Now with the football season passed, they are concentrating a bit on college hoops and hot stove baseball talk. In two weeks they will have been on the air here for one full year.

When Jack and the Rocket joined WBPS we were all local sports all day. Sadly, many of our programmers were unable to keep up with their expenses, and were not able to stay with us. With their departure, WBPS decided to go the way of the rest of the Douglas Broadcasting (our parent company) stations to a multi-ethnic format. WBPS is now proud to serve several communities often overlooked in Boston radio, including Polish, Russian, Spanish, Portuguese, Cantonese, and Mandarin speaking audiences.
