Many thanks for your letter dated 12th December, 1977 with regards to Dominica Broadcasting Corporation reception report. Your reception report agrees with our programme log, and you were in fact listening to D.B.C. On 595KHZ. at the time stated, i.e. 745-757pm Local time 2345-2357 GMT. The taped content came to hand at a very much needed time, three days after I have carried out repairs on the Transmitter.


This Station came on the air with its first Transmission on the 1st November, 1971. We programme daily from 5.30am to 10.30pm local time 1000 hours to 0230 GMT. On 595KHA. in the MF. Band, and 88.1 MHZ. in the FM. Band, with two breaks one at 10am and another at 2pm to 4pm. But as of the 5th of this month we are on the air from 530am to 10.30pm daily except for Saturdays, Transmission closes at 12pm midnight local time 04 hours GMT.

The Island of Dominica is mountainous, it is 289.5 sq. miles and is located between Latitude 15 degrees North, and Longitude 16 degrees West. Our FM. Broadcast Transmitter is a Marconi product, B6029 with an output of 20 kw. Carrier, Impedence 500hms unbalanced, into a $\frac{1}{4}$ wave length Vertical Mast 300ft. high and is located 700ft. above sea level. The FM. TX. is a 100watts (Marti Product) made in the U.S.A. Our Studios are located in Victoria Street in down town Roseau. Main Crops of the Island, are Coconuts, Bananas, Grapefruits, and Oranges.

May I take this opportunity to pass along Greetings to yourself and Family, for a merry Christmas and a happy New Year.
