Dear Mr. Copper:

I was pleased to receive your reception report of KBLO on the morning of January 11, 1953, 3:05 to 3:14 AM, CST.

Your report of KBLO is correct and we are pleased to verify same.

We received reports for DX'ERS in 16 states during our rather brief and irregular test periods.

I believe that KRCH is making frequency test each morning from 5:15 to 5:30 AM CST. They sign on at 5:30 CST. 1270 KC.

KBHS on 590 kc is now on the air with regular programs. They also make frequency test sometime before 6:00 AM each morning. KBHS is also 1,000 watts with Gates equipment. They have been having a good deal of equipment trouble and you may hear them on most any night after 12:00 midnight CST.

Hot Springs now has about 30,000 resident population with about 15 to 25 thousand floating population of visitors.

KBLO is now on the air with regular programs. Frequency test are made each 1 and third monday at about 5:55 AM CST. The call letters have no special meaning. They were requested as the station owners name is Bieloh (Be-low). At present we are not connect with any network.

Your mention of hollow or echo sound on voice. This was due to acoustic trouble in studio which has since been corrected.
