Dear Sir:

This is to verify your reception report of KXRX on November 15, 1949, from 1:31 am to 2:42 am PST. Your report was fully verified by our operating log and format.

Congratulations on your excellent BC DX record and here's hoping you make your goal of 2000 Confirmations. Following is a brief description of our engineering setup which will explain the difficulty most Eastern reports experience in logging KXRX.

We operate 24 hours per day with 1000 watts and directional antenna that protects KSTP WTOP at 61° true. Consequently we radiate very little low angle signal in that direction, however once in awhile an apparent double hop sets in and we draw reports from the East like you. Yours is one of the many we received for the period from November 15 thru November 16 and then everything was quiet until January 14 thru the 17th when propagation was right again.

Our equipment is RCA throughout except for pickup arms which are composite units built to withstand the 24 hour per day duty spinning shellac discs mostly.

With the qualification that we are silent from 3 am til 6am every Monday morning I'll sign now and get along with other QSL work for this AM.
