Hi! And thanks for your letter of June 14, 1951. I'll start this off by apologising for taking so long in answering your most welcomed letter. It seems like that is standard procedure anymore. As you know we are a small station and it's hard to get personnel to come to a small station and town. So to make a long story short we are all doubling up on the operation. Didn't mean to cry on your shoulder.

This is to verify that you were listening to WKAM on the morning of June 13, 1951.

WKAM conducts frequency checks the second Wednesday morning of the month. Then time is 2:00 to 2:15 AM our time. At the moment we happen to be on Daylight Saving Time.

WKAM covers an area approximately 30 miles miles from our tower. Our .5mv signal has been measured at 33 miles to the North, 34 miles to the east, 33miles to the south and only 26 miles to the northeast, don't know what happened out that way.

No it wouldn't be violating any professional ethics by asking when WRSW starts equipment tests. They have been playing around with that GP for a year now. Thier towers aren't up yet, the ground system isn't in and darn little equipment has arrived. So you see you aren't the only one who is curious, we are to.
