Dear Ernest:

It is a pleasure to verify your reception of this station on Sept. 13, 1954 on 1480 kcs and one kilowatt of power.

We are using the same equipment as when KVOE except for the annual overhaul. The transmitter is a RCA model 1K. Our call was changed July first this year. We are directional night only, the signal is beamed along the Pacific coastline NW SE so your reception was in a null. I do not have a coverage map that is current for the station. There is a FCC monitor station a mile from our radiators which we have to protect so it is a wonder you received us so well being on our null. September 25th we return to Pacific Standard time, our broadcast day starts at 6:00 AM until midnight except Sundays 7:00 AM until 11:00 PM. Our test periods are irregular however I will be running a performance check as required by the FCC this week.

We have mailed verifications to almost all States and also to a number of foreign countrys the greatest DX being New Zealand, Australia and Japan.
