This is to verify your reception of WGOK on Friday Morning, April 1,1966 and its Freq. Check ending at 4:00 AM CST.

WGOK Transmits on 900 KC with a type I.T.A.-1000A Transmitter feeding 2 Towers of 250 fest, and began operations on Nov. 21,1958 and WGOK became a M.B.S. Affilate on April 2,1966.

The tone used is the dial tone was fed into a tape recorder by way of a phone patch. The Freq. Check is a 15 minute tape that is run from one of our tape machines on each freq. check. And by the way we were right on the nose of 900.000 KC.

I am afraid that I do not know of Alex Bowab but I will inquire, He would be working at WLPR FM our only all FM station in Mobile. It is rather a new station here not over a year old I think. I have had several DX Reports and most all say that CHML in Hamilton, ontario interfere with our signal.
