I can't imagine what the Buzz you heard was but I am sure that it was not in our equipment, nevertheless let me thank you for the report and hope you all the success in the world in your future DXing.

We operate with a power of 250 watts since the 3rd. of October when we were granted an increase in our nighttime power. We have a composite transmitter and a vertical antenna of 150 feet in height. We have also just recently moved into our own building which is a big improvement over the one we formerly occupied.

Please accept this as a personal invitation for you to drop in and pay us a visit if you are ever in this part of the country, we will do all in our power to make your stay in Jerome a pleasant one.

May I again thank you for the report and if you should like to try to get us again we are on the air every second thursday in the month for our Government frequency check at 3:50-4:05 Mountain Standard time.
