Thank you for your kind letter stating you received our signal in your city. Your letter was the first we received and up to now the greatest distance.

- I would like to tell you a little about our equipment, we use a Collins 20-V-1 K.W. transmitter working into a R & S 52 ohm transmission line through a series tuning condenser into a shunt fed tower. The tower is a stainless steel 245 ft. job.

we have 120 Grand radial 437 ft. log  
- you asked about how Ozark got its name I'm new here & don't know much about the town myself. We will probably make our frequency checks in the early part of the morning.

I can definitely verify your reception reports, since I was on duty myself. Thank again for your nice letter.
