

In addition to the above schedule, we are also on the air from 2:30 to 2:50 A. M., E. S. T., the first Thursday in each month for frequency monitoring purposes. We are transmitting on 1310 kilocycles with a power of 100 watts, and have received many encouraging reports from our listeners.
