Dear Ernest,

The staff and management of KWCR wish to thank you for your letter of Nov. 13 reporting reception of our station on that date during a special DX program dedicated to the members of the Newark News Radio Club.

You can accept this letter as a "vague" verification of your reception of KWCR - 250 watts - 1450 kcs - on Sunday morning, November 13, 1949, from 12:55 a.m. to 1:43 a.m. CST. As you said in your report it was vague and there was really not much that could be definitely checked. The tone signal modulation you heard was from KWCR.

The transmitter and about all of the studio and remote equipment here is Collins - made here in Cedar Rapids.

Plans are underway to present another DX program on the morning of the third Monday in January. The time will be established very soon and the National Radio Club will be advised. At that time, Ernest, we will be looking for another report from you and will send you a clean cut - definite verification. Your report on this test was the farthest we received. Three came from Penna. but all of these reported from one to four correct titles during the hour. WTBO, WWDC, WLAY, WNOE, KLMX were all reported as being on 1450 during the KWCR hour on the air. In all 14 reports were received on this test DX broadcast.
