Dear Mr. Cooper,

It has taken me a little time but here is your letter of VERIFICATION for your report on hearing this stations "Courtesy Broadcast" that was held on the morning of Jan. 18. Even though WIBR did offer some interference (mainly in the western section) WIMO has received to date 78 reports, including 5 from Canada. All in All it was a profitable venture for us.

All station equipment is Gates, including: Gates BC-1F, 1KW transmitter and SA-40 console.

Winder is a small town of about 6000 population located about 47 miles northeast of Atlanta. Winder was named after its original settler, John Winder. Main source of income is thru numerous factories producing clothes, shoes etc. There's also a considerable amount of broiler raising.

WIMO joined the airwaves at 12:00 noon (E.S.T.) November 4, 1952. We are 1KW daytime operation and primary area reaches out approximately 35 miles. We are an independent station and since we're so close to Atlanta, we do not have early morning frequency check.
