Dear Mr. Cooper;

This letter will confirm that your logging was correct in the programming that you heard on February 24, 1992, on 1560 kHz.

We were doing testing that morning at a reduced power of 500 watts.

Frankly, I'm amazed that you were able to pick up our signal at such a distance, as the problem that we were working on was to try to calibrate our antenna currents as we did not feel that we were reaching out far enough.

Honestly, though, we are concerned with the groundwave signal, the skywave with tremendously longer distances are of no interest to us at all.

As to our power, normally, we are a 5,000 watt daytime licensed station, with a post sunset authority, for one hour past sunset at 500 wats and for a second hour past sunset at 102 watts. At that time we are required to sign off, to protect the signal of a station in Bakersfield, California.

We conduct tests in the early morning hours on Monday about once a month, so perhaps you will be able to hear us able sometime in the future.
