This is to verify your report of reception of our station on February 1, 1959. The resume which you gave corresponded with our schedule.


Our call letters have no specific significance. Only that CLA is the first three letters of Claxton. We applied for WCLX but they were already assigned to a ship so we had to take WCLA.
