1610KHz.
- Create AM "Class V," for "Virtual AM stations." A Class B, C, or D station could convert to Class V. The AM station would leave the air, but would be allowed to operate FM translators within the area it served before going virtual.
- Allow AM stations with FM translators to silence the AM station.

<u>LPFM</u>

• Create a LPAM service based on the technical model of Travelers Information Stations.

Shortwave:

- Eliminate the requirement that shortwave broadcast stations target only foreign audiences.
- Reduce the minimum powers for shortwave broadcast stations from 50 kW to 5 kW for analog operation; 1 kW for digital; 100 Watts for analog on the 11-meter band; and 20 Watts for digital on 11 meters.

Stations in general:

- *Allow non-commercial stations to sell airtime.*
- Eliminate rule canceling license if off over a year.
- Reopen closed FCC Field Offices to improve enforcement.
- Replace station-count ownership limits with covered land mass, population, and/or number of non-overlapping signals.
- *Eliminate the station identification rule.*
- Allow wireless microphones to operate in channel 37.

- Eliminate multiple-ownership regulations on AM stations, or on any station outside the top 100 markets.
- Create an expedited auction process when a license is canceled to speed return of service from a new owner.
- Require the federal government to pay for stations' EAS equipment.
- Allow non-licensees to reserve a callsign.

Here is Major League Baseball (MLB) flagship information for the 2025 season from my Internet searches. Some of the team web sites did not list the names of the announcers, and frequently when they did, the biographies mentioned information such as "For the 17th season ...", which does not tell me if the bio page has been updated for the current season. I do not save the bio pages from each season. I am assuming that, if the announcer bio page is linked in the web site menu, then it is current; there is no need to update the bio if the announcers have not changed. And sometimes I cannot determine if an announcer is on radio only, TV only, or both. On the mlb.com site for many teams, the announcers are listed under the "Roster" tab.

Any copyright statement on an mlb.com page is probably placed there automatically, even if the page content has not changed for the current season.

Please send me announcer information (and corrections).

If a network list web page has a different URL than last year and is linked in the site menu, I treated the list as current for the 2025 season; I did not compare the list with last year's list.

http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List of current Major League Baseball broadcasters has broadcaster information, and that web site has been updated for the 2025 season (last modified on 5 April 2025, at 21:44 (UTC)). But some of the references date back to 2010.

In some cases I was not sure that the network list was for the 2025 season, as many lists were undated. If a list differed from the list I downloaded last year, I treated the list as new for this season, but the list to which I was comparing already had duplicates removed. Some lists have the same station listed two or three times, each with a different city (and maybe a different state).

Some of the stations are actually translators, and I might not list the stations' official six-character call letters. The Twins' list has "FM signal" instead of the six-character call letters; I had to use radio-locator.com to get the six-character translator call letters. I assume that David Yocis will convert any call letters that I do not have correct.

I did not find the 2025 network list for the Arizona Diamondbacks (the list is unlinked and the same as 2022) and there are a few other teams whose list was the same as last year. I know from "AM Switch" that stations are constantly changing formats, so if I see a network list that contains more than a few stations and is the same as lasst yearm I assume that the list has not bee updated for the current season.

And I am not sure that I have all of the Spanish-language broadcasts listed.
