We do not have a regular frequency check monitor schedule, however we do check with RCA in Riverhead, N. Y. Due to the location of the station, this immediate area being known as "where the tropics begin", our call letters are Where North and Tropics Meet. I am sorry but I do not know when WTTB has frequency checks, and we do not have, at this time, a complete coverage map available.

Dodgetown is "booming", and I understand that there are very few reservations left. It seems that they are planning a very successful summer.
