We are most happy to verify your reception report of our special test on Monday morning, Dec. 26, 1955.


In answer to your questions; Fort Scott was a frontier fortress in the old days and, as a matter of fact, one of the original forts is preserved here on the plaza and is a museum today. KMDO first went of the air October 8, 1954 and we are a daytime station. Our frequency check is made during regular broadcast hours so the only time we are on during the test period is for transmitter checks, and these are unscheduled.

With regard to the test--on such short notice it was quite impossible to get any publicity and, therefore, not too many of your members had advance knowledge of the test. However, we have received more than fifty reports of reception; including both coasts, Canada, Gulf Coast cities and one from Auckland, New Zealand.

We, here at KMDO, appreciate your interest and would like very much to receive one copy of one of your bulletins, if such is possible. Please extend to all your members our thanks for the nice reports; and, in particular, we wish to thank Bob Seifert for his phone calls to other stations on our behalf.
