Thanks for your letter of July 4 in which you reported reception of WGSO. Thanks also for the audio tape made during the opening. I am pleased to verify the report and congratulate you on your effort of pulling us out from under the other station (possibly WADO, New York).

It is somewhat surprising to be received that well in Richmond. Our directional pattern (which is the same day and night) has a null at 23 degrees and another at 76 degrees, the latter of which provides protection to WADO.

We currently operate from a transmitter site across the Mississippi River from downtown New Orleans using a three-tower skewed array and a Gates BC-5H 5-kilowatt transmitter. Our studios are located in downtown New Orleans, about five blocks from the French Quarter.

We would welcome your visit at WGSO and WQUE-FM when you are here in September. Give me a call when you arrive in town and I'd be pleased to show you our facilities.
