Dear Sir:

It was most gratifying to us to receive the report of your reception of our new station. Being a new station, the backlog of work incidental to getting a new station operating smoothly has prevented us from devoting as much attention to DX reports as we would like. It is for this reason and not to any lack of appreciation that your letter was not answered sooner. This situation has now been rectified and any future reports will be acknowledged promptly.

Gates Radio equipment is used here through out. The transmitter, a Gates model 250C, delivers 250 watts to a single 285 foot Wincharger Tower.

At the moment we do not schedule a DX program. We are, however, on the air during the early morning hours once each month usually on the eighth of the month for purposes of making frequency checks. However this winter we may operate a schedule of DX programs. At this time, however, a definite policy and schedule have not been established. If it convenient to forward details concerning the special DX program you mentioned we will be glad to receive them as they may have some influence on the final decision concerning such a program.

Checking the program as logged by you against our program log and finding it to be correct, we are pleased to verify your reception of the morning of July 4, 1946 between the hours of 1:35 and 1:47 AM C.S.T.
