Dear Sir:


We want to thank you for your interest in writing to us on the reception of our signal in Brooklyn, March 5, 1950. We are always glad to hear from any of the National Radio Club Members, and from the letters we've received recently concerning our tests, there are quite a few of you.

This is to VERIFY the entries of your log of our transmissions on March 5, during the period of 1:20 to 1.28 am. Our operation during this period was scheduled to test a new modulator amplifier that we installed in our composite "rig". In the process of obtaining data on our yearly report to the F.C.C on proof of performance, we found a little too much distortion on our sigs, and tore into it to clean it up. "Rhapsody in Blue", from our Standard Transcription Library is an old standby with us, in that we are familiar with the fidelity it produces, if our signal is up to standard.

In regards to our frequency check, they are held once a month with Peterkin Laboratories in Detroit Michigan. The scheduled transmission is on the third Wednesday of each month at 2:15 am and has its conclusion at 2:30 am E.S.T. We use a modulated tone of approximately 600 cycles, which is varied every five minutes, and includes voice announcements at the beginning and end.

Well, OM, and you are with 17 years experience at DX'ing, you've gotten yourself quite a record, and there's no use stopping now, with less than 200 stations to go. Lots of Luck.
