WEZB's studios are equiped quite differently from other radio stations. Instead of turntables being used for records, we use them for recorded comm-ercials and for the records, we use a Seeburg 200 Selectomatic. The transmitter is a Raythen and the tower is 210 feet high, located in the botton of a canyon. How we get out so well, I'll never know. Our regular program schelule is from 6:00 am CSE to local sunset time 7 days a week. We have no regular frequency check period. If you care to tune us in again we will be on the air for a special DX test broadcast // during the latter part of March. Details are in the National Radio Clab's publication, "DX News" with which I know you are very familiar.
