"Haven of Rest"

HOW IT BEGAN

... year was 1934. The place: San Diego, California. The time: three o'clock in the morning.

The last blackness of the night enshrouded the wharves and warehouses of the San Diego waterfront. As far as I could see, I was alone.

Hours before, I had begun this aimless wandering, and was as bewildered and lost as ever. The faces of my Christian wife and four children kept appearing upon the screen of my consciousness. How were they tonight? I had left them alone and helpless. Self-condemnation swept over my soul.

The sudden clanging of a ship's bell startled me. Two.... four...six...eight--eight bells! I then realized it was four o'clock in the morning. I had walked all night in an alcoholic stupor, trying to forget.

I had rebelled against God, and had gone my own way. From a business viewpoint, I had been successful, becoming well-known, and rising to executive manager for two radio stations in Southern California. Now, riches and glamour were things of the past. Liquor had taken its toll. Our home was split up, and I was face to face with the dead-end street of life.

Soon it would be morning. Morning to me meant just another dreary day, until suddenly I realized this was Sunday morning. The people of San Diego would be gathering for Sunday School and Church. Church! How long had it been since I had sat in church?

A glimmer of hope entered my mind. I determined to find a church. I needed God desperately. I entered the church, listened to the sermon, and finally the benediction. No mention was made of a Savior who could rescue a lost soul.

Heartbroken, I returned to the cheap room where I had been staying. My eyes focused on a book. It was a Gideon Bible. In desperation I opened its pages, placed it upon a chair and knelt before it. I poured out my heart to God, acknowledging my guilt and declaring my faith in Jesus Christ to



save my soul.

"Oh, God," I prayed, "If You'll only straighten out my life, I'll serve You all the rest of my days."

Would my wife take me back? I wouldn't blame her if she wouldn't. However, I decided to hitchhike to Los Angeles and see.

"Thelma, I have found Christ, and He's real to me at last." These were the words with which I greeted her. Tears of joy streamed down her cheeks.

"Honey," I said, "I am going into full-time service for the Lord. I don't know where or how, but I made that promise to Him, and I know He will open up a door somewhere."

Radio was the only thing I knew. God gave us concentrated talents: Kenneth Nelson, Ernie Payne, Bobby Bowman, and Lorin Whitney. He gave us a format of songs and readings interwoven--an approach I had used successfully in commercial radio. All we needed now was a radio station to send forth such a broadcast.

Once again divine guidance led us, this time to radio station KMPC in Beverly Hills, California. I talked to the manager. I told him I felt that I had a program which would be of interest to his listeners. He gave me the "go ahead".

So, in March of 1934, the first "Haven of Rest" broadcast went on the air . . . on one radio station. Today our broadcasts are heard over 60 stations world-wide. For God's blessing on our efforts we are deeply grateful.

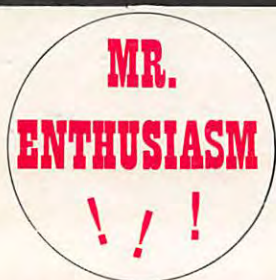

This morning worship service from the well-known southside church, is sent into the homes of many thousand central Indiana listeners. For seven years, Rev. Dixon has also conducted a weekly telecast over WTTV at 1:30 P.M. We are indeed happy to honor this familiar friend of Wonderful Bible Radio for Indiana in our first edition of the WBRI newsletter.

Rev. Dixon was graduated from the Baptist Bible College, Springfield, Missouri. Before coming to Indianapolis, he served as pastor of the Bible Baptist Church in Buffalo, Missouri, and now will celebrate his tenth year as pastor of the Indianapolis Baptist Temple in June. Under his able leadership, the great Baptist Temple Sunday School has increased from an attendance of 150 in 1955, to a present 1300. A new three thousand seat auditorium to be built within this next year is now being planned. It will be an addition to their lovely building located at 2635 South East Street.

The father of two children, Robin Lynn, and Greg Allen, this young minister of only thirty-two makes no apologies for his firm stand of the fundamentals of the faith. Currently he is President of the Indiana Baptist Bible Fellowship, and also serves as Vice-President of the Fundamental Baptist Association of Greater Indianapolis. He has worked actively for the organization of the Southside Christian School, and is a member of the Board of Trustees not only of this newly established day school, but also of the Baptist Bible College, Springfield, Missouri, and Bethel Baptist College, Atoka, Oklahoma.

We, of WBRI, indeed appreciate Rev. Dixon's boldness in the defense of the faith. It is our prayer that God will continue using this loyal and capable pastor in the accomplishment of many tasks for the Glory of the Lord and His Kingdom.
