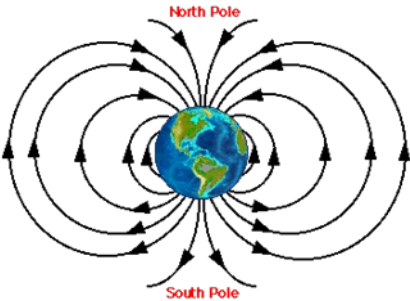

If the CRTC (Canadian Radio-television Commision) approves CBY-990 Corner Brook, Newfoundland and Labrador abandoning AM, the CBC (Canadian Broadcasting Commision) could cite the decision as a precedent in yet another attempt to win approval to shut down CBU-690 Vancouver, British Columbia. In the past, the CRTC has required CBU to remain on the air to provide coverage for remote areas out of range of CBU’s many FM repeaters. On the other hand, the CBC French language CHFA-680 Edmonton, Alberta was allowed to move to FM, eliminating coverage to many rural areas. If CBU is silenced, next to go silent could be CBK-540 Watrous, Saskatchewan, CBX-740 Edmonton and CBR-1010 Calgary, both Alberta, CJBC-860 Toronto, Ontario and CBW-990 Winnipeg, Manitoba. It has been over three decades since the CBC stated its goal of eliminating all AM broadcasting.

- 580 CFRA ON Ottawa – Several DXers are reporting that CFRA can be heard at night with a strong signal in the Northeast U.S. where the station’s published directional pattern sends almost no signal. Reported as heard on September 6 and several nights prior. (Forrester Todd)
- 750 CBGY NL Bonavista Bay – This 10 kW repeater of 4 kW CBG-1400 Gander has been reported as heard in the northern part of the Netherlands on **September 1st around 2230**. Graveyarders over 1 kW are normally restricted to North of 60 degrees Latitude but Gander is just South of the 49th parallel, which marks the U.S.-Canada border in Western Canada. (Sikke Wolters, Northern Netherlands)
- 880 CKLQ MB Brandon – Remains on the air as of **0840 on August 31**. At the station’s request, the AM license expired at **0100 September 1**, to avoid the at least \$325,000 in upgrades to the transmitter site required to renew the AM broadcasting certificate.
- 880 CKLQ MB Brandon – **9/1 – They are off the air**, moving to FM as of today. Nothing else heard this morning on 880. (SMA-MB)

- 990 CBY NL **Corner Brook** – The CBC has applied to the CRTC to move this station to FM. A public hearing will be held on October 30 to consider the matter. The transmitter site's "advanced age and timeworn condition" is the sole justification provided.
- 1440 CKIR AB **Wetaskiwin** – When 'All Sports CFRN-1260' Edmonton, Alberta went off the air, the on-air sports staff split into two: one moving to CKJR, where they were responsible for selling their own commercials, using the revenue to pay for the airtime and their own salaries; and the morning show hosts moved on-line instead. But now have expanded to FM (CKEA-FM 'Cruz-FM') on September 3rd from 0800-1100. CKEA-FM will continue their mainstream Rock format for the rest of their broadcast week. Given CHED-880's heavy emphasis on Sports, including play-by-play broadcast rights, weekday mornings will now be a three-way fight for Edmonton's Sports fans, though CHED's morning Sports strength has been diminished since the retirement of Sports Director Bryan Hall in 2023 at just shy of 90 years old!

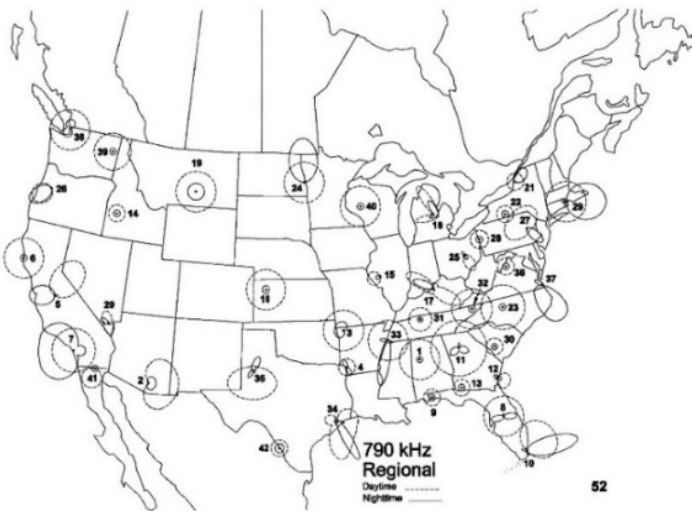

- 549 **ALGERIA** *Jil FM*, Sidi Hamadouche SEP 14 0458 – Fair; marching band national anthem. [Conti-NH]
- 773 unID SEP 7 0225 – JBA carrier amid TA bandscan, not 774, very strange. SEP 8 0427 – Again carrier not fitting into the 10 or 9/kHz frequencies, slightly stronger than any of those, and very slightly on minus side. Maybe something localish, but wonder if anyone else hear this? Not heard since, as of SEP 14. [Hauser-OK]
- 855 **SPAIN** *RNE1* synchros SEP 14 0259 – Fair; “Chams Al-Achia” by Nabyla Maan bumper music to pips, time checks and news. The best signal of the only audible parallels 639 and 684 kHz. [Conti-NH]

Transatlantic carrier search: AUG 27 0348-0356 – Transatlantic DX conditions starting to improve. First 9/kHz steps on USB, tuning downward one kHz below channels: 1053, 909, 711 kHz. Then tuning up in LSB on 9/kHz steps one kHz above channels: 585, 684, 711, 855, 882, 999, 1044, 1053, 1089, 1305 kHz. Most of those are typical of Spain or UK, except 711 could be Cuba or ‘Morocco’. No sign of Benin on 1476 or 1566 kHz. Better results on my indoor north/south short wire than on the east/west loop. SEP 1 0434-0438 – Tuning USB 1 kHz below 9/kHz channels: 684, 711, 837, 855, 1044, 1089, 1107, 1205, 1377, 1476 kHz, then at 0438-0442 tuning LSB 1 kHz above 9/kHz channels: 549, 612, 621, 684, 711, 774, 855, 882, 1296, 1413, 1422 kHz. Mostly UK and Spain. 684 by far the strongest: surely RNE Sevilla, 150/100 kW. SEP 7 0218 – Tuning upward in USB, 1 kHz below 9/kHz channels: not much, 711, 1125, 1305 kHz. And from 0226 tuning upward in LSB, 1 kHz above 9/kHz channels: 882, 1035, 1278, 1305 kHz. SEP 8 0427-0435 – Tuning upward in USB in 9-kHz steps 1 kHz below 9/kHz channels, to hear a 1 kHz het: 684, 711, 1125, 1305, 1413, 1422 kHz. Then same in LSB 1 kHz above channels: 684, 855 with SAH of about 1 Hz, 1035, 1107 SAH, 1125, 1305 SAH, to 0436 UTC. Sub-audible heterodyne refers to regular fading between two carriers on slightly different frequencies. SEP 14 0518-0526 – Via east/west loop, quite a good haul, despite storm crashes from western KS and TX. First, USB tuning upward in 9-kHz steps, 1 kHz below 9/kHz channels: 603, 684, 711, 774, 801, 837, 855, 891, 909, 999, 1053, 1107(2) beating, 1125, 1305, 1413 kHz. 684 much stronger than the rest, surely Spain, almost enough for some audio; and in second place, 855 kHz. Then from 0526, LSB tuning upward in 9-kHz steps, 1 kHz above 9/kHz channels: 531, 549, 576, 585, 603, 684, 774, 801, 837, 855, 891, 981, 999, 1053, 1179, 1305, 1503 kHz. Likely mostly Algeria, Spain, UK. [Hauser-OK]

PAN-AMERICAN DX

- 530 **CUBA** *CMBQ R.Enciclopedia*, Villa María SEP 6 0455-0502 – Good signal allowing me to better understand their format. Light instrumentals of adult standards and Top 40 hits, mostly from the 1950s and 1960s with one lead instrument and occasional pieces alternating with a second lead instrument. Just a few seconds of quiet female voice between instrumentals, except at the top of the hour, for a full minute, where there is more talk, 5-10 seconds, then 10 seconds of music, more talk, more music, etc. Within the first few seconds of the first talk at the top of the hour, Cuba is mentioned. “Smoke Gets in Your Eyes” with clarinet as lead instrument began at 0501, and accordion was the lead instrument when I tuned in at 0455. Cuba is a long way for a 10 kW signal to travel on a night with otherwise mediocre conditions, but it was definitely a regional opening as 870 WWL New Orleans was also coming in well, which is rare here given that local 880 CHED is almost the same direction as WWL. [Pearkins-AB] SEP 6 0535 – Instrumental music, including “Love is in the Air,” parallel stream. Female announcer at 0548, into “Star Wars” theme. A nice surprise! [Lupi-NH]
- 530 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Caribe//Guantánamo SEP 11 0401 – Under CHLO; midnight lullaby and choral national anthem. No sign of co-channel *R.Enciclopedia*, and this was the only *R.Rebelde* signal received with no sign of 670, 1180, and 1620 regulars. Presume most Cuba AM radio stations were off the air due to SEP 10 nationwide electricity blackout. [Conti-NH]
- 540 **MEXICO** *XEWA Los 40*, San Luis Potosí, SLP SEP 6 0502-0505 – First time I have heard them with the antenna pointing at CBK Watrous SK; in the past, I always had to try for the deepest null possible of CBK. CBK signal was poor and XEWA Mexican Top 40 music had the strongest signal with antenna SSE. Nonetheless, XEWA was only noticeable when CBK was

just airing news/talk then promo in this case. It has been over five years since XEWA has been heard here with anything more than signs of their carrier, which may be explained in the latest IRCA Mexican Log, which questions whether they have been broadcasting at full power, 150 kW, for quite a while. It sounds like they are back to full power. Heard again SEP 8 0932. [Pearkins-AB]

- 540 **MEXICO** XEHS Los Mochis, Sin. SEP 14 0539 – ID for “90.9 y 540 AM.” Among the four XEs in IRCA Mexican Log, only fit is: XEHS Sin Los Mochis 5000 2500 La Mejor, Aquí Nomás, Grupo RSN 24h REG MVS parallel XHHS 90.9FM. Staying on AM per IFT. Still active on AM 4/25 per local monitoring, and included in 7/25 IFT list. Los Mochis Cañeros béisbol 2024. XEWA SLP is no longer a factor, must be much less than 150 kW as Tim Hall also points out. [Hauser-OK]
- 570 unID AUG 25 0710 25 – Suspect *R.Nacional de Colombia*, Bogotá. Non-Cuban accented Spanish announcer, vaguely Andean harp accompanied vocal, phone number seven or more digits. Nothing U.S. Spanish listed in the new NRC AM Log. A couple 5 kW day power Mexicans also listed here though this didn’t sound Mexican, and pointing more north/south, and not parallel *R.Rebelde*. Naturally, no functioning RNdC streaming. [Krueger-FL]
- 630.1 **MEXICO** XEFB Monterrey, NL AUG 26 0703 – JBA carrier hetting 630.0 KYFI. From Tim Hall: I had this on several Border Inn DXpedition recordings last October, and could only determine that it was a Mexican station because they played the anthem around 1200 UTC. I finally found it again on the Brownsville, Texas SDR, after several previous failed attempts. It’s XEFB, on about 630.090 kHz, just as in my October recordings. They ran a children’s choral version of the anthem (1 verse), and one quick “Acústika” liner, then returned to music, not parallel 1150 XEJP which was also audible on this SDR at the same time. XEFB anthem was almost two minutes behind XEJP which finished right about 1200 UTC, and XEFB started slightly after 1200 UTC. XEJP went into Acústik program “Agronegocios”. We already knew that both 630 XEFB and 1120 XEUNO (which may currently be silent) were running music instead of the actual Acústik network programming, but it’s interesting to learn that they (well, at least XEFB) still bother to refer to themselves as “Acústika.” [Hauser-OK]
- 650 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Ciego de Avila SEP 14 0600 – Under WSM; “Cuéntale a La” by Alain Pérez parallel 640 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 670 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde* synchros SEP 14 0559 – Over/under WSCR; echoing cuckoo sounder and news indicating reception of more than one station. [Conti-NH]
- 750 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Palmira AUG 26 0704 – Whooper audible under WSB; not often, and right now not heard on 870, 1040 or anywhere else. Only Cuban listed in WRTH is *R.Progreso*, 10 kW, in Palmira, Cienfuegos. [Hauser-OK]
- 760 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Guane//Mayarí Arriba SEP 10 0402 – Faded up over XEABC with WJR cancelled out; instrumental marching band national anthem parallel 640 and 690 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 760 **MEXICO** XEABC *R.Cañon*, México, CMDX SEP 10 0401 – Fair with WJR cancelled; man, “Radio Cañon,” and woman, “La 760, la estación del valle de México.” Thanks to Andrew Brade at RealDX for help with slogan. SEP 11 0600 – Fair with WJR cancelled; choral national anthem. Lately this has been the most reliable signal from Mexico, received when others such as 730 XEX and 940 XEQ are not. [Conti-NH]
- 810 **BAHAMAS** ZNS3 Freeport SEP 3 0150 – PSA by woman announcer; very good signal. [Beu-TX]
- 810 **COLOMBIA** HJCY *Caracol Radio*, Bogotá SEP 3 0139 – News talk with male and female announcers; very good signal over WHB Kansas City. [Beu-TX]
- 810.43 unID SEP 11 0709 – JBA carrier hetting 810 WHB. Previously heard slightly higher, 810.5ish. Local birdie or real? [Hauser-OK]
- 840 **CUBA** CMHW *Doblevé*, Santa Clara SEP 10 0400 – Fair; choral national anthem, then canned ID, “Esta es Doblevé, desde Santa Clara, en el centro de Cuba.” This was before the electricity blackout occurred later that morning. [Conti-NH]
- 910 **CUBA** *R.Metropolitana*, Villa María SEP 3 0544 – Tropical music; good signal. [Beu-TX]
- 1050 **MEXICO** XED *La Gran D*, Mexicali, BC AUG 26 1400 – Totally dominating frequency for a few minutes with Mexican music followed by woman giving complete ID. Entire top of the hour ID was recorded. Here’s what I could catch with my very limited Spanish: “Desde Mexicali, ciudad donde se contenta los tres cojeres (?), capital de estado de Baja California, XED La Gran D del Mexicali. (?) mejor de importante de Cadena Enciso.” Man shouting XED. Woman: “Desde Mexicali, Baja California, México, XED, La Gran D diez y cincuenta. En los diez cincuenta kilohertz... Mexicali, Baja California. Potencia maximum... de federales...” Man shouting XED. Woman: “Radio Cadena Enciso.” Into music. New. [Brodsky-CO]

- 1080 **CUBA** *R.Cadena Habana*, Villa María SEP 13 0401 – Poor; repeating interval signal-like sounder, choral national anthem. [Conti-NH]
- 1090 **MEXICO** XEPRS Playas de Rosarito, BC AUG 26 0800 – Male with ID: “Esta es XEPRS diez noventa a... transmitiendo con cuarenta mil wats de potencia una programación de poder y proclamación de la manquerio... la radio del mar a Playas de Rosarito, Baja California, que ando a Los Angeles, San Diego, Tijuana y Ciudad de Aguacente...” New. [Brodsky-CO]
- 1141 **CUBA** unID AUG 27 0334 – Fredrik Dourén in the mwoffsets group logged this as *R.Cadena Agramonte*. [Dourén-Sweden] AUG 27 0403 – JBA carrier hetting 1140 Spanish, presumably Cuba vs XEMR on north/south antenna, while on east/west antenna English, WRVA? [Hauser-OK]
- 1180 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde* synchros SEP 12 0402 – Good with synchro echo; midnight lullaby and choral national anthem, parallel 670 kHz. 670, 1180, and others were off the air Wednesday night SEP 10-11 due to a nationwide electricity blackout, back on the air tonight. [Conti-NH]
- 1239.5 **MEXICO** XEWG Cd. Juárez, Chih. SEP 14 0533 – Het to 1240 pileup, first time noted here though many previous reports by others; in addition to a lower het on the plus side of 1240 which I commonly hear, from KCRT Trinidad CO. Per IRCA Mexican Log, XEWG has been off-frequency at about 1239.486 kHz since at least 7/23. Grupo Siete announcements sometimes include Morse code “BN”. [Hauser-OK]
- 1360 unID SEP 1 0618 – Tropical music, Spanish ID as 1360, La Mori? NRC AM Log shows the few Spanish in range are all religious. [Hauser-OK]
- 1530 **MEXICO** XESD *Arroba FM*, Silao, Gto. SEP 11 0600 – National anthem by female chorus followed by Spanish pop song; good signal peaks. Local KZNX was broadcasting an open carrier (for days), allowing DXing on this channel. [Beu-TX]
- 1530 **MEXICO** XEUR *Buenisima*, México, CMDX SEP 11 0402 – *Buenisima* ID followed by tropical music; fair signal. [Beu-TX]
- 1570 **MEXICO** XERF Cd. Acuña, Coah. SEP 8 0448 – “Coahuila en La Hora Nacional” breakaway from national feed for second half of weekly show – which I am not easily hearing on any of the other major Mex ‘clears’: 540, 730, 900, 940, 990, 1050, 1140, 1220 kHz. At 0501, XERF outroduces that, then choral national anthem, which again I am not hearing on any other frequency; 0503 followed by Coahuila anthem with male soloist, orchestra. 0505 ID, “La Poderosa, 1570, cien mil wats, y XHRF 103.9, 4 mil wats,” plus address, phones, “IMER, somos radio pública.” 0507 “La Hora de las Complacencias,” woman DJ inviting record requests, “buenos días” now lunes. So must be observing CDT as a border station, rather than HCM. While better than the others, I’m not convinced XERF is really running 100 kW. [Hauser-OK]
- 1590 unID SEP 2 0812 – Mexi-tunes and Spanish ballads nonstop – not Christian – suspect XEVOZ as pointing roughly thataway, but naturally, their streaming is broken. Lots of co-channel. [Krueger-FL]
- 1620 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple locations SEP 14 0559 – Over WDHP; cuckoo sounder parallel 670 and 1180 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 1620 **U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS** WDHP Frederiksted SEP 13 0800 – Poor; subcontinental Indian program, Davina Mar-Keep per website schedule. [Conti-NH]

Well, I wandered on a bright orange Realistic Flavoradio—CAT# 12-166.! It was a pocket sized cute little AM only transistor radio, which runs on a 9 Volt battery, from the 70's/80s. I asked the seller, "does it work", he said "maybe, not sure." I asked how much, his response, "how about 5 bucks?" SOLD! I was now the proud owner of an orange flavored Realistic AM transistor radio.

I popped open the case (no screws), you just pull it apart. Well, the old 9 Volt battery that was in it was corroded and some of the corrosion spilled out into the circuit board. No worries, I shook it out, and most of the corroded particles fell out. After a quick visit to a dollar store for a 9 Volt battery, I popped it in, and flipped the thumbwheel switch to "on" and boom!! AM Signals!!! The miracle of radio in the palm of my hands!

Not sure what it is, but the sound of AM radio through the vintage built in speaker, was music to my ears—and at five dollars, what a steal! I couldn't wait until dark to see what I could hear! I plugged in a set of mono headphones into the mono audio plug on the back of the radio, and began tuning the radio dial, which only tunes from 540Khz to 1600Khz (old "MW" allocation). Wow, does this thing perform! I tuned around 2000hrs local time (EDT), and immediately heard AM 740 KRMG, in Tulsa, OK! All the usual suspects (WSM, Nashville, WSB, Atlanta, WABC, New York, NY and 840 WHAS, Louisville, KY)---I felt like a teenager again! I tried to imagine all the kids that got these radios back in the day, and what it was like tuning in all these places at night, on this little pocket radio!

Okay, so now I am hooked! I found my old 90's "Flavoradio"—Blackberry flavor and began tuning around—again I was surprised what I could pull in with it (this one tunes 530Khz to 1710Khz). I even managed to pull in a 500 watt AM station in Marysville, OH WDLR on AM 1270---from my home in Concord, NC---with no external antenna, only the small ferrite loop inside the little radio!

Soooo, if you are looking for a refreshing challenge, dig out those old transistor radios and see what you can hear! I even coupled mine with a Radio Shack loop (similar to a Terk Advantage), and it became a "DX machine" !!—Let me know what you hear, I love to hear your stories, maybe we can have a transistor radio challenge and see what others can hear on these simple yet fun transistor radios!! Until then, happy DXing! Drop me a line at blambe1980@yahoo.com! My next musing I'll provide some "history" behind the Flavoradios!

I spent several hours going over the IQ recordings I made during my last stay in Colorado from Aug 21-26 using the Airspy HF Discovery and a You Loop hanging in a window. I was amazed to find I logged 35 new stations. The best overnights were Aug 25 and 26. Almost every frequency above 900 kHz had multiple stations coming in, either at the same time or at different times overnight. Among the new loggings were 3 from KS, 4 from NE, 3 from OK, 2 from TX, 4 from CA, 1 from IL, 2 from WY, 2 from UT, 3 from MN, 3 from SD, 1 from CO, 2 from IA, 2 from MO, 1 from ID and 2 from AZ. Those along with a few relogs were sent to the Domestic DX West column. Also logged were 2 new Mexicans.

90 Years Ago: From the September 18, 1935 issue of *DX News*: A new station in Boston, WCOP-1120 (now WWDJ-1150), just on the air in August, will dedicate its first DX program on September 22 to the NRC.

75 Years Ago: From the September 23, 1950 issue of *DX News*: Don Kaskey of Galva, Iowa was a new member to the NRC; in his introductory Musing, he reported already having 1,036 stations heard.

50 Years Ago: From the September 29, 1975 issue of *DX News*: At the NRC Convention in Hartford, Hank Wilkinson was presented the International DXer of the Year award, Jeff Falconer and Frank Dailey shared the Domestic DXer of the Year, and Skip Dabelstein was recognized as the CPCer of the year.

25 Years Ago: From the October 2, 2000 issue of *DX News*: Russ Edmunds published an explainer on sunrise and sunset DXing.

So there are now only 142 currently licensed, full-power AM stations in the United States and Canada which have not been reported to DDXD during this time. The most recent full list was included in issue #17. Can you report one more next time?

Pro Sports Networks

Here is National Football League (NFL) flagship information for the 2025 season via Internet searches. Some of the network lists are undated, so I do not know if they are for the current season. And I cannot rely on the copyright date at the bottom of each page, as that is probably added globally for the web site, even if the specific web page being viewed has not changed. And some team sites do not list the announcer team, while others have bios that are a few seasons' old, so I do not know if they are current. I found some network list pages that were not linked from the team home page or sub-section "home" page; I assume that there are "orphan" pages that are not current.

Some of the online lists cannot be cut-and-pasted, as they are graphical images. One could download the JPEG image file and then feed it through an OCR scanner, but I find it simpler to hand-compare it to the text file I have saved from last season and create a new text file.

SportsUSA will broadcast some NFL games; their web site lists eight games in September; I assume that the rest of the schedule. will be posted later. The announcers are Larry Kahn, John Ahlers, Josh Appel, Eli Gold, Bob Fitzgerald; the analysts are Brian Hhayward, Eddie Olczyk, Jim Fox, Billy Jaffee, Nick Olczyk, Scottie Upshall, Darren Eliot. As some of their stations have broadcast obligations with other teams, not all stations will broadcast all of the games.

Entravision has a network of stations that will broadcast Spanish-language NFL games: Sunday Night Football, Monday Night Football, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, Post-season Wild Card Divisional Playoffs, AFC Championship, NFC Championship, and Super Bowl. As with SportsUSA, not all stations will carry all of the network broadcasts.

These lists were checked by David Yocis against the official FCC AM and FM databases, so what you see below might differ from what you find at the URLs listed. And I am not sure that I have all of the Spanish-language stations correct.

The various gotknowhow.com sites claim to have current lists, according to the date "by Doug"; I have no idea from where Doug gets his information. All of the sites I checked still have a 2024 date. And David Yocis last year told me that some of the lists were very old.

I found some of the lists in the "News" section of the team's website under the headline "How to watch the ... pre-season game against ..." I do not know if the pre-season list of stations differs from the list for the regular season. And some of these articles only listed the flagship station(s).

Due to NFL Restrictions, online streaming of games is prohibited by affiliates. You can listen and/or watch games online via NFL.com

The announcer names are found at this URL: http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List_of_current_NFL_broadcasters That page seems to have been updated for the 2025 season, but the footnotes on that site point to web page retrievals in 2012.

There is a site <http://nflfootballtv.com/onlineradio.html> that has Internet online radio - streaming audio and video information on each team. I have no idea if that web site is current.

The Westwood One Radio Network (renamed to Dial Global Sports and in 2013 and then renamed to WestwoodOne Sports) will broadcast NFL games that occur Sunday nights, Monday nights, and Thursday nights. This URL <http://westwoodonesports.com/football-announcers/> has the list of announcers. Here are the announcer teams:

- Monday night: Kevin Harlan, Kurt Warner, Rich Eisen (studio host)
- Sunday night: Ryan Radtke & Rod Woodson or Ross Tucker, Scott Graham (studio host)
- Thursday night: Ian Eagle, Tony Boselli, Scott Graham (studio host)

As this list is the same as last year (and the 2024 station list has not yet been posted), I do not know if this announcer list reflects the 2025 season broadcasts.

Entravision, a Spanish-language network, will be broadcasting games Thursday night season kickoff, Sunday Nights, Monday Nights, and all post-season games. The web site did not list the announcers.

Globo and NFL announce partnership for broadcasts in Brazil Agreement includes coverage on all platforms, including pre-season, regular season, playoffs, games in Brazil and the iconic Super Bowl LX.
