Thank you very much for your letter of June 15. This is to confirm your reception of signals from WIOU from 2:54 A. M. until 3:00:25 A. M. morning of June 14.

WIOU operates with a power of 1000 watts on a frequency of 1350 kc. with a four tower directional array antenna. The main lobe is 5° west of true north.

Kokomo is a city of approximately 35,000 people and was named after an Indian chief. However, don't get the idea that Indians are still running wild out here, but instead, the city is very modern in that it has wide streets and nice business buildings as well as residential districts.

WIOU officially went on the air July 16. At the time you were hearing our signals we were testing with 250 watts!

Please pardon the delay in getting this answer out and lots of luck.
