
Thank you for your letter of February 14, 1979.

I was on the air for the National Radio Club on February 12, 1979 from 1:28 to 2:05 AM EST. During that time I sent several tones, as well as music and ID's. The tones you heard were, therefore, probably coming from WJTH. (I am sorry I did not keep a record of the exact time, but one of my listeners wrote that he received a tone from 1:42 to 1:45 which corresponds exactly with the time you sent in your letter. This further confirms that what you heard was most likely coming from us.)

One of the twelve letters I've received was from Reading, Pennsylvania and he said he just barely heard one of my ID's. Your letter and his were the only two I received from the Northeast.

Enclosed are the bumper sticker and coverage map you requested. W.J.T.H. does not have an early morning frequency check period, but we sign on at 6:00 AM Monday through Saturday on low power. Some DX listeners have heard us then, but a lot of other stations are signing on at that time too. But if you'll send a phone number, I'll let you know next time we test or run a proof (sometime in December).
