This is to verify your reception report of this station on November 6 between the hours of 12:05 p.m. EST to 4:24:20. We were most pleased to receive your report and hope the following answers to your questions are suffice:

We do not have an early morning frequency check, Riverhead can take us during our regular schedule. Our sign on time is 7 a.m. seven days a week. We began actual operation September 17, 1956. We are an independent station. The population of Old Saybrook according to Connecticut Health Department figures of December, 1955, is 4160. With regard to the name of this town, it was derived from a pier of the English realm, a Lord Saybrooke and is a contraction of the Indian given to this said Lord and of Patapoug.
