This is to verify your reception of WJDB on Sunday, December 2nd. I will try to answer some of the questions you asked. We do not have an early morning frequency check as Claude Grey checks us in the late afternoon. WJDB's call letters are the initials of Mr. J. Dige Bishop, owner of this station, who is also associated with WCTA in Andalusia, Alabama.

There is a dispute as to when Thomasville was founded. It was either in 1888 or 1890. As near as I can find, Thomasville received its name from a General Thomas, who was an official of the railroad. It seems he donated five hundred dollars to help start the town and they named it after him.
