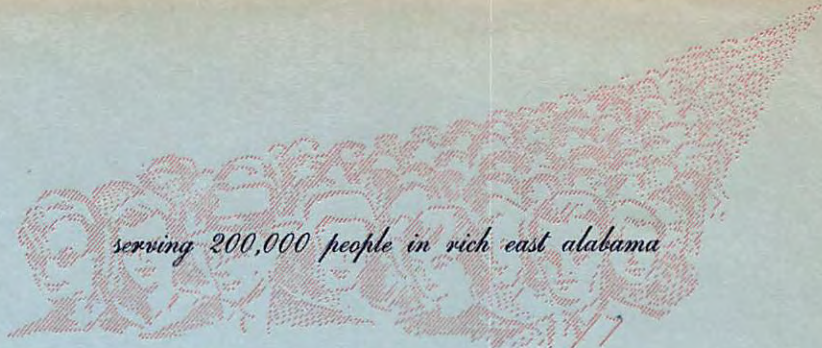

January 25, 1957.


WJHB began operations on April 26, 1956. We operate  
with a power of one K.W. Daytime only. The Call  
letters do stand for something. Johnston, Hemphill &  
Butler.

We are only about 50 air line miles from Birmingham,  
so Claude Gray has no trouble with our Frequency  
check during the day, We were on the air that morning  
for maintenance. Our transmitter is a Collins 20\*V.  
We operate remote control and the tower is shunt fed,  
200 ft. tall with a copper screen 24'x24', with a 8'  
Screen under the down lead.

We are not affiliated with any network or any other  
station we offer a music news format for programming.  
I'm sorry that I don't have a coverage map to send  
on to you.
