This will serve to confirm your reception of a frequency check conducted by WNJH on 14 October 66 at 0013 EDST.

I want to thank you for your very fine reception report and for taking an interest in WNJH.

Let me take this chance to tell you a little about the station. We are a 1,000 watt daytime operation. As you can see from the enclosed coverage map we cover an area between Atlantic City and Philadelphia.

Our studio equipment is mainly made by Gates, consoles, turntables, etc. The transmitter is an ITA 1,000A feeding a 150 foot tower located about one mile from our main studio.

Our programming consists of "middle-of-the-road" music with extensive coverage of local news and sports.

A check of our records shows that yours is the first reception report that we have received from North Carolina. The check you reported was also QSL'ed by a listener in central Ohio.

Our frequency checks are conducted each second Friday starting at one minute past midnight eastern time. Please be listening for us again. We QSL all reception reports received.
