Dear Mr. Cooper,

This is to verify your reception of KPIG during our freq. check on May 10, 1953. I do not usually send letters for DX because I am the only engineer on the staff and you can readily see I do not have the time to answer these letters.

Our call letters were changed to KPIG in Sept. of 1952 because of change of ownership. The call letters KPIG were chosen because they were unique and would bring more attention to our station. This has proven to be the case.

We broadcast on a frequency of 1450 KC with a power of 250 watts. Our transmitter is a Collins 300G feeding a $\frac{1}{4}$ Quarter Wave series fed antenna.
