This is to verify your letter of September 21, 1950

We were on the air from 2:00 till 2:15 AM EST September
21, 1950 with our Frequency Check as you logged.

Our present operating schedule is from 7:00 AM till 12:00
midnight. We conduct our regular monthly frequency checks with
RCA in New York, We are on the air the third Thursday of each
month from 2:00 till 2:15 AM EST with our Frequency Check.
The reason for using an audio tone or Frequency Checks is that
it carries better, music has a varying frequency but I will
agree with you that it would be easier on the ears.

Pikeville has a population of about 6700, and as you
probably already know is located in the Eastern part of Ky.,
Pike County is the largest County in the state. Pikeville is
in the mountains and we are located on top of one of them, as
for the city it is down in a valley.
