Well to date I have not decided rather he was sleepy or did think it was 4:30 or just what did happen to him. You see our Xmtr is three miles from our Studios and before I could get him to answer the telephone he had the Star Spangle Banner on the air. Of course he could not answer the phone while he was giving the final anncm't. As it stands, he was slightly mixed up on the time somewhere. We are very sorry that this happened, and I hope that no one missed us. We were schedule to go on the air at 3:30 AM. which was advertise in the NRC news.

Have received to date 20 Reports form members of the N.R.C. I beleive the greatest distance was N.H. and Detroit Mich.
