Thank you for your reception report of January 11, 1954. Your report is hereby verified as it agrees with our station logs.

Response has been gratifying on the special program. To date we have received a total of 50 reports from 16 states and Canada.

Radio station KBTO began regularly scheduled programs on November 16, 1953 at twelve noon. KBTO maintains a daytime schedule of operation at sign off, but takes the air at 0530 CST each morning by special permission of the Federal Communications Commission. KBTO is the only broadcast station in El Dorado at the present time.

Our transmitter is a Gates 500-GY with a 270 foot vertical guyed tower directly coupled and series feed. We are using the Gates RCM-12 remote control system and a Gates SA-40 console in the control room.

El Dorado is a town of approximately twelve thousand population, and is located in the Walnut River Valley 35 miles east and north of Wichita, Kansas.

Again thanks for the reception report and we will be looking forward to receiving your reports in the future.
