Thank you for your letter of October 24, reporting reception of this station from 7:45 to 8:00 P.M. EST on Tuesday evening October 24.

We are pleased to verify your report of hearing an NBC Orchestra from 7:45 to 8:00 P.M. with a Four Way Cold Tablet announcement just before the Phillip Morris program at 8:00 P.M.

WSUN is on the air each Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. Our sister station - WFLA at Tampa - occupies the time the other three week-days, and we broadcast jointly on Sunday. We operate on a frequency of 620 kilocycles with 5000 watts power in the daytime and 1000 night.

We are glad to know that you were able to pick up WSUN, and hope you will tune in again soon.
