
Dear Sir,

The Northern Ireland or Northern Home Service of the BBC is radiated on 1151 kc/s by Lisnagarvey, Stagshaw, Londonderry and Scarborough. At 0630 GMT there is a programme of Light Music and it was therefore most likely the Home Service which you heard on the morning of December 26th 1953.
