I am happy to verify your report of reception for our station on 29 Dec. 1957. I am sorry for the delay but I have been on vacation till now.


I'm sorry there was some confusion on our DX test causing you to miss it, but I intend to hold another one in the near future so I hope you'll be able to hear that one.
