It is hoped that you will pardon the belated answer to your letter of February 23, 1959; however, the delay has been occasioned by our attempts to track down the source of the unmodulated carrier mentioned in the first paragraph of your letter. This same phenomenon has been reported in at least five requests for QSL from this station. At the present time we are unable to explain the unidentified carrier. After checking out our service area, we can say that it is inaudible in our own area. Your letter is being placed in active correspondence so that when we finally run this thing down, we shall pass the information along to you for your club members.

When this station was purchased by Community Service Broadcasters, Inc., the call letters were changed from WAHR to WMET. This change occurred May 19, 1958 and the significance of the new call is that it lends itself to promotional phrases such as "METronome time", "MET the METropolitan Miami Weatherbird", etc.

WMET - WMET FM are on the air 24 hours a day with the exception of from 0100 to 0600 EST each Monday morning at which time we leave the air for maintenance purposes. Our AM frequency measurement is made on the third Monday morning of each month from 0220 to 0230 EST.

We thank you for your interest in our station and you will hear from us again when we are able to explain the "fellow traveler" on our frequency. Should you find yourself vacationing in our area please drop by to visit with us.
